No Straight Party Voting!!

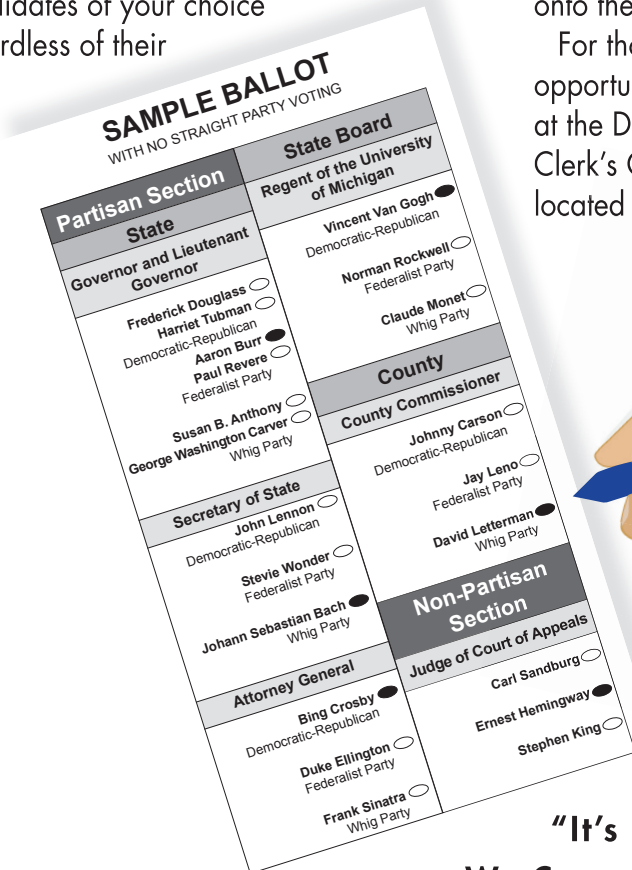
Due to an order issued by the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals, **the option to vote straight party will NOT appear on the November 6th ballot.**

This means voters must vote for the individual candidates of their choice for each office on both the partisan and non-partisan sections of the ballot. Electors may still vote a mixed ticket. Voting a mixed ticket means voting for the individual candidates of your choice regardless of their

party affiliation.

This new development makes this newsletter and the enclosed sample ballot more important than in previous elections. I urge each registered voter who plans to vote in the November 6th General Election to review the ballot, choose your candidates **before** Election Day, and simply execute your vote on Election Day by transferring your pre-determined votes onto the official ballot.

For those who qualify, take the opportunity to vote by absentee ballot at the Department of Elections, the City Clerk's Office or one of the satellite offices located on the back of this newsletter.

GENERAL ELECTION

TO VOTE: Completely darken the oval opposite each choice as shown: 

IMPORTANT: To mark your ballot, use only a black or blue ink pen. **DO NOT USE ANY OTHER INK COLOR!**

PARTISAN SECTION: To vote the partisan section of the ballot, you may cast a “mixed ticket.”

Mixed Ticket: Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office.

NONPARTISAN and **PROPOSAL SECTIONS** of the ballot (if any) must be voted separately.

DO NOT vote for more candidates than indicated under each office title.


WRITE-IN CANDIDATES: To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write or place the name of that candidate in the blank space provided and completely darken the voting target area. Do not cast a write-in vote for a candidate whose name is already printed on the ballot for that office.

CHECK BOTH SIDES OF BALLOT: This ballot has two sides. Be certain to check the reverse side of the ballot.

WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING: Place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve so that votes cannot be seen and the numbered stub is visible. Return the ballot to the election official stationed at the tabulator. (If voting by absentee ballot, follow the instructions provided by the clerk for returning the ballot.)

NOTE: If you make a mistake, return your ballot to the election official and obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to erase or correct any marks made in error.

ELECCIONES GENERALES

PARA VOTAR: Oscurezca completamente el óvalo que está frente a cada opción como se muestra: 

IMPORTANTE: Para marcar su papeleta de voto, use sólo un lapicero de tinta negra o azul. ¡NO USE OTRO COLOR DE TINTA!

SECCIÓN PARTIDISTA: para votar en la sección partidista de la papeleta, puede emitir una “boleta mixta”.

Boleta mixta: vote por los candidatos individuales de su elección en cada cargo.

Se debe votar por separado en las **SECCIONES APARTIDISTAS** y de **PROPUESTAS** de la papeleta (si las hay).

NO vote por más candidatos de los indicados bajo cada título del cargo.


CANDIDATOS NO REGISTRADOS: Para votar por un candidato cuyo nombre no está impreso en la papeleta de voto, escriba o ponga el nombre de ese candidato en el espacio en blanco proporcionado y (oscurezca completamente el área destinada para el voto. No emita un voto por un candidato no registrado si su nombre ya está impreso en la papeleta de voto para ese cargo.

REVISE AMBOS LADOS DE LA PAPELETA DE VOTO: Esta papeleta de voto tiene dos lados. Asegúrese de revisar el reverso de la papeleta de voto.

CUANDO HAYA TERMINADO DE VOTAR: Coloque la papeleta de voto en la carpeta de privacidad para que no pueda verse el voto y que el talón numerado sea visible. Devuelva la papeleta de voto al funcionario electoral ubicado cerca al tabulador. (Si va a emitir el voto en ausencia, siga las instrucciones proporcionadas por el secretario para devolver la papeleta de voto).

NOTA: Si comete un error, devuelva su papeleta de voto al funcionario electoral y obtenga una nueva papeleta de voto. No intente borrar o corregir ninguna marca hecha por error.

الانتخابات العامة

للتصويت: ظلل الشكل البيضوي بالكامل أمام كل اختيار كما هو موضح: 

هام: للتظليل في بطاقة الاقتراع، استخدم قلم حبر جاف أسود أو أزرق فقط. لا تستخدم أي لون حبر آخر!

قسم الأحزاب: للتصويت في القسم الخاص بالأحزاب في بطاقة الاقتراع، يمكنك تقديم "بطاقة مختلطة" **البطاقة المختلطة:** صوت للمرشحين الفرديين الذين تختارهم في كل مكتب.

يجب التصويت بشكل منفصل بالنسبة للأقسام غير الحزبية والاقتراح (إن وجدت) في بطاقة الاقتراع.

لا تصوت لعدد من المرشحين أكثر مما هو مذكور تحت عنوان كل مكتب.


إضافة مرشحين: للتصويت لمرشح اسمه غير مطبوع في بطاقة الاقتراع، اكتب اسم المرشح في الفراغ المتاح وظلل المساحة المخصصة للتظليل أمامه بشكل كامل. لا تقم بإضافة اسم مرشح اسمه مطبوع بالفعل في بطاقة الاقتراع الخاصة بهذا المكتب.

تحقق من وجهي بطاقة الاقتراع: بطاقة الاقتراع هذه لها وجهان. تأكد من التحقق من الوجه الآخر لبطاقة الاقتراع.

عندما تنتهي من التصويت: ضع بطاقة الاقتراع في الحافظة السرية بحيث لا يمكن رؤية اختيارات التصويت وبحيث يكون العقب المرقم ظاهرًا. أرجع بطاقة الاقتراع إلى مسؤول الانتخابات المتمركز عند جهاز فرز الأصوات. (إذا كان التصويت عن طريق الاقتراع الغيابي، فاتبع تعليمات الموظف لإعادة بطاقة الاقتراع).

ملحوظة: إذا أخطأت أثناء ملء بطاقة الاقتراع، فأعدها إلى مسؤول الانتخابات واحصل على بطاقة اقتراع جديدة. لا تحاول محو أو تصحيح أي علامات تمت كتابتها بالخطأ.

সাধারণ নির্বাচন

ভোট দেওয়ার জন্য: প্রতিটি পছন্দের বিপরীতে অবস্থিত ডিম্বাকৃতিটি সম্পূর্ণভাবে কালো করে দিন যেমনটা এখানে দেখানো হয়েছে: 

গুরুত্বপূর্ণ: আপনার ব্যালট পূরণ করার জন্য শুধুমাত্র কালো বা নীল কালির কলম ব্যবহার করবেন। অন্য কোন রং-এর কালি ব্যবহার করবেন না।

দলীয় (পার্টিজান) অংশ: ব্যালটের দলীয় অংশে ভোট দেওয়ার জন্য, আপনি "মিশ্র (মিক্সড) টিকেট" দিতে পারেন।

"মিশ্র (মিক্সড) টিকেট": প্রতিটি পদের জন্য আপনার পছন্দানুযায়ী ভিন্ন ভিন্ন প্রার্থীকে ভোট দিন।

ব্যালটের **নির্দলীয় (ননপার্টিজান)** এবং **প্রস্তাবনা (প্রোপজাল) অংশে** (যদি থেকে থাকে) অবশ্যই আলাদা আলাদা ভাবে ভোট দিতে হবে।

প্রতিটি পদের নিচে উল্লিখিত সংখ্যার চেয়ে বেশি প্রার্থীকে ভোট **দিবেন না**।

লিখিত ভোটার (রাইট-ইন) জন্য প্রার্থী: আপনি ভোট দিতে চাইছেন এমন প্রার্থীর নাম ব্যালটে ছাপা না থাকলে, ব্যালটের চিহ্নিত শূন্য জায়গায় সেই প্রার্থীর নাম লিখুন বা বসিয়ে দিন এবং ভোট দেওয়ার জায়গাটি সম্পূর্ণভাবে কালো করে দিন। কোনো পদের জন্য প্রার্থীর নাম ইতোমধ্যে ব্যালটে ছাপা থাকলে তার জন্য লিখিত (রাইট-ইন) ভোট দিবেন না।

ব্যালটের উভয় পৃষ্ঠা দেখে নিন: এই ব্যালটে দুই পৃষ্ঠা রয়েছে। ব্যালটের অপর পৃষ্ঠা অবশ্যই দেখে নিবেন।

আপনার ভোট দেওয়া শেষ হল: আপনার ব্যালটটি গোপন "স্লিতে" ভরে দিন যাতে ভোট দেখা না যায় এবং সংখ্যার অংশটুকু দৃশ্যমান থাকে। ব্যালটটি টেবুলেটেরে অবস্থানরত নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তার কাছে ফেরত দিন। (এবসেটি ব্যালট দিয়ে ভোট দিলে, ব্যালট ফেরত পাঠানোর জন্য ক্লার্কের দেওয়া নির্দেশনা অনুসরণ করুন)।

দ্রষ্টব্য: আপনি কোন ভুল করে ফেললে আপনার ব্যালটটি নির্বাচন কর্মকর্তার কাছে ফেরত দিয়ে একটি নতুন ব্যালট সংগ্রহ করে নিন। কোন ভুল হয়ে থাকলে তা মোছা বা সংশোধন করার চেষ্টা করবেন না।

Saturdays will be scheduled based on demand.

As a registered voter, you may obtain an absentee voter ballot if you are:

- 60 years of age or older
- Unable to vote without assistance at the polls
- Expecting to be out of town on Election Day
- In jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- Unable to attend the polls due to religious reasons
- Appointed to work as an election inspector in a precinct outside of your precinct of residence

NOTE: On Monday, Nov. 5th, per Michigan Election Law, Absentee Voting ceases at 4:00 p.m. at all locations.
