4 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Let me say good
5 afternoon, get the meeting started. Let me
6 welcome you to the Board of Police Commissioners
7 meeting dated for Thursday, January 16, 2014.

8 For the record, I am Commissioner
9 Donnell White. I have the pleasure of serving as
10 Vice-Chair to the body. I will be convening
11 today's meeting on behalf of Chair Taylor who is,
12 I believe, in Lansing attending the State of the
13 State, so we wish her safe travels in her
14 absence.

15 Perhaps, Mr. Secretary, at this portion
16 of the meeting with our new colleagues joining us
17 it may just be appropriate to do a roll call and
18 then introduce the staff.

19 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, sir.
20 For the record, George Anthony, Secretary to the
21 Board. This is a roll call for the Board of
22 Police Commissioners.

23 Jessica Taylor?

24 Donnell R. White?

25 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Present.

1 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Jerome L. Warfield?
2 Richard Shelby?
3 COMMISSIONER SHELBY: Here.
4 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Wendell L. Byrd?
5 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Present.
6 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Reginald Crawford?
7 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Present.
8 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Willie E. Bell?
9 COMMISSIONER BELL: Present.
10 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Willie E. Burton?
11 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Present.
12 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Lisa Carter.
13 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Here.
14 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Ricardo R. Moore?
15 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Present.
16 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Mr. Chair, you have
17 a quorum.
18 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
19 Mr. Secretary. If you please would introduce the
20 staff for the record.
21 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Our staff present
22 includes Ms. Pamela Davis-Drake who is our Chief
23 Investigator, she's seated in the front; Gail
24 Oxendine who is our Director of Police Personnel,
25 she's seated in the front on the other side of

1 the room.

2 We have Mr. Robert Brown who is our
3 office manager, we have recording our proceeding
4 Sgt. Alan Quinn and police officer Kent Cooper
5 and from Hanson Court Reporting Service we have
6 Mr. Dale Rose and that completes the introduction
7 of the staff.

8 We also have sitting in, sir,
9 Ms. Aliyah Sabree, Attorney Aliyah Sabree.

10 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
11 Mr. Secretary. We'll hear from Attorney Sabree
12 later in the meeting.

13 At this time I certainly would like to
14 welcome Asst. Chief Jones to the meeting on
15 behalf of Chief Craig. Thank you for being with
16 us, sir.

17 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Thank you, sir.

18 COMMISSIONER WHITE: At this time the
19 Chair will entertain a motion for approval of the
20 agenda dated for Thursday, January 16th.

21 COMMISSIONER BELL: So moved.

22 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Support.

23 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Properly moved and
24 supported. Any discussion? Seeing none, all
25 those in favor?

1 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

2 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Opposed? Thank
3 you very much. Mr. Secretary, do we have minutes
4 for January 9th?

5 SECRETARY ANTHONY: No, we didn't quite
6 finish them up, they'll be ready next week.

7 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, sir.
8 We will table the approval of the minutes dated
9 for Thursday, January 9, 2014. The Chair did not
10 leave an official Chairperson's report, but
11 colleagues, I would ask and I ask Executive
12 Secretary Anthony as well to peruse the Action
13 Plan as presented to the Chief.

14 I do believe we all were in receipt of
15 a copy from Secretary Anthony, but there are a
16 number of areas in there, and Asst. Chief, I hope
17 that you can share the sentiment with the Chief's
18 office that there's certain areas in there that
19 still speaks to areas of oversight as mandated by
20 the Charter by this body and I hope that the
21 Chief would be receptive to presenting that plan
22 to this body and not only to this body, but the
23 community that we may be able to give input where
24 my colleagues may have areas of concerns or
25 questions, that they might be answered at this

1 time appropriately.

2 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Yes, sir, I'll
3 share those concerns with the Chief.

4 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, sir.
5 At this time we'll have a report and presentation
6 -- and I do apologize. We did not do our
7 invocation and I didn't see any chaplain that was
8 here today.

9 Mr. Secretary, I don't know if we have
10 any duly-sworn deacons in our new allotment of
11 Commissioners, but if someone would so oblige us
12 it is always appropriate to do an invocation at
13 any point of the agenda.

14 COMMISSIONER BELL: Let us pray.
15 (INVOCATION WAS GIVEN).

16 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
17 Commissioner Bell, a duly-elected deacon to the
18 Board of Police Commissioners, we appreciate
19 that.

20 At this time we will have a report or
21 presentation from the Office of the Chief.

22 ASST. CHIEF JONES: At this time we do
23 not have a report.

24 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, sir.
25 I don't believe we have any standing committee

1 reports. Under new business -- and I do believe
2 this probably falls under old business,
3 Mr. Secretary, as we have discussed this
4 previously.

5 SECRETARY ANTHONY: That's correct.

6 COMMISSIONER WHITE: I don't believe we
7 have any new business properly before us.

8 Under old business, colleagues, there
9 is a personnel matter that is before us. Under
10 provisions of the Charter we have been mandated
11 to fill positions to the Board including the
12 Executive Secretary, the Chief Investigator of
13 the Office of the Chief investigator and also the
14 position of attorney to the board.

15 There was interviews and search put in
16 place prior to term starting for January 1, 2014.
17 Before us is a resolution to appoint attorney to
18 the board Ms. Aliyah Sabree.

19 WHEREAS, the 2012 Charter of the City
20 of Detroit (the Charter) was ordained and
21 established by the citizens of Detroit for the
22 governance of the city and

23 WHEREAS, the Charter in Section 7-804
24 authorizes the Board to hire and appoint staff as
25 necessary to carry out its duties and

1 WHEREAS, the attorney to the Board
2 position is currently vacant and

3 WHEREAS, the attorney to the Board acts
4 as the Board's principal legal advisor and
5 advocate by providing confidential legal advice
6 and direction on matters coming before the Board
7 and serves as the Board's liaison to the City's
8 Law Department on all legal matters affecting the
9 Board and

10 WHEREAS, a search was conducted to
11 identify qualified candidates for the position
12 and qualified applicants have been interviewed
13 for the job and

14 WHEREAS, Ms. Aliyah Sabree, an attorney
15 licensed in the state of Michigan in good
16 standing best demonstrates the skills and
17 experience necessary to assume the position and

18 WHEREAS, the Board desires to appoint
19 Ms. Aliyah Sabree to the position of the attorney
20 to the Board with the salary commensurate with
21 that appointment.

22 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the
23 Board appoints Ms. Aliyah Sabree to the position
24 of attorney to the Board this date -- and this
25 was dated for January 12, 2013, but I would amend

1 that to say January 16, 2014.

2 A motion would be in order.

3 COMMISSIONER BYRD: So moved.

4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Second.

5 COMMISSIONER WHITE: It's been properly
6 moved and seconded. Is there any discussion?

7 Seeing none, we will now call for the vote. All
8 those in favor?

9 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

10 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Opposed? Thank
11 you very much. Congratulations, Ms. Aliyah
12 Sabree, new attorney to the Board, Detroit Board
13 of Police Commissioners.

14 If you would, please come and introduce
15 yourself for the record.

16 ATTORNEY SABREE: Good afternoon to
17 everyone and to the Board. I'm Aliyah Sabree and
18 I just want to say briefly thank you for this
19 opportunity and I look forward to working with
20 all of you; thank you.

21 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
22 Ms. Sabree, and I'm sure she'll be available for
23 whose who wish to discuss her background a little
24 bit more in depth. That was short and sweet,
25 Ms. Sabree there.

1 But she does have a very extensive
2 background in law, hails to us from the
3 Prosecutor's Office and we're very excited and
4 look forward to Ms. Sabree's counsel as we move
5 forward through the rest of this calendar year.

6 Ms. Sabree certainly steps into big
7 shoes with our previous attorney to the Board who
8 served us extremely well and I think you would be
9 well served to seek her counsel and advice along
10 the way, I think that would serve you well.

11 So moving right along, at this time I
12 don't believe there's any additional old business
13 before us.

14 Under announcements, please be reminded
15 the next Board of Police Commissioners meeting
16 will meet Thursday, January 23 here at the
17 Detroit Public Safety Headquarters at 3 PM, 1301
18 Third Avenue here in the Media Room.

19 Also please be reminded the
20 Accountability Meeting will be held Tuesday,
21 January 21 at 10 AM. Is that here in the
22 Michigan Room as well, Mr. Secretary?

23 SECRETARY ANTHONY: That would be here,
24 yes.

25 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Here in the

1 Michigan Room at police headquarters, 1301 Third
2 Avenue as well. Also, there will be a
3 promotional ceremony and graduation exercise for
4 the new class that would be held at Second
5 Ebenezer Church on Friday, January 17 at 10 AM.

6 All Commissioners are invited on behalf
7 of the Chief's Office, if you did not see that
8 e-mail that came out and your participation
9 certainly would be appreciated.

10 At this time we will move for -- are
11 there any other announcements, let me ask that,
12 any other announcements from any of the
13 Commissioners?

14 Seeing none, at this time we will move
15 for oral communication from the audience. If you
16 wish to address the Board of Police Commissioners
17 we would ask that you please come forward, please
18 state and spell your first and last name for the
19 purpose of the record, also please be mindful of
20 the allotted two-minute time period to allow
21 everyone an opportunity to address the Board.

22 MS. PANSELL: Good afternoon, Sharon
23 Pannell.

24 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Good afternoon.

25 MS. PANSELL: I just want to welcome

1 you and I wanted to know about the Accountability
2 Meeting. Is that for the public too, for the
3 community?

4 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Yes.

5 MS. PANNELL: Because I don't want to
6 come down there and they turn me back, you know.
7 I want to make sure we're -- okay.

8 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Asst. Chief, for
9 the record, the community is welcome at the
10 Accountability Meeting?

11 MS. PANNELL: Is this the one for the
12 community?

13 ASST. CHIEF JONES: I am sure, but I
14 will double check, get back with -- through the
15 Chair, to you, George, and let you know if this
16 one is open to the public.

17 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you for
18 that.

19 MS. PANNELL: So how am I going to find
20 out before Tuesday?

21 ASST. CHIEF JONES: If you can get a
22 phone number to me or staff, we'll have someone
23 contact you.

24 MS. PANNELL: Okay, thank you.

25 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,

1 Ms. Pannell. Are there other communications?

2 MR. SCOTT: Ron Scott, Detroit
3 Coalition Against Police Brutality. I am here to
4 present something, mention something that
5 happened oh, I guess it must have been about
6 eight or nine days ago and it was something that
7 I think is important and I think it's something
8 that should be considered in relationship to the
9 future in terms of how enforcement strategies are
10 initiated in relationship to the community.

11 And it's just sort of something that
12 came before us, the coalition, and we were able
13 to initiate it and so I think it deserves to be
14 placed on the record in terms of what happened.

15 I wanted to, first of all, make mention
16 of AC Eric Jones, we've gotten to know each other
17 fairly well over the years.

18 And one of the things that happened a
19 couple of weeks ago was there was a young man who
20 was trying to initiate a safe surrender, and as a
21 result of that contacted our office. He also
22 contacted -- they were trying to reach Jessica
23 Taylor, Commissioner Taylor, also but -- because
24 he had been in their program in prisons and I had
25 met many of the young men who were involved in

1 this when I spoke at Ryan Correctional Facility.

2 So they felt that it was a possibility
3 that we could initiate an interaction with the
4 police department which was less than
5 confrontational, less than potentially lethal and
6 damaging for the community.

7 This young man had been involved in a
8 situation where two deaths occurred and was a
9 person of interest at the time. We were able to
10 contact the family, contact legal counsel and
11 also contact under the direction of the AC
12 members of the department and between their
13 meeting and our office the members of the
14 department in one room and the family and the
15 attorney in the other room while we were talking
16 with the members of the department about the city
17 of Detroit, about pensions and football and
18 whatever else, they were talking about the safe
19 surrender aspects with this young man.

20 Short, needless to say what happened
21 was we were able to effect a safe surrender. The
22 young man was taken into custody, there was no
23 raid, nothing like that, and I just wanted to
24 mention that because I think the fact that we
25 were able to work successfully together on that

1 it sets a standard and a model on how we can do
2 that in the future.

3 Because I think it's in all of our
4 interests as we mention as we were talking, AC,
5 if you want to add, that our mission was to make
6 sure that both citizens who were involved and
7 persons of interest because, after all, they're
8 not guilty at that time, and officers who were
9 asked to go and to arrest individuals that
10 neither would meet with any unnecessary
11 confrontation, harm or debilitating aspects in
12 the community.

13 So I think that that is a framework
14 that we should investigate and look at more.
15 We're going to work to develop it and I just
16 wanted to put that on the record because I think
17 it's reflective of where the department needs to
18 consider going in the future. And I know some of
19 them, especially those of you who are retired
20 officers on the Board have been engaged not in
21 exactly that but in similar situations. Okay.

22 I didn't know if you wanted to say
23 anything through the chair.

24 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Through the Chair,
25 if I may, Mr. Scott is absolutely correct. We

1 had several conversations prior to meeting to
2 safely surrender the person that was implicated
3 in the crime. It shows the human side of police
4 officers. We did not have to initiate
5 apprehension efforts where we would go through it
6 in order to give the family of the victims
7 justice and knock on doors, get involved in
8 police chases.

9 Mr. Scott was able to arrange a safe
10 surrender. We sat in the other room, we had
11 conversations. Mr. Scott came back to the other
12 room said okay, we can go ahead. The attorney
13 was there and the gentleman was processed and
14 it's being handled properly, no one was hurt, it
15 was marvelous.

16 MR. SCOTT: And I might add that the
17 family had a prayer circle at the end for the
18 family and I think some of the officers was sort
19 of not immediately in it and they invited the
20 officers and the members of the department to
21 join the circle.

22 So I didn't -- you know, at least
23 wanted to promote that, to hype that, because
24 it's a very private thing, but I think it just
25 emphasized we're all one community and that's

1 what we need to try to move to do more of.

2 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Certainly,
3 Mr. Scott, we certainly thank you again for that
4 integral part in working with the Detroit Police
5 Department and that is something that probably
6 could be infectious if we were able to share that
7 message about the success of that because I do
8 believe many families are wondering how they can
9 successfully find their way through this process,
10 so I appreciate your leadership.

11 Other comments?

12 MR. SCOTT: I should add -- I don't
13 want to belabor the time, but I do want to say
14 this, that the young man in question has felt
15 very saddened about what happened and intimated
16 to me that he has not slept since this happened
17 and hopes that in the future there can even be
18 reconciliation with the families of the two
19 individuals who were killed, so that's --

20 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you.
21 Mr. Crawford?

22 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Yes, sir.
23 Through the Chair, I just want to say, Ron, you
24 know, we go back years of history and I want to
25 thank you for that because that's the ultimate

1 ending, community and police working together and
2 the police and the community working together
3 such as what you've just stated.

4 And all my years something like that,
5 we're moving to a difference level and it's
6 really appreciated.

7 MR. SCOTT: Right, but I really just
8 want to extend a note of thanks to the AC that he
9 represents some values that I think should be
10 reflected in the development of this department,
11 so --

12 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Thank you.

13 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Other comments?
14 Other comments? Good afternoon.

15 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon to the
16 Commission. You look good up there.

17 I'm late because I was at another
18 meeting, but I do want to let the Commission know
19 that there is an Advisory Board that the Chief
20 had established and we're doing very good, we're
21 going to be communicating with your Board and let
22 you know what we're doing and how far we're
23 coming in regards to crime and other problems
24 that we have that's encountered in our city.

25 Also, before I forget, I would like for

1 you to know that Mr. George Anthony was chosen to
2 be the president of the NOBLE Association.

3 Most of you know what NOBLE consists
4 of. He's so bashful. And I was invited to his
5 affair and it was just wonderful and we had quite
6 a few of the officers that had retired.

7 Chief Tolbert came all the way from
8 Flint and he was given a commendation and so
9 forth and I was quite proud of George. Met his
10 parents and just beautiful people, so those that
11 are not in the NOBLE, I suggest that you would
12 join the NOBLE Police Association because it's a
13 good organization and I think they're going to do
14 quite a bit of activities as far as the police is
15 concerned because right now they got a good
16 president. And until he does otherwise I think
17 that they're going to progress real good.

18 And as far as the Commission is
19 concerned, Police Commission is concerned, we're
20 going to need your cooperation in combining the
21 efforts of what we're going to be doing also.

22 So I think it's going to be a good year
23 for Detroit. Also as most of you know, the
24 Vice-President is in town, so if you don't get a
25 chance to see him he's looking forward to helping

1 this city without us begging him. I understand
2 he's going to give us quite a few help as far as
3 finances is concerned.

4 And again, I just want to let you know
5 you good look sitting up there and I'm very proud
6 of you and you, Mr. Burton, I'm proud to see you
7 today and that everything is going to be all
8 right with you.

9 And I don't know where Jessica is, but
10 anyway I'm sure she's busy doing something so
11 again, you take care and we're going to really
12 look forward to helping you out and you helping
13 the Chief's Advisory Committee. I thank you.

14 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
15 Ms. Smith. Are there other communications, other
16 communications, other communications?

17 Seeing none, we will close that portion
18 of our agenda. I want to echo a couple of
19 sentiments that have been said. Certainly I
20 wanted to note the presence of Commissioner
21 Burden who was not seated with us at our previous
22 meeting, but we are glad to see Commissioner
23 Burton with us today for this meeting and for
24 meetings going forward and we look forward to
25 participation, Brother Burton.

1 Thanks for being with us here today and
2 certainly to Executive Secretary Anthony, I'll
3 express on behalf of other Commissioners when I
4 say we wish you well in your endeavors as
5 president, and I certainly agree that they have
6 elected a truly visionary and prudent president
7 to serve them well as they move forward, so
8 congratulations.

9 At this time, please be reminded again
10 the next meeting for the Board of Police
11 Commissioners will be next Thursday, January 23
12 at 3 PM here at Detroit Public Safety
13 Headquarters.

14 At this time a motion for -- I'm sorry,
15 Commissioner Crawford.

16 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Yes, sir.
17 Through the Chair, I had some comments or
18 questions for the Asst. Chief pertaining to the
19 incident involving Councilmember George
20 Cushingberry.

21 Now, at this time I do realize, Asst.
22 Chief, that this is under investigation and I
23 don't know if you all have hired the Detroit News
24 reporter George Hunter yet. I don't think he
25 works for you, but there's more information and I

1 do await the completion of the investigation
2 as to what happened out there.

3 The question I had in reference to
4 training and training update, has there been any
5 teletype issued or any sort of training bulletin
6 update in terms of how to handle medical
7 marijuana in the transportation of a vehicle by
8 an individual, be it driver or passenger since
9 this incident has occurred?

10 ASST. CHIEF JONES: I wouldn't say
11 since the incident occurred, but there is a
12 component of training in our legal training
13 during our 40-hour block, in-service training.

14 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Because the
15 state law changed, it took effect January 1st,
16 the new -- in terms of this policy of how it's
17 supposed to be transported and it's supposed to
18 be in a container in the trunk of the vehicle.

19 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Correct.

20 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: So I just
21 wanted to know if that has been done, whether or
22 not it's being read at roll calls or something to
23 that effect since this has occurred as a reminder
24 to the officers on how they --

25 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Not since this has

1 occurred, no, sir.

2 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: That was one
3 question. And that state law is Public Act 460
4 and it speaks to that, how it's supposed to be
5 transported.

6 Also I want to thank the Executive
7 Secretary for the department manual on CD. It's
8 very important. I was able to look up some of
9 the series that pertained to supervisors and
10 arrests, etc as a refresher for myself and all
11 the Commissioners have one now and I mean it's
12 something that's great to reference.

13 And recently we received some e-mails
14 from the Secretary in terms of some updates that
15 were recently placed out there for the manual.

16 I know the alleged going back and forth
17 about DWB versus special treatment and my opinion
18 there shouldn't and there isn't that I know of
19 any political immunity.

20 Those who are elected to office
21 shouldn't have any -- don't have any sort of
22 immunity when stopped by the police. I hope
23 there's no one on the Board that owes any
24 tickets; I don't, or anything of that nature.

25 And if you have anything in your

1 background, you should clear that up -- I'm just
2 joking about that. But there -- and I really
3 look forward to completion of this investigation
4 because in terms of morale of the officers and
5 those of us that have been officers know this and
6 particularly those of you who are in positions
7 now who've come up through the ranks, one of the
8 greatest things that can affect morale is when
9 someone changes a decision that's made and for
10 whatever reason, by your officers on the street
11 to arrest or not to arrest or whatever happened
12 out there, and also that being said, whether
13 someone wants to allege special treatment, the
14 other side wants to say it was DWB.

15 Then there's this notion or this
16 statement that well, the city is 80 percent
17 black, there's a predominantly black police
18 department, maybe 60 percent now, 70 percent, I
19 don't know the exact numbers. DWB can occur in
20 the city of Detroit that's 80 percent -- yes, it
21 can.

22 We're talking about a system here.
23 We're not talking about individuals, we're
24 talking about a system, a criminal justice
25 system. We're talking about a war on drugs

1 that's still going on. It was really a war on
2 African-American males. We're talking about
3 individuals being arrested, tried, sentencing
4 differences. African-Americans get more,
5 sentenced to more time for the same crime and
6 others getting less.

7 So this whole notion of -- or this
8 whole -- I don't know, this propaganda that
9 driving while black can't occur in a
10 predominantly black city by a predominantly black
11 police department, we're talking about a system
12 here, a criminal justice system, in some cases a
13 criminal injustice system when it comes to
14 African-Americans.

15 I just wanted to make that statement
16 because sometimes I often hear that statement
17 that we as African-Americans being a
18 predominantly African-American city,
19 predominantly African-American police department,
20 racial profiling can occur, and not only in the
21 city of Detroit, but across the country and we
22 know what has happened in New York with the cases
23 of racial profiling and stop and frisk.

24 So I really look forward to the
25 investigation, the results of it, and, you know,

1 DWB or driving while council DWC, whatever it is,
2 may the chips fall where they may.

3 Thank you.

4 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
5 Commissioner Crawford. You bring up a couple of
6 interesting points and just for a point of
7 clarity, Asst. Chief Jones, the investigation has
8 not concluded as of yet?

9 ASST. CHIEF JONES: It has not.

10 COMMISSIONER WHITE: And I guess we
11 would ask that a copy of the investigation could
12 be furnished to this body upon completion and
13 also as it relates to the policy referenced by
14 Commissioner Crawford of which officers are being
15 trained on, if you would also furnish that to
16 this body as well.

17 ASST. CHIEF JONES: Correct. I don't
18 think I said that there was a policy they were
19 being trained on as it relates to the new January
20 2014 law. However, I will ensure that that is
21 implemented.

22 COMMISSIONER WHITE: So you said
23 there's not a policy by which we handle --

24 ASST. CHIEF JONES: The question was --
25 excuse me, through the Chair, since the incident

1 has there been any training on the medical
2 marijuana and my answer to that question was no,
3 there has not been a training session as relates
4 to that.

5 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Okay. Any other
6 comments from the Commissioners at this time?

7 Seeing none, a motion for dismissal is
8 properly before us.

9 COMMISSIONER BELL: So moved.

10 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Second.

11 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Properly moved and
12 supported. Any discussion? Seeing none, all
13 those in favor?

14 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

15 COMMISSIONER WHITE: Opposed? Thank
16 you very much.
