COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the Board of Detroit Police Commissioners meeting. Today is Thursday, February 16th. My name is Jerome Warfield, member of the Board of Detroit Police Commissioners. Our illustrious Chair, Commissioner White, is out of town on business. And so, we are sitting in for his stead. Serving with me today though is Commissioner Jessica Taylor. We are certainly glad to see Chief Godbee here representing the Department. And I'm going to ask at this time if Celia Banks-Washington, who is sitting in for our second Chair who is on vacation will introduce our staff.

MS. WASHINGTON: Thank you, Mr. Chair. We have with us the director of police personnel, Director Dalph Watson. We have Lieutenant Timothy Leach, Acting Chief Investigator over the Office of the Chief Investigator. Mr. Robert Brown, our office manager. We have Sergeant Alan Quinn recording, and we have Wendy Boer our court reporter. And I believe that concludes the introductions.

COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you,

1 Miss Washington. As you all know, we do not have a
2 quorum for today. So we will not be taking any official
3 actions today on today's agenda. However, I would like
4 if Pastor Hill will come and give us our invocation for
5 the meeting today.

6 PASTOR HILL: Thank you, sir. We'll bow our
7 heads for a brief word of prayer. Almighty God, our
8 creator and our provider. We pray that you will
9 continue to keep your hands on the City of Detroit and
10 all its residents. We pray that our City would prosper
11 in every person and every family will experience the
12 same prosperity released over this City. We pray for
13 employment. We pray for the housing market. We pray
14 for our senior citizens. Watch over all of us.
15 Continue to show us your love, your grace and your
16 mercy.

17 We pray for our youth and our young people.
18 Uplift those who are lost and guide them out of darkness
19 into the light. We pray that we will all be peacemakers
20 and not peace breakers. We pray for the restoration and
21 the revitalization of Detroit in every area of the City.
22 We thank you for our chief, the person of Chief Ralph
23 Godbee, his dedicated and committed staff. We pray,
24 God, that you will give us wisdom, knowledge and
25 understanding. We pray for our commissioners. And God,

1 we ask that you would help us in what seems to be such a
2 helpless time. Help us in the midst of what seems to be
3 hopeless circumstances.

4 And God, we know that you still have some
5 righteous people in this City. You still have some
6 people of integrity and character in this City. And we
7 thank you. And we will always trust you to see us
8 through. In the name of the Father, the Son and the
9 Holy Spirit. Amen.

10 THE AUDIENCE: Amen.

11 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you, Pastor. At
12 this time we will hear from the Chief. Chief, do you
13 have a report for us?

14 CHIEF GODBEE: We don't have a formal
15 presentation, sir. Just as usual, I would just like to
16 thank the dedicated men and women of the Department for
17 the hard work that they do. Even though we don't have a
18 formal presentation, they do extraordinary things as you
19 know, every day. I just wanted to commend them for the
20 work that they continue to do.

21 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Absolutely. Thank
22 you, sir, appreciate that. We are going to defer under
23 new business, the grant, until next week. We are going
24 to put that on next week's agenda. And I don't believe
25 that there are any proposed amendments to the towing

1 rules. We'll deal with that next week, which will be
2 the date of deadline for all of those proposed
3 adjustments to be submitted by the end of next week.
4 And then after that, of course as you all know, we will
5 put those in writing, pass those out and schedule a
6 public hearing so that there can be vigorous discussion
7 on behalf of all of those who are interested in those
8 adjustments to the towing rules. And we will do that at
9 that particular time.

10 I want to make a couple announcements, that
11 there will be a Detroit youth violence prevention
12 basketball rally and game that will take place on
13 Saturday, February 18th, this Saturday from 12 noon to
14 2:00 p.m.

15 They will have students from Osborne, Cody,
16 Denby High School. The Chief will be there as well as
17 the Mayor and various other officials as well. The
18 admission is free, and it will be held at Cass Technical
19 High School. Again, that's from noon to 2:00 p.m.
20 There will be free giveaways, and it's a good event for
21 the community. So certainly if you don't have anything
22 on your calendar, you might want to stop by Cass Tech
23 High School this Saturday from 12 noon to 2:00 p.m. and
24 enjoy some wonderful basketball games on behalf of our
25 men who are in the Detroit Public School System, young

1 men who are in the Detroit Public School System.

2 Our next meeting is going to be held on
3 Thursday, February 23rd, 2012, 3:00 p.m. here at police
4 headquarters, 1300 Beaubien of course in the beautiful
5 City of Detroit, Michigan. At this time, we will open
6 up the floor for remarks and comments from the audience.
7 We do ask that you stay with our time limit of two
8 minutes and that you spell your name, first and last
9 name for the record so we can get your comments
10 appropriately. You may come to the mic at this time if
11 you wish to address the Commission.

12 MS. HERNANDEZ: Phyllis Hernandez, Casino
13 Towing. Good afternoon, Commissioners. In light of
14 yesterday's breaking news which was I'm sure a shocker
15 to all of us, that the Detroit Police towing contracts
16 are corrupt, only something we have been saying to this
17 Commission for years. My question -- and actually I
18 have a question because you already know how I feel
19 about it -- would be, since the contracts after Kwame
20 were still corrupt, I would like to know if you, Chief,
21 have an internal investigation going on to see who after
22 Kwame, since he was in jail, was getting the payoffs and
23 whom was getting them. Do you have an internal
24 investigation?

25 CHIEF GODBEE: No, ma'am, we don't. That's a

1 federal investigation which I can't comment on the
2 merits of.

3 MS. HERNANDEZ: It wouldn't behoove the
4 Department to find out if there was continued corruption
5 going on now or is it just something left --

6 CHIEF GODBEE: This honorable body just
7 undertook a massive effort -- I don't want to speak for
8 the Board. But they obviously undertook a massive
9 effort to restructure the rules of towing in the City of
10 Detroit. So they have taken on the heavy lifting.

11 MS. HERNANDEZ: Yes, since the Towing Task
12 Force in '09. We are in 2012. So, I mean yes, I
13 appreciate everything that Commissioner Warfield has
14 done. I have yet to see the final results of it. But
15 we all know that a few of our own companies were all
16 over the towing rotation list for years past that. So,
17 one would wonder or one would hope that the Department
18 would have its own investigation as well as taking a
19 look into the RFP that was brought forth and maybe
20 deciding that, okay, maybe we'd need to stay in control
21 of this towing process to make sure that it's kept
22 honest. So I would hope that the Department would do
23 that.

24 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you,
25 Miss Hernandez. And I'll just follow up with that since

1 you brought that topic up. Certainly none of us here on
2 this particular Board knows the extent of the
3 investigation that is on going. All we know is what is
4 -- to what has been purported in the various media
5 outlets, all right? That's all we know. And we only
6 can go off of those facts. This is something --
7 apparently the story that appeared last night is
8 something that dates back to 2008. And as you already
9 know, we have done sweeping changes within the
10 Department as relates to the towing regulations here of
11 the Detroit Police Department. And so all of those are
12 brand new. And as you know, we are working on adjusting
13 some of the ones that we just passed to make sure that
14 our system has the greatest possible amount of integrity
15 that it could have. And so, I am very proud of the
16 towing system that is in place right now.

17 I'm very proud that as we put this towing
18 system together, that background checks was done, that
19 paperwork was verified, that all of the paperwork needed
20 to be in and needed to be taken care of. So, there is
21 to my knowledge no, zero, corruption within the towing
22 system of the Detroit Police Department today at all.
23 And if there is, we will find it, and we will deal with
24 it expeditiously. And so, we cannot answer for
25 investigations that are on going, and we certainly

1 cannot answer for a time and a space that predates all
2 of us who sits on this side of the table because when
3 those decisions were made, none of us were sitting up
4 here in the positions that we are in right now.

5 However, what you can do is judge us by the
6 actions that we have taken since we have come on board.
7 And that is to make sure that we have a level playing
8 field for all the towers involved and that we have rules
9 that work not just for a few but we have rules that work
10 for the majority. And so please keep that in mind as
11 you move forward because that is our position. That's
12 our process, and that's our desire and that's what we
13 are held to as relates to the Detroit City Charter. And
14 we take that very serious to make sure that there's a
15 fair and equitable towing system in place. And we
16 believe it is. And I'm sorry, but your two minutes are
17 up. But you certainly can come back next week and
18 expound on it some more. Thank you again. Your two
19 minutes are up.

20 MS. HERNANDEZ: I don't have a problem with
21 saying I have never stood here in all these years
22 judging anyone. There's one judge, one judge, that will
23 deal with this situation. But in all of these years,
24 has this Board or anyone before you ever stopped to say
25 exactly what are you talking about, come sit down and

1 talk with me. You're up here week after week after week
2 talking about corruption within the Police Department.
3 And did any one of yous (sic) ever invite me -- and that
4 includes going through many many police chiefs and many
5 many commissioners -- did any one bother to say, exactly
6 what are you talking about? You're standing up here
7 crying corruption, corruption against our police
8 department, one that I am very proud of. And no one
9 bothered to say, exactly what are you talking about to
10 me as well as many others that have stood up here.
11 That's what I find disappointing. But I commend you.

12 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Stop. Let me correct
13 the record so we cannot have an incorrect record. And
14 there are other towers who are throughout this room who
15 understands this. There's not one tower who I have not
16 agreed to sit down with and meet with one on one in a
17 group. And we have done this. I have especially have
18 done this with every tower who wanted to sit down and
19 meet with me. Not one tower have I refused who wanted
20 to talk to me about particular issues that they were
21 having in the system. And we have done it in groups, we
22 have done it off site, we have done it here in this
23 particular room where it was not a Police Commissioners
24 meeting date. And so yes, we have done that. I have
25 done that personally with every tower who wanted to meet

1 with me.

2 So absolutely that's been the case. So
3 hopefully that answers your question. If you and I have
4 not discussed off line, it's because you have not called
5 me because it -- it's because you have not reached out.
6 I have definitely reached out on the record, and I have
7 reached out personally to every tower that's on our
8 list. And that's the truth.

9 MS. HERNANDEZ: What about the towers that
10 have wanted to be on that list but were blocked because
11 of the corruption? Those were the ones that you should
12 have been talking to, sir.

13 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Again, we have
14 answered that question. Thank you, ma'am.

15 MS. PANNELL: Good afternoon, Sharon Pannell,
16 P-a-n-n-e-l-l. Just got a question. Got a car on my
17 street, been there two weeks. My neighbors complain
18 that it's been in front of his house for ten days or
19 more. And I gave it to Southwest Tuesday. And they
20 told me they don't have ABAN over there any more. I
21 just wanted to know what to do about that.

22 CHIEF GODBEE: Deputy Chief Wells?

23 DEPUTY CHIEF WELLS: I'm here. We will take
24 care of it. It's done.

25 MS. PANNELL: Thank you.

1 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Ms. Pannell, just make
2 sure you see them afterwards.

3 MS. PANNELL: Thank you.

4 MS. SEMMA: Good afternoon. Julie Semma from
5 70's Towing. I'm just really happy that all this is
6 finally coming out. And I just want to compliment all
7 you guys on all your hard work and effort. I know you
8 guys have met with the small towers. And it's just time
9 that whatever has happened in the past needs to just be
10 known and let it come out. And it's just time that the
11 fairness amongst all the small tow companies gets
12 distributed fairly and equally because we have been here
13 all these years. And I want to commend you guys because
14 you guys have done an excellent job. Thank you.

15 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you. Any other
16 comments for the Board? Hearing or seeing none, we will
17 close that section of our meeting. I want to thank you
18 so very much again. As I noted earlier, our next
19 meeting will be next week, February the 23rd, 2012, 3:00
20 p.m. We will now adjourn the meeting. Thank you so
21 very much for coming. Appreciate your time. Thank you.
