CHAIRPERSON BELL: Good afternoon. Can you hear me now? Thank you. Good afternoon. This is a great day. This is a nice day, and it's good to see all of you here this afternoon for our weekly meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners. And I am Willie Bell, your chair. And to my immediate right is the vice chair, Lisa Carter. And to my left is the immediate past chair, the one and only Ms. Commissioner Taylor. I thank her for her past leadership and ongoing involvement with the board.

So at this time, I would like to invite Mr. Anthony to introduce the rest of the board, the board secretary. Thank you.

SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, sir. For the record, George Anthony, secretary to the board. We have -- to my right, we have Ms. Aliyah Sabree, our attorney to the board. Ms. Pamela Davis Drake, our chief investigator is seated in front. We also have Sergeant Allen Quinn in the back recording our proceedings, and Ms. Trisha Houpt from Hanson Court Reporting service. That completes the introduction, sir.

CHAIRPERSON BELL: I guess we can follow the script for the Board of Police Commissioners. I threw

1 you off. I introduced some of them.

2 MR. ANTHONY: Sir, I apologize.

3 CHAIRPERSON BELL: I threw you off.

4 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Let me do the roll call.

5 Yes. I apologize. Commissioner -- or Vice Chair Lisa
6 Carter.

7 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Present.

8 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Willie
9 Burton.

10 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Present.

11 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Wendell L.
12 Byrd.

13 Commissioner Reginald Crawford.

14 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Present.

15 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Ricardo R.
16 Moore.

17 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Present.

18 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Richard
19 Shelby.

20 COMMISSIONER SHELBY: Here.

21 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Jessica
22 Taylor.

23 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Present.

24 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Commissioner Donnell R.
25 White asked to be excused. That completes the roll

1 call.

2 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you, sir. And to my
3 far left, sitting in where the chief normally sits,
4 James E. Craig, is Deputy Chief Brown. Is that Daryl
5 Brown?

6 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Present, sir.

7 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you. And
8 commissioners, you have an agenda before you for this
9 afternoon meeting. What is your pleasure?

10 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: I move to accept.

11 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Second.

12 CHAIRPERSON BELL: It's been properly moved
13 and second. Ready for the question? Those in favor?

14 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

15 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Those opposed? Motion
16 carried.

17 Commissioners, you also have the minutes from
18 Thursday, July the 31st, 2014. The chair would
19 entertain a motion.

20 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: I move to accept the
21 minutes of Thursday, July 31st.

22 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Second.

23 CHAIRPERSON BELL: It's been properly moved
24 and second. Ready for the question? Those in favor?

25 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

1 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Those opposed? Motion
2 carried. Thank you.

3 According to the agenda, briefly, I just want
4 to say that I attended the national night out. Is that
5 the proper terminology?

6 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Yes, sir.

7 CHAIRPERSON BELL: At the 7th Precinct and --
8 what's the other precinct?

9 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: 11th.

10 CHAIRPERSON BELL: I'm going back to the old
11 concept. But they had a great attendance and
12 interaction with the two captains over there, had an
13 opportunity to interact with them and also the chief of
14 staff and others and a had a great -- even though the
15 weather was a little wet, it did not deter the
16 community people, business people, and the young people
17 participating. So I was pleased. Unfortunately, I
18 missed the opportunity to learn how to hustle with
19 Captain Hope. She said she reserved that at a later
20 time for myself and Commissioner Crawford. She just
21 emphasized that she is smooth. So I take her at her
22 word.

23 Also attended the one at -- on Conners, that
24 would be the No. 9 and No. 5; is that right?

25 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Yes, sir.

1 CHAIRPERSON BELL: National night out.

2 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Yes, sir.

3 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Okay. So that was -- I
4 got there a little late. But once again, that was a
5 great participation of all activities there. So I'm
6 pleased we had -- and I'm pretty sure some of the
7 deputy chiefs and others are going to be making their
8 rounds for other locations. So perhaps you can give us
9 more reporting out on that. So at this time, I'd like
10 to turn the floor over to Deputy Chief Brown.

11 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Thank you, Chair, board
12 members, audience. On behalf of the Chief of Police
13 James Craig, who's attending a meeting over at the
14 mayor's office right now, I'd like to give you a brief
15 update on the current statistical numbers as they
16 pertain.

17 Currently as it relates to homicides, we're
18 showing about 14 percent decrease in the number of
19 homicides from the previous year. Also, non-fatal
20 shootings are trending around 14 percent as well.
21 Homicides -- robberies. Excuse me. Robberies are
22 trending about 37 percent decrease. And so that's
23 about a total overall decrease as far as violent crime
24 is concerned at about 9 percent.

25 I too had the pleasure of going to the 6th

1 and 8th Northwest Districts, Peterson Park, poured
2 down, jumped out the car, ran around the park, jumped
3 back in the car. So it was a well-attended event from
4 4:00 to 8:00.

5 I was going to make the 2nd Precinct,
6 probably was going to make the 4th Precinct. It was
7 definitely bad weather but it was all well attended.

8 The chief announced today a scholarship
9 program in conjunction with Wayne State University
10 where there was two sergeants that were provided
11 scholarships with a partnership through Wayne State
12 where they're going to receive their master's degrees.
13 So he was very happy about making that announcement.

14 As far as further announcements are
15 concerned, I don't think we have anything out for --
16 Deputy Chief LeValley, do we have anything?

17 DEPUTY CHIEF LEVALLEY: No.

18 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: And there's some other
19 directors here. Do we have anything, ma'am? That
20 would conclude our report.

21 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Sir, would you introduce
22 the -- your staff, commander, officer, any others from
23 DPD at this time.

24 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Director Gail Oxendine.
25 I'll butcher her name. Did I get it right, ma'am?

1 DIRECTOR OXENDINE: Yes, sir.

2 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Director, Deputy Chief
3 Celia Washington and Deputy Chief David LeValley. I
4 don't see anybody else from DPD.

5 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Deputy Chief Brown,
6 perhaps you need to mention that we had a promotional
7 ceremony this past Friday at Greater Grace. So would
8 you acknowledge that at some point.

9 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Yes, sir. We did have a
10 promotional ceremony of which we promoted to the rank
11 of Sergeant Lieutenant Director Tolliver, Deputy Chief
12 myself, and Deputy Chief Renee Hall. That's about it.
13 And we had a very inspirational speech by Chair --
14 Board of Police -- the chair.

15 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Well, the church will say
16 amen. I was not soliciting that. But I just want to
17 say that Commissioner Shelby and myself had an
18 opportunity to attend along with Chief Investigator in
19 reference to the promotional ceremony. And I was so
20 moved and perhaps I got a little carried away with --
21 but we was in the house of the Lord and Greater Grace.
22 So I didn't book the place. But the Lord was there so
23 I just responded in kind. So there it is. I'm
24 thankful. And really it's a good thing that we are
25 moving forward in reference to recognizing someone that

1 had already been promoted. But they had a ceremony and
2 that was really a positive thing. And I really
3 appreciate talking to the sergeants and lieutenants
4 because they are really the backbone and focal point
5 which you see in terms of our precinct involvement. We
6 all know that they're out there 24/7 and sometimes they
7 don't get enough recognition. So I was just really
8 pleased at the opportunity to interact. Also, next
9 week we're going to have an officer candidate class.
10 You're going to speak to that. Thank you.

11 MS. OXENDINE: For the record, Gail Oxendine,
12 HR director. Yes. We're going to have a ceremony,
13 graduation ceremony for new police officers coming on
14 Friday the 15th at 10:00 a.m. at the same location,
15 Greater Grace. So we're excited about that.

16 CHAIRPERSON BELL: I am too. On that note,
17 since we are so -- I would like to -- I'm sorry. I
18 thought I heard something.

19 I would like to call -- I'd like to pause at
20 this time. Since we're in a thankful mode, I'd like to
21 call up Deacon Adams to come forward to render the
22 prayer. I think it's appropriate at this time. We
23 normally do it earlier, but we got a little bit far in
24 the agenda. But this whole thing work together for the
25 good.

1 (Invocation given.)

2 (Commissioner Byrd enters meeting.)

3 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you, sir. And we
4 also are thankful and want to commend and congratulate
5 our Commissioner Byrd who is now state rep elect, third
6 district. And I know he's been exhausted in terms of
7 campaigning. But it's good to see him out. And we
8 really appreciate your ongoing involvement. Keep us in
9 mind when you move on to a higher office.

10 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Every Thursday.

11 CHAIRPERSON BELL: I like the spirit in this
12 commission. Okay. Thank you, sir.

13 Standing committee report. Standing
14 committee reports from the Board of Police
15 Commissioners.

16 COMMISSIONER MOORE: I don't have a committee
17 report, but I do have a question. Chief, you had
18 mentioned about crime statistics. Are you saying crime
19 is down or crime reporting is down?

20 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Crime is down.

21 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Crime is down.

22 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: We actually believe that
23 crime reporting is up. We believe we're doing a
24 phenomenal job as it relates to responding. We're
25 responding with less resources, and the calls for

1 service are much higher. I don't have that percentage.
2 But the calls for services are up compared to last
3 year.

4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So we're operating off
5 100 percent crime reporting?

6 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: It's never 100 percent
7 because reports have to be approved and whatnot. So I
8 wouldn't say it's 100 percent. But the information
9 that's available to us.

10 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So, therefore, we're
11 going off of crime reporting?

12 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Correct.

13 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Thank you, sir.

14 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Any other comments? I
15 think Commissioner Burton had a comment that he wanted
16 to make to the chief in reference to issues in your
17 district. Is that correct?

18 COMMISSIONER BURTON: No.

19 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Okay. Resolved. Okay.
20 Thank you.

21 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Thank you.

22 CHAIRPERSON BELL: That covers the committee
23 report. And we have a resolution for retired
24 investigator Sylvia Ellison. Is she here today? If
25 not, I'm going to ask Commissioner Burton to read the

1 resolve in reference to the resolution. She's out at
2 the First Precinct. She's out of the First Precinct.
3 Do you have that before you?

4 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Who drafted the
5 resolution?

6 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Right here.

7 COMMISSIONER BURTON: This is your
8 resolution?

9 CHAIRPERSON BELL: No. It's for the Board of
10 Police Commissioners. It's right here.

11 COMMISSIONER BURTON: You do the honor. You
12 just read it.

13 COMMISSIONER CARTER: I'll read it.

14 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you.

15 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Now therefore being it
16 resolved that the Detroit Board of Police Commissioners
17 speaking on behalf of the Detroit Police Department and
18 the citizens of the City of Detroit recognize the
19 lifelong commitment to public safety of investigator
20 Sylvia Ellison. Her pride and dedication has been
21 invaluable -- have been invaluable assets to the
22 department and merit our highest regard. We thank and
23 congratulate you, Investigator Sylvia Ellison. Detroit
24 Board of Police Commissioners.

25 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you, Vice Chair

1 Carter. The chair would entertain a motion to receive
2 this resolution at this particular time.

3 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: So moved.

4 CHAIRPERSON BELL: So moved. Ready for the
5 question? Those in favor?

6 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

7 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Those opposed? Motion
8 carried.

9 Any old business, unfinished business?
10 Announcements. The next meeting will be scheduled for
11 Thursday, August the 14th, at 6:30 p.m., 5th Precinct,
12 at the UAW Local 7, 2600 Conner. And we've been
13 emphasizing that for quite some time. So if you're
14 available and you wanted to attend the meeting,
15 community people looking forward to hosting, and we're
16 looking forward to the interaction. That's at 6:30.
17 Thank you.

18 Now come time for oral communication from the
19 audience. I would please ask that you give your name
20 and keep your comments to two minutes, in reference to
21 the recorder and for the commissioners. If you have
22 any question or concerns, direct it to the chair, and
23 the commissioners will have the opportunity to weigh in
24 on it. Thank you.

25 MR. WELBORNE: Good afternoon, Deputy Chief.

1 My name is Bill Welborne, president of City Wide,
2 W-e-l-b-o-r-n-e. A couple -- last week -- a couple
3 weeks ago, I attended a meeting, a city crime
4 prevention meeting. And at this meeting had some young
5 people from Renaissance, from Cass, from U of D Jesuit,
6 from -- what's the one over there on Kelly Road? Is
7 that Osborne?

8 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Denby.

9 MR. WELBORNE: Denby. Whatever it is. But
10 they got a group together. And when they started
11 talking, I got interested in it. What they're working
12 on is trying to get a lot of young people who have
13 parents incarcerated. I don't think anybody ever
14 thought about that. I know I never thought about it.
15 And I've been working with the police for a long time.
16 I don't know a lot about it, but I got a meeting with
17 them Monday morning. Supposed to meet with them Monday
18 morning. And we're going to -- I want to find out just
19 exactly what their program is because I -- to me, it's
20 a pretty good subject, what these kids are going
21 through. You know, every day they go to school, they
22 get teased by their peers and say oh, your father is in
23 jail, blah, blah, this and that. And sometimes it
24 could hurt. And like I say, as soon as I find out more
25 information about it, I'm going to give it to the board

1 and let them know about it.

2 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Okay. Perhaps
3 commissioner Crawford would want to respond to that.

4 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: No, sir.

5 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Didn't we have this --
6 Commissioner Taylor. I'm sorry.

7 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: I'm going to -- I
8 talked to them, and I'm going to invite them to a --
9 one of my meetings that deals with changing policy.
10 And I think their program deals with changing policy on
11 how the children interact with their parents who are
12 incarcerated. So I'll be meeting with them also, you
13 know, because my commission deals with changing policy.

14 MR. WELBORNE: Okay. We can get together on
15 that then and work together on it because it's for --
16 in fact, next month I want to have them at City Wide so
17 they can talk to the people and explain to them what
18 their program is. I think it's a good program, and
19 people should know about it.

20 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: What's the name of it?

21 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Project What.

22 CHAIRPERSON BELL: They came briefly before
23 us last week.

24 SECRETARY ANTHONY: And they are invited for
25 next week as well.

1 CHAIRPERSON BELL: They are invited next week
2 for our community meeting at 6:30 at local 7 on Conner.
3 Commissioner Taylor is going to follow up a little bit
4 more in depth. So thank you for bringing that to our
5 attention.

6 MR. WELBORNE: Is that Gomez or whatever his
7 name was?

8 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Yes. We have that one.

9 MR. WELBORNE: He's the one. Okay I met him
10 at another meeting. Okay. Thank you. Thank you.

11 MR. DUBOSE: Good afternoon, Chair, Vice
12 Chair, and members of the committee. My name is Carl
13 Dubose. I'm here before you today to speak to you
14 about a tragedy event that happened August the 1st,
15 2014, around 1:30 a.m., on the Detroit west side at the
16 8th Precinct district. The young lady that was killed
17 that night was our daughter. Her name was Courtney
18 DeShawn Dubose. I know you guys have a two-minute
19 limit, but I can't do this in a two-minute limit. And
20 I apologize.

21 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Sir, do you need two more
22 minutes?

23 MR. DUBOSE: I'm going to try to make it
24 brief.

25 CHAIRPERSON BELL: We can give you four

1 minutes. We can honor that. But we have author
2 individuals that want to speak also.

3 MR. DUBOSE: I understand that, sir.

4 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you.

5 MR. DUBOSE: On this night, there were
6 numerous issues that we as a family are still left in
7 the dark about. One, this accident was reported at
8 12:00 a.m. The actual occurrence of getting the report
9 was at 1:19 a.m. The detective who decided to report
10 this case made his report at 2:15 a.m. Her vehicle did
11 not -- her evidence inside the vehicle was not properly
12 collected. Therefore, we do not have a personal
13 identification for our daughter. We don't have her
14 cellphone. But the cellphone was still used after my
15 daughter's death.

16 I kind of beg the difference with Deputy
17 Chief Brown that just gave to these guys as far as the
18 statistical value of what's going on in homicide. In
19 order for us to get this number right, this information
20 should be transparent to every citizen of Detroit. And
21 we have to have a system that verifies that this
22 average that he gave us is pertinent. If you read
23 those comments -- I did that with a couple of my fellow
24 friends that I have, and this is what we came up with.
25 That phone is still being used. We closed it out. The

1 three young men that was with my daughter that night
2 were allowed to go home after they got out of
3 questioning. If they had probable cause we already
4 know that we could probably hold them for like 72 hours
5 to get those thorough questions. We got recordings
6 where they done called Courtney's mom and actually
7 spilled their guts. But they are still free today,
8 gentlemen, ladies. I press upon this group, which is
9 known to send external investigations out, to assure
10 that my daughter doesn't die in vain. That's all I ask
11 for each and every one of you. But as a 22-year
12 veteran, United States Army, three combat tours, and a
13 bronze star, I will not go to sleep and let my daughter
14 die in vain for six to seven months or even a year.
15 I'm now a part of your meetings every time you have a
16 meeting. And when I come the next time, sir, ladies, I
17 will have an entourage behind me. God bless you.

18 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you, sir. We're
19 going to give -- first of all, Deputy Chief Brown, if
20 you want to respond. Also our chief investigator is
21 here behind you. And she can talk with you in
22 reference to your concerns in reference to the matter
23 as far as investigation.

24 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Chair --

25 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Yes.

1 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Did you have a question
2 first? I have members from the homicide unit coming
3 down here. I'm kind of familiar with the case. But I
4 don't want to speak off the cuff. They're coming down
5 as far as the facts are concerned. Was there a
6 question, or are you saying that there has not yet been
7 any investigation conducted? The matter has not been
8 resolved to your liking? What exactly --

9 MS. DUBOSE: I have a question. I'm Bernie
10 Dubose. I'm the mother of the victim. When I came to
11 collect her items, they gave me her car.

12 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Okay.

13 MR. DUBOSE: Within 12 to 18 hours. The
14 incident happened early in the morning.

15 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Ma'am, we cannot entertain
16 two people, speaking at the same time. And there's no
17 way this -- this is an ongoing investigation. So we
18 cannot get into details.

19 MS. DUBOSE: We understand that.

20 CHAIRPERSON BELL: So if you would give us an
21 opportunity. But Commissioner Crawford had a question.

22 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Yes, sir, through the
23 chair. Ma'am, you can finish whatever you were saying.

24 MS. DUBOSE: Thank you for allowing me to
25 finish my statement. My daughter's car was released to

1 me, and I really thought that that was really unfair
2 and unjust to her. I felt that the car should have
3 been kept for further investigation because when I
4 received the car, it was vandalized. It was not in the
5 condition that I last seen her in. All of her items
6 were all disrupted. There -- they just gave me the car
7 without even trying to figure out what happened. Her
8 car is in my garage right now shot up.

9 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Is there a point of
10 contact for the family? Who exactly is the point of
11 contact for the family.

12 MR. DUBOSE: The officer of this case is
13 Detective Sergeant Alex Vincent.

14 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: Correct.

15 MR. DUBOSE: And he has point of contacts
16 with each family member here. We have not heard
17 anything from Mr. Vincent at all. We're not going to
18 hold this up. I know you guys got other folks that you
19 want to talk to.

20 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Excuse me. Through
21 the chair, Commissioner Crawford. First and foremost,
22 I offer my condolences to you and your family. That's
23 a great loss. Also, if anyone else wants to speak, you
24 have an opportunity here to do so. And that's not
25 overstepping the bounds of the chair.

1 CHAIRPERSON BELL: No. I'm fine with that.

2 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: He stated that
3 earlier.

4 MS. SPRADLING: My name is Judy Spradling,
5 and I'm the grandmother. This is my first grandchild.
6 And I do help you guys out. I've helped out since I
7 retired from Ford Motor Company, and I expect you to
8 help me out now. Mr. Brown knows me. Mr. George knows
9 me very well. That's all I've got to say.

10 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Any other comments from
11 the commissioners? If not, sir, would you take
12 time to --

13 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: I have Captain Decker
14 from homicide. So he can speak with the family. If
15 they haven't been provided an update, they will be
16 provided one now.

17 MR. DUBOSE: Just to close the statement, I'm
18 one to not give up. So you will see me again. God
19 bless you. Thank you, sir.

20 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you. And we
21 understand your concern.

22 MS. DAVIS DRAKE: Good afternoon. Pamela
23 Davis Drake, for the record, chief investigator.
24 Certainly we are saddened to hear about the loss of
25 your loved one. At this time, though, I believe that

1 we should defer to the homicide division at this point
2 because it is an ongoing investigation.

3 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you. You are
4 correct. Thank you.

5 MS. DAVIS DRAKE: Yes.

6 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Any other comments from
7 the audience?

8 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon. Bernice Smith.
9 Chief, you look good on TV. A lot of information this
10 week. I have -- and congratulations to you, State
11 Representative.

12 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Thank you.

13 MS. SMITH: Wonderful. Good to have you.
14 Yeah. This week I got a -- I worked on campaign -- two
15 campaigns. And we were successful, one was. But we
16 won't go into the other one.

17 But in the meantime -- and we're not
18 campaigning here today.

19 In the meantime, what I wanted to let you
20 know, I got a call from a church member. Her son
21 called me. And I was very interested in what he had to
22 say. He stated to me, Mother Bernice, he wants me to
23 help his mother and father. They had a break in. And
24 gave me the mama's telephone number and so forth. So I
25 called her. In the meantime, the information that I

1 got from her, they lived on Hartwell, and it was the
2 second break in that they had. And they're senior
3 people, intelligent. She works for the city and he
4 works for the veterans. The young man that they
5 suspected that did it lives a couple blocks from him,
6 and he has an ongoing job of robbing the area over
7 there.

8 So to make a long story short, I did my due
9 diligence. I called down here to the chief's office
10 because she stated that she was on the line for so long
11 and she got tired of waiting. Well, I tried it myself,
12 and she was right. It is a long time before you get to
13 the right department. So naturally, I called the
14 chief's office, and I got the number for me to call. I
15 called -- it's the 2nd Precinct, by the way. And I
16 talked with -- please pronounce that. You know the
17 name.

18 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Kyriacou.

19 THE WITNESS: I spoke with him after I ID'd
20 myself, and he said he wanted to get the information.
21 I gave him the information. And he was very polite by
22 telling me that he would get the detective that was on
23 the particular case. I gave him the report number so
24 it was easy for him to find out, you know, whoever was
25 doing the work. And he gave me his e-mail also which I

1 thought was very wonderful because I know you officers
2 don't do -- you know, give e-mails out. But to make a
3 long story short, the detectives did get in touch with
4 her. I spoke with her the day before I came here. And
5 she was very happy to know that the police department
6 is doing their due diligence by getting on the job.

7 But then again, I know some people, they're
8 very upset that they don't get the work done the way
9 they want it done. But I don't know whether I should
10 put a sign out and say I can help you out. But anyway,
11 I did the best I could. And I'm sure that she's very
12 satisfied knowing that this young man who has been
13 robbing and terrorizing this neighborhood and this
14 empty house where he has been going in and out -- and
15 the garage is where he was seen taking various items
16 into the garage back there. So the detectives got all
17 of that. And matter of fact, they knew -- when she
18 told them the name, they knew who he was. So I'm sure
19 that he's going to be apprehended very soon.

20 Now, the other matter was as far as the
21 little boy that got killed, you know, that was in bed.
22 His service is going to be Saturday. But the visiting
23 hours, I think I expressed that on the radio this
24 morning. You can go and visit today starting today
25 from 4:00 to 6:00 and tomorrow also from 8:00 -- I

1 believe it was from 8:00 to -- until 8:00 -- 12:00 to
2 8:00. But the service will be at Mt. Zion Church
3 Saturday. And whether you know it or not, the police
4 commission is going to do their due diligence in
5 regards to that. And I'm very happy about that too
6 because I was asked for the information and Swanson is
7 going to be servicing that funeral. And we're very
8 sorry. I don't know whether I'll be on or not. But I
9 just want you to know that's where his service is going
10 to be held. And I appreciate very much that the
11 commission is going to extend their acknowledgments
12 about it.

13 A lot of people don't realize that you guys
14 do a lot of work and you don't get all the kudos. Of
15 course I'll come every week and tell you what's wrong
16 and when you're doing good. So again,
17 congratulations --

18 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Thank you.

19 MS. SMITH: -- to all of you. And thank you
20 so much for thinking about the family. And I hope
21 Brown will be well soon.

22 CHAIRPERSON BELL: She went 4.5 minutes.
23 That would not have happened if Brown was there.

24 MS. SMITH: I'm sorry: We won't go into it.

25 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Any other comments?

1 COMMISSIONER MOORE: I have a quick comment.
2 Chief -- Captain Kyriacou is not at the 10th present
3 anymore?

4 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: He is. That's correct.

5 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So who's at 2?

6 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: He's covering both.

7 COMMISSIONER MOORE: What's the status of
8 Captain Topp.

9 DEPUTY CHIEF BROWN: He's not captain
10 anymore. He's a lieutenant.

11 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Okay.

12 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Let us continue. Thank
13 you.

14 MS. PANSELL: Sharon Pannell, P-a-n-n-e-l-l.
15 I got my answers -- questions answered, 2nd Precinct.
16 I just wanted you to know I was at the promotion. It
17 was very nice. I was at 2nd Precinct night out, and
18 everything turned out fine. Thank you very much.

19 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Thank you. Any other
20 comments? At this time, the chair would entertain a
21 motion for adjournment. Once again, just to make you
22 aware that we are meeting next week in the community,
23 not here at 3:30. We'll be at Local 7 on Conners at
24 6:30 p.m. And thank you. Perhaps I can see some of
25 you there.

1 COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: So moved.

2 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Second.

3 CHAIRPERSON BELL: It's been properly moved
4 and second. Ready for the question? Those in favor?

5 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

6 CHAIRPERSON BELL: Opposed? Motion carried.

7 Thank you.
