4 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ladies
5 and gentlemen.

6 AUDIENCE: Good afternoon.

7 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Welcome to the Board of
8 Police Commissioners meeting. My name is Jerome
9 Warfield, Member of the Board of Detroit Police
10 Commissioners. It's so good to have you all here.
11 Serving on behalf of the Chief of Police with us today
12 is Assistant Chief James White. It's been so long.

13 A.C. WHITE: It's been so long.

14 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Also from our office at
15 the table before you is our Executive Secretary,
16 Mr. George Anthony. I'm going to ask Mr. Anthony to
17 introduce the rest of our staff that's here today.

18 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, Mr. Chair.
19 For the record, George Anthony, Secretary to the Board.
20 We have present Ms. Pamela Davis Drake, our Chief
21 Investigator seated in the front, Mr. Robert Brown who
22 is our Officer Manager, Sergeant Alan Quinn in the back
23 who's recording our proceedings, and Ms. Beth Koller
24 from Hanson Court Reporting Service.

25 That completes the introductions, sir.

1 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: For the record, Vice
2 Chairperson to the Board, Commissioner Donnell White
3 has just arrived. Sir, good afternoon.

4 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Good afternoon.

5 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: I'll turn the meeting
6 over. We just made the introductions.

7 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, sir. For
8 the record, at this time we do not have a quorum
9 present, so we will table approval for the agenda dated
10 for Thursday, October 17th. Approval of minutes.
11 Okay. I apologize. Good to see you Chaplain Penson.
12 If you could come forward and bless us with the
13 invocation.

14 CHAPLAIN PENSON: Can we all bow our heads in
15 a word of prayer. Oh, Gracious God and Wonderful
16 Heavenly Father, we come before you first and foremost
17 to say thank you. And now, God, we ask your blessings
18 upon this agenda, your blessings upon this Board, and
19 blessings upon this Department, that it may continue to
20 serve as the safe haven of our community. We bless
21 your Holy name. In Jesus' name, amen.

22 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, Chaplain.
23 Again, for the record, let it be noted that a quorum is
24 not established and we will table the approval of the
25 minutes dated for Thursday, October 17th, table the

1 approval of the minutes dated for Thursday,
2 September 26th, October 3rd, and October 10th.

3 At this time there is no report from our
4 Chairperson as she is absent today, so we will turn it
5 over for a presentation from the Chief. Assistant
6 Chief White.

7 A.C. WHITE: Good afternoon, everybody.

8 AUDIENCE: Good afternoon.

9 A.C. WHITE: I will be hopefully providing
10 you with crime stats at the end of the presentation.
11 At this time, however, I'd like to turn it over to
12 Brigid O'Droski from Finance for a presentation.

13 MS. O'DROSKI: Good afternoon. Today I'm
14 presenting Grants and Contracts, the unit and the
15 purpose of the unit. The team members right now are
16 myself, Brigid O'Droski, as well as for the team
17 members two of today which are present in the audience,
18 we have Officer Doeh, and Officer Milhouse. We also
19 have Officer Brownlee and Office McGhee who were not
20 able to attend today.

21 The department is primarily responsible for
22 three items, contracts, donations, and grants. Within
23 the grant process we write contracts for building
24 leases, mini stations, personal and professional
25 services as well as intergovernmental agreements.

1 We also with the acceptance of the Board of
2 the Police Commissioners, City Council, and the Mayor's
3 Office, we accept donations that include cash,
4 equipment and services. With our grant process we
5 accept funds from government, private foundations, and
6 corporations. We use various funding for technology,
7 vehicles and equipment, contractual services, salaries,
8 overtime, and fringe benefits.

9 There is a process in order to accept grant
10 funding, and in the preapproval process we identify the
11 opportunity, apply for a grant, prepare a letter to
12 apply and submit documentation via the grant website.

13 Once the grant is awarded we accept the
14 grant, develop a planning strategy, verify spending
15 compliance and update our cost trackers. In doing so,
16 we also send modifications to the grant if needed if
17 spending it not available, and then finally we do
18 prepare reporting packages to the various entities.

19 Currently to date we have several grants that
20 are there. The pool of money that was awarded to us
21 was \$32 million. Today's availability is \$17 million
22 of which we just received approval for the 2013 COPS
23 grant. The initial award was for 2.5 million, and we
24 were award 1.8.

25 We also have to date accepted two donations

1 both from -- one from Marathon and one MDOC, MDOT. To
2 date we've received \$15,000 of \$660,000. And that is
3 it. If you guys have any questions?

4 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you.
5 Commissioner Warfield?

6 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Vice
7 Chair. Good afternoon.

8 MS. O'DROSKI: Good afternoon.

9 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Is there a matrix as
10 relates to charting how we're doing with maintaining
11 the requirements of the grants?

12 MS. O'DROSKI: Sure. We are still in the
13 process of doing the reconciliation. We have gone
14 through all of the grants that have expired as of 9-30.
15 We are now focusing on future grants starting with one
16 that expires in October and one that expires in
17 December.

18 Our future needs absolutely are being looked
19 at as well, and we're doing any amendments that we can
20 possibly do to reallocate those funds.

21 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Certainly this predates
22 you, but one of the things we have requested is just a
23 progress report, if you will.

24 MS. O'DROSKI: Absolutely.

25 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: As to some of the grants

1 that we have approved for the Department to seek
2 approval from City Council to receive. And
3 unfortunately to this day we have not received that.
4 Certainly we know that you're getting up to speed and
5 we understand that. But when you can --

6 MS. O'DROSKI: Absolutely.

7 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: -- if you can provide us
8 with just how we are doing as far as living out the
9 requirements because one of the things we do know was
10 that unfortunately some of our money goes back --

11 MS. O'DROSKI: Correct.

12 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: -- to some of the
13 agencies that issue that money, and we want to as best
14 as possible make sure we have policies and procedures
15 in place to avoid that from happening in the future.

16 MS. O'DROSKI: Yep, absolutely, I will get
17 that to you as soon as I can. Like I said, we're in
18 the process of doing that and hopefully in the next two
19 weeks we can commit to giving you that.

20 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: And give me your title
21 again, I'm sorry?

22 MS. O'DROSKI: Director, Budget Operations.

23 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Can I -- this is a little
24 bit off your presentation.

25 MS. O'DROSKI: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: We also are members of
2 the MACO which is a national oversight organization
3 which basically we go to to learn about standards of
4 civilian oversights that pretty much govern the nation.
5 We have a very significant role to play with that
6 organization. Yearly we go to their conventions for
7 teaching and training opportunities, as well.

8 Are you the entity that approves training
9 trips like this for the Board as far as from the budget
10 although that money has already been budgeted for this
11 quarter?

12 MS. O'DROSKI: Yes, all travel requests do
13 come through my office.

14 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Okay. Great. Thank you,
15 sir.

16 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
17 Commissioner Warfield. Madam Director, I see a number
18 of grants that are listed here. Are all grants that
19 are awarded to the Department is it safe to say they're
20 coming through your office?

21 MS. O'DROSKI: No. There are additional
22 grants that are not coming through my office which are
23 Homeland Security. There are four grants that are
24 awarded through that and we're working on those as
25 well. There's an emergency operation center that's in

1 process. There are some additional cameras for
2 security purposes at K-MAC, and there are other two
3 grants, one of which is funding for homeland security
4 team, a contract written by Strategic Staffing. And
5 I'm not up to speed on the fourth one, so I apologize
6 on that.

7 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: To the best of your
8 ability if you could articulate why those grants would
9 vary from these other grants and not come through your
10 office?

11 MS. O'DROSKI: Sure. The best that I have
12 been told and I'm participating in those meetings as
13 well that they are special requirements meaning that
14 Homeland Security can only participate in that. They
15 went out, they sought the grant, they're responsible
16 for maintaining the paperwork. But I am involved in
17 those as well even though it doesn't run through my
18 shop, so to say, I'm aware of them.

19 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Okay. And the new
20 vehicles that were donated to the Department, is that
21 through your office?

22 MS. O'DROSKI: Yes, primarily managed through
23 Fleet Management which is now a part of Facilities
24 Resources, I think the new title is. The communication
25 side is run through Communications, but the funding and

1 the donation I was -- kind of came in right before I
2 came on board, so I'm in the loop on it but I can't
3 specifically speak of it.

4 With the grants that we do have in place
5 there will be additional cars that we can take on
6 through leases. With the ACPA grant right now there's
7 26 vehicles that we can lease up to \$152,000 for a
8 one-year funding. There's a 47 percent match that the
9 City also has to do in order to seek out those cars.

10 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Okay. So for the
11 original fleet, if you will, that came on board --

12 MS. O'DROSKI: Yes. Are you referring to the
13 hundred cars?

14 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Yes. We have to
15 provide 47 percent match?

16 MS. O'DROSKI: No, no, that's separate,
17 that's completely separate. I'm not sure if A.C. White
18 can help with that conversation, but I know that we
19 took on a hundred cars. It was prior to me that they
20 were here. Communication is taking care of the radios.
21 Fleet Management is taking care of the deployment of
22 the cars. But as far as --

23 A.C. WHITE: I don't have the information on
24 the funding, so I'd like to get that for you at the
25 next meeting, if that's okay?

1 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Okay.

2 A.C. WHITE: I think I know, but I would hate
3 to just provide information unless I can confirm it
4 first.

5 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Sure, I appreciate
6 that. So, Mr. Secretary, if we could just table that
7 as a discussion for our next week's meeting?

8 MS. O'DROSKI: Absolutely.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Anything further,
10 Commissioner Warfield?

11 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Just a couple things, and
12 maybe A.C. White might know the answer to this, going
13 back to Homeland Security.

14 MS. O'DROSKI: Sure.

15 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Are they a department
16 under DPD now or are they separate or how does that
17 work?

18 A.C. WHITE: Right now we're working with the
19 previous Homeland Security entity which now reports to
20 the Police, but we still have a police component.
21 Going forward it almost appears to be the most logical
22 thing to do would be to merge the two because they're
23 doing the same work, you know, so just maybe add to its
24 staff.

25 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: And going back for a

1 second to the hundred cars, as far as maintenance on
2 those cars is that through the grant that the persons
3 who donate those cars are taking care of those or is
4 that DPD's responsibility to take care of those?

5 MS. O'DROSKI: I believe it's DPD's.

6 A.C. WHITE: That's correct. I can answer
7 that. It's DPD's responsibility to take care of those
8 vehicles.

9 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Are they repainting them
10 if they get into a crash and it messes up the pretty
11 logos?

12 A.C. WHITE: That's a very good question and
13 I will have an answer for you next week on that.

14 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Thank you.

15 MS. O'DROSKI: There is a process in place
16 right now where we are doing inspections daily where
17 they are actually at a change of shift they will be
18 doing inspections. So I'm guessing that during that
19 process those types of instances will be noted.

20 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Okay.

21 MS. O'DROSKI: Thank you.

22 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, Madam
23 Director. Anything further, Assistant Chief?

24 A.C. WHITE: If I could just have one second,
25 please.

1 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: No problem.

2 A.C. WHITE: Nothing further.

3 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, sir.

4 Mr. Secretary, I do apologize, I neglected to ask if
5 there was a Secretary's Report today?

6 SECRETARY ANTHONY: No.

7 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Anything from our
8 Office of the Chief Investigator?

9 INVESTIGATOR DAVIS DRAKE: No, sir.

10 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: At this time, our
11 New Business, there was a Resolution, we will take up
12 next week for Police Officer Rodney Jones,
13 (Posthumously), Retired D.C. Morris Wells, and Retired
14 Investigator Audry Thomas.

15 Under Old Business, Directives 203.4-Missing
16 Or Lost Persons and Directive 204.1-Crash
17 Investigations, is there anything on that today,
18 Mr. Secretary?

19 SECRETARY ANTHONY: No, there isn't, sir.

20 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Under Announcements,
21 our next meeting will be held Thursday, October 24th at
22 3:00 p.m., Detroit Public Safety Headquarters, 1301
23 Third Avenue here in the Media Room, Detroit, Michigan
24 48226.

25 At this time the Chair will entertain oral

1 communications from the audience. If you wish to
2 address the Board of Police Commissioners we would ask
3 that you come forward and for the record please state
4 and spell your first and last name for the record.
5 Please be mindful of the allotted two-minute time
6 period provided so that we can provide an opportunity
7 for anyone to speak today. Any communications?

8 MS. CRUMP-GIBSON: Good afternoon.

9 Good afternoon. My name is Jehan, J-E-H-A-N,
10 last name, Crump-Gibson, C-R-U-M-P-G-I-B-S-O-N. It's
11 long. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to
12 speak. I'm here today on behalf of a client of mine
13 who is a Detroit Authorized Police Tower, and I'll
14 leave them nameless today.

15 But they were told toward the end of last
16 year when they got a letter about towing of abans to
17 not sign a contract because it was against the City
18 Charter. And in following the recommendation from this
19 Board my client along with about nine others did not
20 sign the contract. And there were about eight
21 companies that did. Those companies now have contracts
22 with Municipal Parking Department, and my client does
23 not.

24 So we're at the stage now where we're kind of
25 asking if this Board has any recommendations for next

1 steps because my clients have been closed out of the
2 process?

3 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
4 Ms. Crump-Gibson. Commissioner Warfield, do you want
5 to --

6 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Sure. There's a lot I
7 want to say about this.

8 MS. GRUMP-GIBSON: I know you do. Hello.
9 Wonderful. How are you?

10 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Just to go real briefly
11 backtrack in history there was a process that went
12 against the Charter to try to redo aban tows without
13 going through the Board of Police Commissioners, and we
14 do understand there's some emphasis still out there.
15 From what I understand it's coming from and this is
16 just what I'm hearing is coming from Mr. Gary Brown's
17 office and what they are trying to do or they have
18 effectively done somehow been able to move aban towing
19 away from the Detroit Police Department and placed
20 under Municipal Towing.

21 I still say that the Charter has not changed.
22 Neither has the responsibility or the role of the Board
23 of Police Commissioners been changed. And so obviously
24 I think there are some significant legal concerns with
25 those contracts that were issued under the parking for

1 aban tows. It's very clear unless the Charter was
2 changed, and I know we heard some -- an attorney come
3 months ago and said that the City Charter passed a
4 resolution to change that ordinance. We have not seen
5 it --

6 MS. CRUMP-GIBSON: It doesn't exist.

7 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: -- able to track it down.
8 Amen. Thank you. And it does not exist. So,
9 therefore, I believe that they are still in violation
10 of the Detroit City Charter. And, you know, I can't
11 speak on behalf of the Chair, but I know that I will be
12 willing to sign on as any type of validation that those
13 contracts still have to come through the Board, that we
14 still to this day determine the procedures for aban
15 tows.

16 And then something else I've heard is that
17 they're now towers who are doing business with the
18 Detroit Police Department who have not gone through the
19 authorization process and they're towers now that are
20 signed up doing towing that's not our towers. And I
21 think, sir, that has to be looked into, as well.

22 So I will just hope that, you know, if you
23 are going to look into this and certainly I believe we
24 will that we work together on this. Because, again,
25 according to the City Charter which is the only thing

1 we have to go by it's still against the Charter and
2 it's not legal.

3 MS. CRUMP-GIBSON: Okay.

4 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Ms. Crump-Gibson, to
5 Commissioner Warfield's point, if you could submit your
6 concern in writing to us that would certainly be
7 beneficial as we unravel this as we move forward.

8 MS. CRUMP-GIBSON: Sure. Thank you.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Mr. Secretary, also
10 for discussion for next week, certainly I think I hear
11 you clearly, Commissioner Warfield, there's probably a
12 few items that need a motion behind it in terms of how
13 we proceed on this. There's been a number of concerns
14 from the community centered around this issue of aban
15 towing.

16 So I think we should be prepared for our
17 meeting next week to discuss options as we move forward
18 whether that's with the Office of the Inspector
19 General, whether that's communications to the Mayor's
20 and/or Emergency Manager's office and/or City Council
21 to affirm some of these resolutions that could
22 potentially move by this body.

23 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Sir, put also on that
24 list some things to discuss the potential move of
25 Office of Chief Investigation, that has not come before

1 this Board and we have not put a resolution on it or
2 discussed it as a Board and if we can bring that up, as
3 well.

4 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Certainly. Thank
5 you. Any other communications? Good afternoon.

6 MR. WELBOURNE: My name is Bill Welborne,
7 W-E-L-B-O-R-N-E. I'm president of City Wide Police --
8 Ms. O'Droski, is that it?

9 MS. O'DROSKI: Yes.

10 MR. WELBOURNE: She was talking about the
11 grants that the city has. I was just wondering if the
12 grants that a couple years ago that Chief Barron was
13 Chief he instituted a couple grants, so grants that I
14 know about, are those part of the grants coming in now?
15 Was they ever put into effect when they were written?
16 Anybody know?

17 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: I'm not certain,
18 President Welborne, but maybe possibly through the
19 Assistant Chief we can get a response. I think,
20 Assistant Chief, last week, I know someone was supposed
21 to followed up with that if I'm not mistake at the
22 meeting at Second Ebenezer?

23 MR. WELBOURNE: Right.

24 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: I think you had a
25 question regarding that grant process and whether it

1 was coming back around, so I'm not sure if they
2 followed up with you or not?

3 MR. WELBOURNE: No, not yet.

4 A.C. WHITE: I believe Deputy Chief Levalley
5 was here last week. I'll check with him on that issue.
6 Would you happen to know the names of the grants?

7 MR. WELBOURNE: No, I don't. It was about
8 two or three written. I was just wondering if they
9 were ever -- as part of these grants coming in now. It
10 doesn't -- it's no big deal about it, but I happen to
11 know that some was written.

12 A.C. WHITE: Okay.

13 MR. WELBOURNE: Because he was adamant about
14 getting grants for the Police Department.

15 A.C. WHITE: What we can do, we can look at
16 the timeframe from when he was here and look at if
17 there was any specific grants that he was a part of and
18 I can get back with you.

19 It will take me a little time to do that
20 unless you have a name of a grant or what it was used
21 for. Do you happen to know what it was used for?

22 MR. WELBOURNE: I can try to find out.

23 A.C. WHITE: Well, don't worry about it. We
24 can do it from our end and I can reach out to you. I
25 still have your phone number unless you've changed it.

1 MR. WELBOURNE: No, it's still the same.
2 Everything's still the same. Okay. Thank you.

3 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
4 Mr. Welborne. Any other communications? Good
5 afternoon.

6 MS. DOWDELL: Good afternoon. My name is
7 Shirlene Dowdell, S-H-I-R-L-E-N-E, D-O-W-D-E-L-L. My
8 concern is my son was murdered in June. At the time of
9 his death he had my iphone in his possession. I have
10 been trying to reach the Detective who was in charge of
11 the case. Also his wife has emailed somebody down here
12 at the station about the situation. And we're getting
13 nowhere with this phone.

14 I'm still paying \$112 a month bill on the
15 phone. You see, he just happened to have it in his
16 possession at the time of the murder. So I just wonder
17 if anybody could direct me on how to retrieve my phone?

18 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Certainly.
19 Ms. Dowdell, first of all, thank you for coming here
20 today, and we certainly grieve with you in the loss of
21 your son in a tragic way. And certainly if there's
22 anything we can do we certainly will be most responsive
23 to you.

24 Assistant Chief, is there someone we can get
25 Ms. Dowdell to to discuss where her phone may be or how

1 she may --

2 MS. DOWDELL: Well, the last time, excuse me,
3 they said the State Police had it, but that's the only
4 information they gave me.

5 A.C. WHITE: Okay. Again, I second the
6 sentiments of the Chair in regards to your loss. Our
7 condolences. The Sergeant in the back of the room will
8 take your information and put you in contact with
9 Homicide. In fact, Sergeant, if we could reach out to
10 Homicide and connect Ms. Dowdell with the
11 appropriate people, please?

12 SERGEANT: Yes.

13 MS. DOWDELL: Thank you.

14 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Was your son in
15 Detroit? You lost your son in Detroit?

16 MS. DOWDELL: Yes, I did, right in front of
17 the side door at my home. Thank you.

18 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Again, we apologize
19 for your loss. Commissioner Warfield?

20 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Mr. Chair, and I don't
21 know if we refer to Robert Brown about this, but I've
22 received numerous concerns related to Detectives
23 getting back with victims who have -- especially those
24 who have been murdered, and if we can get a
25 presentation on the process that should be in place for

1 Detectives to get back with our citizens will be
2 helpful.

3 I'm hearing over and over again phone calls
4 that are not being returned and information. We do
5 understand that, you know, there are processes and
6 procedures in place. But I think the public needs to
7 know what those processes and procedures are in order
8 that we may clear up any confusion that there might be.

9 MS. PANNELL: Good afternoon. Sharon
10 Pannell. The Detroit Police Citizen Academy is getting
11 with Homicide at this time right now to learn how to
12 talk to the victims. And I'm not in that class because
13 I don't do Homicide, but the other girls are doing it.
14 And they are going to start talking to the families and
15 they learning how to, you know, connect with the
16 people, so.

17 I don't know the young man that came over to
18 our meeting, I don't know his name, the Police Officer,
19 because Blackman has retired. So if you could get with
20 them or Dory from Detroit Police Citizen Academy, too,
21 I can email you her number. I don't know it offhand.
22 Okay.

23 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, that
24 would be great.

25 A.C. WHITE: Through the Chair, we, too, have

1 received those complaints. Deputy Chief Levalley who
2 is new to that assignment and responsibility has
3 selected a Captain for the position of Homicide
4 Captain. One of the directives that he's given is to
5 implement a strategy where we are contacting citizens
6 within 24 hours. So those would probably be the best
7 times to have a presentation and I could ensure that
8 that occurs.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, Assistant
10 Chief. Any other communications? Any other
11 communications? Any other communications? Seeing
12 none.

13 At this time, again, be reminded the next
