5	I'm going to call the meeting to order. I am the
6	Vice-Chair Willie Bell from District 4. Our
7	Chair is running a little bit, but she said she
8	would be here, but we want to be timely so I'm
9	going to call the meeting to order once again
10	and could we pause for a prayer.
11	(INVOCATION WAS GIVEN).
12	COMMISSIONER BELL: Madam Attorney,
13	would you Linda Bernard, would you conduct the
14	roll call, please?
15	MS. BERNARD: Yes, Mr. Chairman.

17	COMMISSIONER BELL: Present.

2	COMMISSIONER BELL: Madam Attorney,
3	would you introduce the staff, please?
4	MS. BERNARD: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
5	Ms. Gail Oxendine is excused, George Anthony is
6	excused. Pamela Davis-Drake sits to my right,
7	she's the Chief Investigator. Also from her
8	office are Supervising Investigator Abdulah
9	Nelson as well as Investigator Hanna Hiller.
10	Mr. Robert Brown, the Administrative
11	Assistant to the Board is present and Sgt. Alan
12	Quinn is our recorder today hooked up together
13	with Dale Rose from Hanson Court Reporting.
14	That completes the introductions,
15	Mr. Chairman.
16	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you, Madam
17	Attorney. At this time I'm going to ask the
18	Board to approve the agenda for the meeting today
19	on March 17.
20	COMMISSIONER BURTON: So moved.
21	COMMISSIONER MOORE: Support.
22	COMMISSIONER BELL: It's been properly
23	moved and supported. Discussion? Those in
24	favor, aye?
25	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.



1	COMMISSIONER BELL: Those opposed?
2	Motion carried. The next item of business we
3	will approve the minutes from Thursday, March 10,
4	2016.
5	COMMISSIONER DEWAELSCHE: Mr. Chair, I
6	have a couple of corrections if I may.
7	COMMISSIONER BELL: Yes, ma'am.
8	COMMISSIONERS DEWAELSCHE: On Page 3 at
9	the bottom, the Chass Clinic is C-h-a-s-s and
10	it's also mentioned on Page 4 at the top.
11	And just another two corrections. I
12	did not on the second sentence, Commissioner
13	Dewaelsche provided the computer. I did not
14	provide the computer, I think it was Commander or
15	Captain Walton who helped get that, so that needs
16	to be corrected.
17	And then just at the very bottom under
18	the second paragraph from the bottom it's the
19	GDYP program instead of GTYP. Those are the only
20	corrections.
21	COMMISSIONER BELL: Duly noted. Any
22	other corrections or additions to the minutes?
23	Those in favor, aye?
24	COMMISSIONERS: Aye.



COMMISSIONER BELL: Those opposed?

Page 7 1 Motion carried. Thank you. 2 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Through the Chair, I would thought we was going to put up the 3 4 motion. 5 COMMISSIONER BELL: Oh, we didn't get a 6 motion? Okay, retroactive motion then. Motion by Commissioner Moore. 7 8 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So moved. 9 COMMISSIONER BELL: And second by 10 Commissioner Dewaelsche, let the record reflect that we satisfied with that? 11 12 COMMISSIONER MALLETT: We are. 13 COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you, thank 14 you. I just jumped ahead of the --15 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Not a problem, 16 sir. 17 COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you. Chair 18 is not here, so on her arrival she can give a 19 report at that time. 20 The next item of business would be 21 Chief Craig. 22 CHIEF CRAIG: Thank, sir. Mr. Chair, 23 Board, thank you. The only thing I have to report out like I do every session is crime. 24



Overall crime year-to-date as compared to last

1	year we're sitting at an 8 percent reduction in
2	overall crime, 6 percent violent crime and 9
3	percent property crime reduction.
4	The only area we're challenged in
5	specifically in violent crime we're up slightly
6	in homicide and also up in sexual assault as
7	compared to last year.
8	Our numbers overall are still trending
9	downward, it's just that's an area we're keeping
10	a watchful eye on. Non-fatal shootings are up
11	slightly. Robberies continue to be our biggest
12	reduction for the last three years, double-digit
13	reductions. We're at 10 percent reduction this
14	year.
15	I was going to report out on the
16	Consent Judgment. Today was supposed to mark the
17	day that we're totally out from under it, but I
18	need to get confirmation on that. That's
19	something that should have been today, so I might
20	report back, someone is checking now.
21	COMMISSIONER BELL: Chief, would that
22	be some type of notification from the Courts to
23	which you're seeking?
24	CHIEF CRAIG: Yeah, the Department of
25	Justice because we got out of the structured



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1	oversight phase, that ended as you know last year
2	and so the extension is just kind of a we
3	self-report out where we are and so preliminarily
4	I can tell you that Department of Justice is
5	pleased with the direction the department has
6	been going in terms of self reporting.
7	COMMISSIONER BELL: Any other questions
8	or concerns to the Chief? Could you speak
9	briefly to Operation Restore Order, I think is
10	that the proper terminology most recently?
11	CHIEF CRAIG: The most recent, that was
12	out of the 2nd and 11th Precincts, it was done
13	last weekend. It was referred to as Operation
14	Rush Hour led by Capt. Tim Leach. Very
15	successful.
16	Unfortunately I don't have the stats,
17	but they had seen an uptick in some activity in
18	both the 2nd and 11th Precincts and based on this
19	two-day operation they have now started to see a
20	decline, so this is what many of the precincts do
21	on a regular basis when they see activities.
22	They will combine with another precinct to
23	address a common crime problem.
24	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you, Chief.
25	Any other comments or questions?



1	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Yes, through
2	the Chair. Chief, I just had I guess a question
3	or comment about this. This is a report from
4	Channel well, actually this was Channel 7 News
5	that did this article and I consider it quite
6	disturbing and kind of a damning piece of report.
7	CHIEF CRAIG: Is this on the lawsuit?
8	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Yes, sir, and I
9	do realize that lawsuits, depositions, people
10	file them, lawsuits, and people do sit down for
11	depositions.
12	My question is whether or not there is
13	any criminal investigation into the allegations
14	of timecard fraud or any in terms of
15	investigation by the Detroit Police Department or
16	has anything been turned over to the Wayne County
17	Prosecutor's Office or the U.S. attorney?
18	CHIEF CRAIG: We did conduct an
19	internal investigation into the allegations and
20	if it's the one I think you're referencing, there
21	was no misconduct determined, criminal or
22	otherwise.
23	Certainly the commander is prepared to
24	I won't talk about in the lawsuit, but there
2.5	was a full investigation into that



1	COMM. SIMS: Good afternoon, Board,
2	Deshaune Sims, Commander, Professional Standards
3	Bureau. Our Internal Affairs did conduct a
4	review of the pattern of practices that were
5	occurring and we didn't find any criminality if
6	that's what you were wondering, there was no
7	criminality and there were no charges brought
8	against any members, but there was an
9	investigation that was conducted and an audit
10	that was conducted by Internal Affairs.
11	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Okay, thank
12	you.
13	COMMISSIONER BELL: Chief, I apologize.
14	I didn't give you the opportunity to introduce
15	your staff.
16	CHIEF CRAIG: If we would go around,
17	Asst. Chief White I've mentioned during my
18	comments about the Consent Judgment. I know we
19	were set to be fully freed as of today.
20	Do you have any update or
21	ASST. CHIEF WHITE: I do, Chief. I
22	literally just got off the phone. Good
23	afternoon, Board, James White for the record.
24	We were initially scheduled to be out
25	of the Consent Judgment today. We talked to the



Page 12 1 city attorney and they would like the DOJ to come 2 in Monday to speak with the Board and then meet with the Chief Monday afternoon. 3 4 All indications are that we have met 5 the requirements of the judgment and a date 6 certain will be established at that point. 7 It looks like it will be no later than 8 March 28, but they want to do a close-out session 9 and meet with the Board first and then meet with the Chief and we're scheduling that up actually 10 11 right now. 12 COMMISSIONER BELL: So you're 13 indicating that this could possibly take place 14 this coming Monday? ASST. CHIEF WHITE: Yes, the DOJ 15 16 literally just got off the phone, would like to 17 fly in Monday, meet with the Chief as well as the Board and I'm somewhat reluctant to say what 18 they're going to do when they get here, but I am 19 20 confident that all indications are that we have 21 met the requirements. 22 CHIEF CRAIG: Who gave us the date for 23 today, I was just kind of curious? 24 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: This came from the



city attorney's office.

Page 13 1 CHIEF CRAIG: U.S. Attorney? 2 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: No, our -- Jason 3 McFarland. 4 CHIEF CRAIG: Oh, I see, and they said 5 today was the day? 6 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: Monday is the day 7 they want to come in. CHIEF CRAIG: No, no, but I'm talking 8 9 10 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: Oh, the initial date, the initial date was just in discussion 11 12 that this was the targeted date to be completed. 13 CHIEF CRAIG: Okay. 14 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Through the Chair, Assistant Chief, is that the entire Board or just 15 16 the Chair or Vice-Chair? 17 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: I would like to 18 defer that question to --19 COMMISSIONER BELL: Okay, once we get 20 notification of the date and time we would notify 21 the entire Board, but we cannot have a quorum for 22 that session so it could be less than a quorum 23 that we normally have with six members, so it



So we would invite others to attend, so

could be five, is that correct?

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Page 14 1 hopefully we get proper notice of the time frame 2 to make ourselves available on Monday morning or Monday afternoon, so I assume that's what you're 3 4 indicating. 5 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: Through the Chair, 6 and again this is literally right hot off the 7 press, when I got the call that the Chief needed 8 to speak with me I ended the call abruptly to 9 find out exactly what it was. 10 So we will have more details in the next half hour, 45 minutes. This will not be the 11 12 formal announcement to the public, this is just a 13 discussion about the status of the judgment. 14 COMMISSIONER BELL: That's good, appreciate it. 15 16 ASST. CHIEF WHITE: And then a formal 17 discussion would be scheduled appropriately. 18 COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you, 19 Assistant Chief. 20 CHIEF CRAIG: I stepped out a little 21 prematurely based on the information I was going 22 with that this was going to be the day, but it does seem more reasonable that there would be a 23 24 sit-down and a close-out because one of the 25 things I'm sure DOJ would want to hear and



1	understand from the department is sustainability.
2	That is always one of the issues when you talk
3	about Consent Decree.
4	Pittsburgh as you know was one of the
5	first departments to go under Consent Judgment
6	and also one of the first departments to kind of
7	lapse and they were threatening to go under and
8	so sustainability today is very critical in this
9	process.
10	COMMISSIONER BELL: Any other questions
11	or concerns to the Chief or Assistant Chief?
12	ASST. CHIEF WHITE: And, Chief, if I
13	may, I told you that date, that's the day that I
14	gave you because I appreciate that, boss, but
15	I gave you the date and the date that's the
16	information that I had at the time, so thank you.
17	COMMISSIONER BELL: Still good news.
18	Anything else, Chief?
19	CHIEF CRAIG: No, sir. Thank you.
20	COMMISSIONER BELL: Board, any
21	questions or concerns in reference to this
22	matter?
23	If not, we can move to Item 11 and
24	standing subcommittee, but I guess most pressing



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matter we have is the disciplinary appeal of

Page 16 Officer Lauren Synder and I will ask our attorney 1 2 to the Board Linda Bernard to come forward. 3 I would hope that we can be on point to 4 keep this -- we have a written report and we can always insert in terms of minutes so we don't --5 6 I'm just trying to make sure that we're on point. 7 MS. BERNARD: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 8 This is the disciplinary appeal in the matter of 9 Police Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054. The review of the disciplinary charge 10 is as follows. On August 26, 2014 a Police Trial 11 12 Board was convened to hear testimony and accept 13 evidence on the charges and specifications filed 14 against Petitioner Police Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054 representing violations of the 15 16 Detroit Police Manual. 17 Wilful disobedience of rules or 18 orders. Specification 1. 19 That she, Police 20 Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054, currently 21 assigned to the 9th Precinct while on duty did on 22 January 26, 2014 at 11187 Gratiot, the 9th Precinct, willfully disobey a direct order given 23

to her by Sqt. Sharon Hall, Badge S-449 by

failing to report immediately to the lieutenants

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1	and sergeants office as directed for
2	reinstruction, this being in violation of the
3	Detroit Police Department Manual Series 100,
4	Directive 102.3-7-9, conduct unprofessional
5	Command 8.
6	Specification 2, that she, Police
7	Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054, currently
8	assigned to the 9th Precinct while on duty did on
9	January 26, 2014 at 11187 Gratiot, 9th Precinct,
10	wilfully disobey a direct order to her by Sgt.
11	Sharon Hall, Badge S-449 by leaving the
12	lieutenants and sergeants office after she was
13	directed verbally several times not to walk out,
14	this being in violation of the Detroit Police
15	Department Manual Series 100, Directive
16	102.3-7-9, conduct unprofessional Command 8.
17	2. Exhibit insubordination,
18	disrespect, gestures or language of a course,
19	profane or insolent manner to any ranking
20	officer.
21	Specification 3. That she, Police
22	Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054 currently
23	assigned to the 9th Precinct while on duty did on
24	January 26, 2014 at 11187 Gratiot, the 9th
25	Precinct, in the lieutenants and sergeants office



1	exhibit insubordination, disrespect and language
2	of a course and insolent nature towards Sgt.
3	Sharon Hall when she used her body to physically
4	push past her, Sgt. Hall, to exit the office,
5	this being in violation of the Detroit Police
6	Department Manual Series 100, Directive 102.
7	3-7-9, conduct unprofessional Command 5.
8	Specification 4, that she, Police
9	Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054, currently
10	assigned to the 9th Precinct while on duty did on
11	January 26, 2014 at 11187 Gratiot, the 9th
12	Precinct, in a lieutenants and sergeants office
13	exhibit insubordination, disrespect and language
14	of a course and insolent nature towards Sgt.
15	Sharon Hall when she stated to her, "Are you
16	serious? Is this what you called me in for?"
17	after Sgt. Hall questioned her regarding not
18	making all the changes to her CHRISNET report as
19	directed, this being in violation of the Detroit
20	Police Department Manual Series 100, Directive
21	102.3-7-9, conduct unprofessional, Command 5.
22	Specification 5, that she, Police
23	Officer Lauren Synder, Badge No. 3054 currently
24	assigned to the 9th Precinct while on duty did on
25	January 26, 2014 at 11187 Gratiot, the 9th



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1	Precinct, in the lieutenants and sergeants office
2	exhibit insubordination, disrespect and language
3	of a course and insolent manner towards Sgt.
4	Sharon Hall when she stated to her, "Are you
5	fing serious? Is this what you called me in
6	for?" after Sgt. Hall explained to her why she
7	was called into the precinct, this being in
8	violation
9	Oh, I guess we can probably proceed,
10	Mr. Chairman. Mr. Goldpaugh has indicated that
11	the department and he on behalf of Officer Snyder
12	have accepted the recommendation that I made to
13	the Board of a one-day suspension.
14	The members of the Trial Board are
15	pointed out here in the memo along with the
16	issues. If that is acceptable then to the Board,
17	I would simply recommend, again my
18	recommendation, of a one-day suspension and both
19	parties have agreed to that. If the Board
20	concurs with that, then this matter can be
21	closed.
22	COMMISSIONER BELL: Pause one second.
23	MS. BERNARD: Also, Mr. Chairman and
24	members of the Commission she was charged with
25	all five of those specifications. The Trial



1	Board found her responsible only for one of them
2	and so she was found not responsible, not guilty
3	if you will of the other four.
4	My recommendation is for a one-day
5	suspension. Sgt. Cheryl Hall is present from the
6	department Disciplinary Section and she can
7	concur in the one-day suspension.
8	COMMISSIONER BELL: Okay, we have your
9	recommendation. Could we hear also from Sgt.
10	Hall from the department recommendation.
11	SGT. O'NEILL: Sgt. Cheryl McCoy O'Neil
12	from Disciplinary. We provided a response to
13	counsel and I can go in detail if you would
14	like.
15	COMMISSIONER BELL: Just on your
16	recommendation.
17	SGT. O'NEIL: Briefly, yes, she was
18	guilty and she was charged initially with all of
19	those violations, but she was only found guilty
20	of the wilful disobedience of a direct order.
21	The situation was very clouded, there
22	was fault on the lieutenant and the sergeant and
23	her and I believe that the one day would be
24	justified, so I agreed.

1	Commissioners, any questions or comments to
2	attorney to the Board and also Sgt. McNeil at
3	this time? Any other comments?
4	COMMISSIONER DEWAELSCHE: Move to
5	approve the recommendations by Attorney Bernard.
6	COMMISSIONER MOORE: Support.
7	COMMISSIONER BURTON: Second.
8	COMMISSIONER BELL: It's been properly
9	moved and seconded that we accept the
10	recommendation of attorney to the Board Linda
11	Bernard with the concurrence of the department.
12	Discussion? Those in favor aye?
13	COMMISSIONERS (except Mallett and
14	Brooks):
15	Aye.
16	COMMISSIONER BELL: Opposed?
17	COMMISSIONERS MALLETT & BROOKS: No.
18	COMMISSIONER BELL: Do we need a roll
19	call? I think there was just two opposed, so the
20	motion carries. Are we satisfied with that then,
21	the motion carries today.
22	COMMISSIONER DEWAELSCHE: Who was the
23	other opposed, I have Mr. Mallett?
24	COMMISSIONER BROOKS: I opposed.
25	COMMISSIONED DEWNFISCHE. Oh



1	Commissioner Brooks, okay.
2	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you,
3	department.
4	MR. GOLDPAUGH: John Goldpaugh on
5	behalf of the officer, thank you very much.
6	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you, sir.
7	Any other committee recommendation reports
8	committee reports I should say. Any new
9	business? Old business?

22	leaving to go out of town.
23	COMMISSIONER BELL: Let the record note
24	that Commissioner Mallett is traveling again. We
25	pray for safe travel, it's all good.



1	Oral communication from the audience.
2	Please come forward, you have two minutes and
3	hopefully you can be respectful and we respect
4	you also in terms of the process.
5	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Prior to the
6	audience approaching, Mr. Chair, I just got an
7	announcement.
8	Today is March 17 and this represents a
9	one-year anniversary of a homicide in the city of
10	Detroit. As a matter of fact, the family has
11	been before us several times.
12	Ditwan Morgan was murdered on Tuesday,
13	March 17, 2015 at 9:27, she was shot and killed
14	as she entered her door of her home. The
15	incident took place on the east side of Detroit,
16	the 10000 block of Bonita near Outer Drive and
17	Hayes.
18	Ms. Morgan was 41 years old and this
19	1-800-SPEAK UP Crime Stoppers and I'm saying
20	this for anybody who may have any information
21	about this, to notify 1-800 there is still a
22	reward of up to \$2,500 and the reason like I say
23	this is a significant date is because it's a
24	one-year anniversary and the family has been here

several times and hope if there's someone out

1	there somewhere in the city of Detroit that can
2	help solve this homicide as with many others than
3	have occurred in the city also, so and as I
4	always say, black lives matter, black lives
5	matter.
6	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you,
7	Commissioner Crawford. Yes, sir.
8	MR. WELBORN: Bill Welborn. I don't
9	have much to say. Saw the Chief on TV this
10	morning and I'm going to suggest he get a license
11	to be a standup comic, he was pretty good this
12	morning. He was nice and loose, I never seen him
13	this loose. I mean, he was joking with people,
14	it was pretty good.
15	But I just wanted to ask the Chief one
16	question. They're bringing back the tug-of-war
17	teams. Are they going to put out a schedule for
18	those guys because last time I saw them was up in
19	Toronto and it was quite a few years ago.
20	I walked in the room and all these guys
21	6 foot 20 standing there 500 pounds, so you all
22	going to put out a schedule so we can come see
23	these guys?
24	CHIEF CRAIG: Through the chair, yes,



we'll make sure you're aware of it. We're

Page 25 1 excited about the tug-of-war team because it 2 really promotes esprit de corps and it also -- in terms of fitness. 3 4 We probably have one of the top 5 tug-of-war teams in the country I would estimate. 6 MR. WELBORN: That's what the guy was 7 saying this morning, the tops in the country. 8 CHIEF CRAIG: One of the top in the 9 country. In fact, during last year's Field Day we competed against the Wayne County sheriffs and 10 so we're going to do that at this year's Field 11 12 Day as well, so we'll definitely get that out, 13 looking forward to another great year. 14 MR. WELBORN: Okay, thank you. CHIEF CRAIG: Oh, by the way, on the 15 16 comic piece, I privately have always wanted to be 17 a comic.
