To have bags of litter picked up, registered groups must contact their district manager with the location and other details.

In addition, Motor City Makeover volunteers may take bagged litter to any of the five drop-off locations around the city.

ROLL-OFF CONTAINERS FOR GROUPS

There are a limited number of roll-off containers available on a first-come, first served basis, for community groups that are doing large clean-ups. However, your Department of Neighborhoods manager will survey the area first before granting a request for a roll-off container.

RESIDENTS, BUSINESS OWNERS, CHURCHES, BLOCK CLUBS, AND SCHOOLS, here's what you can do:

- If you plan on joining in the cleanup effort, call the City of Detroit at **(313) 224-4415** to register your group or neighborhood.
- Volunteers may call their DON office to schedule a special pickup or take bagged litter to
 one of the drop-off locations.
- Clean the area around your home, business, church or school on the Saturday designated for your district. See the map to determine which district applies to you.
- Organize your neighborhood or your employees (if you own a business) for a massive group cleanup. Select a nearby area or call (313) 224-4415 for a recommended location.
- Beautify your area by planting plants, flowers or trees, and removing graffiti, etc.

Individuals or groups that leave bagged litter in locations NOT designated by the City of Detroit may be fined for illegal dumping. Illegal dumping is a crime. Violators may have their vehicles impounded and are subject to fines up to \$10,000.
