


Water and Sewer Systems





Water System

The treated drinking water system delivers clean water from water treatment plants and through the water mains to your property.






Sewer System

The combined sewer system is separate from the water system -untreated sewage and stormwater is collected in pipes, pumped and treated at nine wet weather facilities, and full treatment at the GLWA Water Resource Recovery Facility.





Water and Sewer Systems – Private Responsibility





DWSD Capital Improvement Program

DWSD has invested \$400M in capital improvement projects since 2019.

- Water main, hydrant and lead service line replacement
- Sewer lining and replacement
- Green stormwater infrastructure installations

DWSD and our contractors have:

- Replaced 77 miles of water main
- More than 1,700 lead service lines
- Replaced or lined 52 miles of sewer collection piping
- Installed 11 bioretention gardens

FAR WEST DETROIT STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS


- 25,000' of new drainage piping
- 2 water quality basins
- 1000+ residential downspout disconnections

WATER MAIN IMPROVEMENTS

- 15,000 feet trenchless water main replacement
- 500+ water service replacements

SEWER REHABILITATION

- 20,000 feet of sewer lining and repair
- Various repairs to over 100 manholes and catch basins

Rouge Park Restoration

Summary from November Meeting





A Community Decision:

Option 1: Prairie Restoration

This option will restore the area adjacent to the south basin in Rouge Park to an open, prairie space.

Option 2: Woodland Restoration

This option will include tree and shrub planting along the south basin. The plants will eventually convert the upland space around the basin into a forest ecosystem.

Majestic Street Construction

- Installation of new sanitary sewer and storm sewers starting at Parkland and extending towards West Parkway
- Sanitary wewer will be installed (Phase 1) followed by storm sewer (Phase 2)
- Work will require closure of Majestic to facilitate construction work and staging of materials
- Traffic will be maintained on all north-south streets with connections at Sawyer and W Warren



Majestic Street Construction


Benefits of Winter Work:

- Allows for some of the project's most invasive work to occur at a time when residential outdoor activity is at a minimum, instead of taking place during the summer months.
- Allows for sewer work on Majestic to be completed earlier than projected.
- Generally, far less dust during winter construction due to the cooler temperatures (hot dry days create more dusty job sites).
- Major Contracting will provide snow plowing on streets impacted by the winter work from February through April.
- Major Contracting will restore streets with temporary pavements to ensure streets are clean and passable. They will maintain this temporary pavement.



Impacts to Majestic Street Residents

- Interrupted garage access in Phase 1
- Garage access restricted to <u>sidewalk</u>
 <u>only</u> during Phase 2
- No parking on Majestic during Phase 1 and 2
 - (utilize north-south streets during active work)






Majestic Street Work - Traffic Pattern
