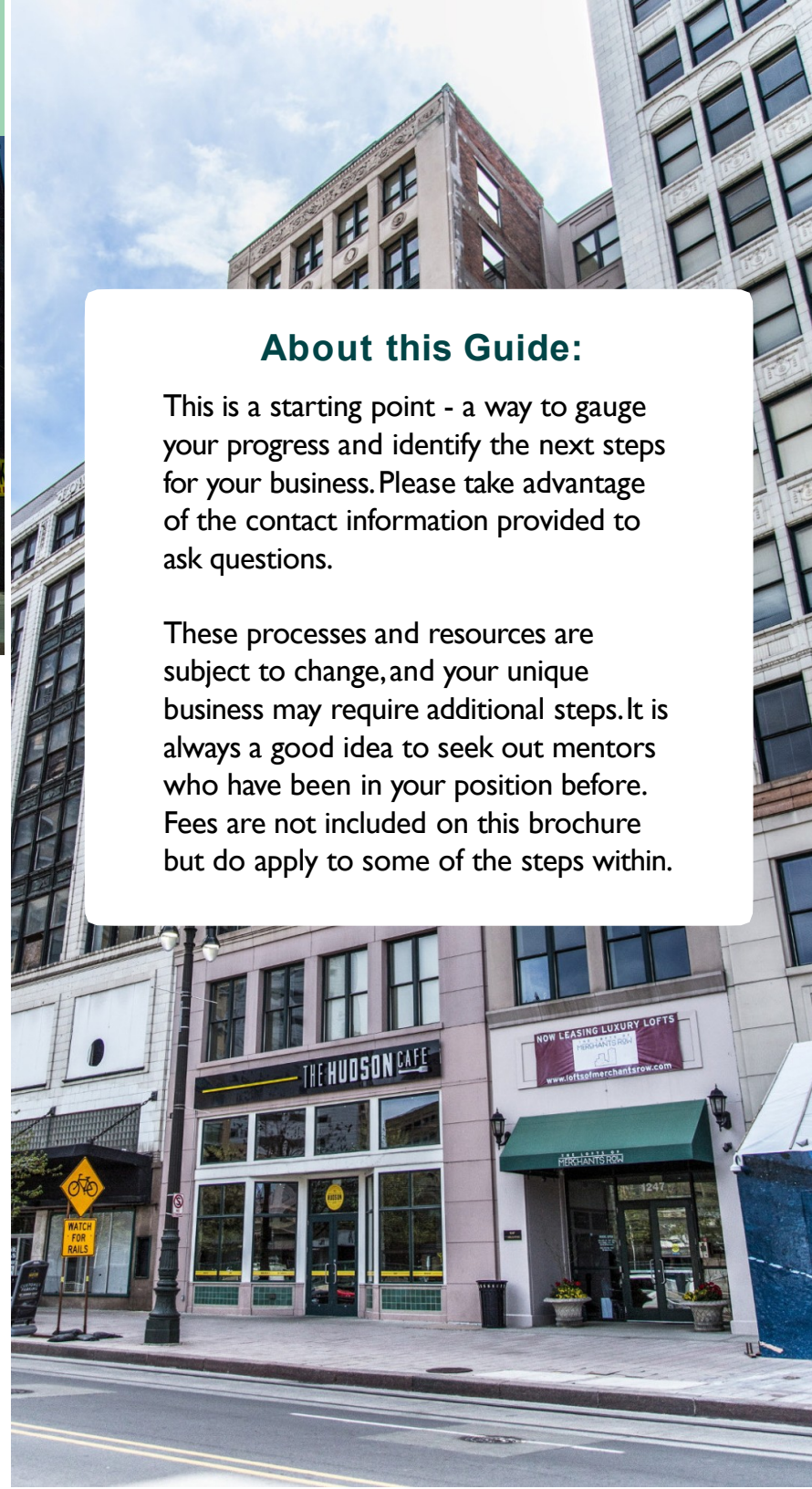

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Step 1

Do The Research

Before you invest in a property, get educated and thoroughly investigate whether the space meets your needs.

- Create a development plan and research funding opportunities.
- Meet with community groups and local experts.
- Consult a qualified real estate broker for guidance when looking for a location.
- Verify with BSEED Zoning that the established Legal Use matches the proposed Use before you sign anything. If not, you may require zoning reviews and/or a Change of Use/ Occupancy.

- Research Landlord and Tenant responsibilities if you plan to lease your space.

Step 2

Submit Your Plans & Begin Construction

Once you've gathered all of the information that you need, it's time to plan and execute any necessary construction

- Hire an architect or engineer registered as such in the State of Michigan to prepare your building plans.
- [Apply online](#) for any required Zoning Reviews & approvals.
- If your business requires construction or renovations, you will need to [apply online](#) for a building permit with BSEED.
- Submit your building plans to BSEED Plan Review and make any necessary changes until you are approved.
- Secure a building permit from BSEED, and then you may start any necessary construction.
- Schedule and pass the required inspections.
- Apply for a Certificate of Occupancy/Acceptance or a Certificate of Compliance with BSEED.

Step 3

Get Ready to Open!

Once you've passed the necessary inspections, you are almost there!

- Complete the Business License Center Checklist and apply for a Business License if necessary.
- Work with other agencies to obtain the necessary licenses as applicable (example: The Public Works Department if any of your renovations or uses will affect the street or sidewalk).
- Schedule and pass the necessary inspections annually to maintain compliance with city codes.
