5 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Good afternoon to
6 everyone. It's nice and cozy at Detroit Police
7 Headquarters. Let me welcome you to the Detroit Board
8 of Police Commissioners meeting, dated Thursday,
9 February 6.

10 My name is Commissioner Donnell White, I
11 have the pleasure of serving as your vice chairperson.

12 At this time I would ask if our madam
13 attorney would do the pleasure of a roll call and
14 introduction of our staff.

15 MS. SABREE: Good afternoon everyone. For
16 the record, Aliyah Sabree, attorney to the Board.

17 At this time I'll do roll call.

18 Chairperson Jessica Taylor?

19 Vice Chair Donnell White?

20 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Present.

21 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Richard Shelby?

22 COMMISSIONER SHELBY: Present.

23 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Wendell L. Byrd?

24 COMMISSIONER BYRD: Present.

25 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Reginald

1 Crawford?

2 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Present.

3 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Willie E. Bell?

4 Commission Willie E. Burton?

5 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Present.

6 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Lisa Carter?

7 COMMISSIONER CARTER: Present.

8 MS. SABREE: Commissioner Ricardo Moore?

9 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Present.

10 MS. SABREE: Mr. Vice Chair, we have a

11 quorum.

12 At this time I would like to introduce the
13 staff. As I stated, I'm standing in for Mr. George
14 Anthony, the secretary to the board. We also have
15 present today Pamela Davis-Drake, the Chief
16 Investigator; Gail Oxendine, Director Of Police
17 Personnel; Robert Brown, the Office Manager; and our
18 Recorder, we have Sergeant Alex Quinn, we also have
19 Karen Klerekoper as our Court Reporter, from Hanson
20 Court Reporting Services.

21 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
22 Counselor.

23 Certainly, we would like to note the
24 presence, on behalf of Chief James Craig, Assistant
25 Chief Jones, thank you for being with us, sir.

1 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: Thank you, sir.

2 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: We will hear
3 briefly in the agenda our report from the Chief's
4 office.

5 At this time I would like to invite forward
6 Chaplain Spence for the purpose of the invocation,
7 please.

8 (Invocation was presented at this time)

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
10 Chaplain Spence, and the entire chaplain corp for
11 continued support of our weekly meetings and bringing
12 forth invocation, and more importantly, coverage for
13 our men and women who serve this great city daily.

14 Colleagues, before us is a motion to
15 approve the agenda as presented. If there are no
16 additions to the agenda, a motion will be in order.

17 COMMISSIONER BYRD: So moved.

18 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Second.

19 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Properly moved and
20 supported. Any discussion?

21 (No response)

22 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Seeing none, all
23 those in favor aye?

24 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

25 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Opposed?

1 (No response)

2 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you very
3 much.

4 Also before us is approval of the minutes
5 dated January 30, 2014. A motion is in order.

6 COMMISSIONER BYRD: So moved.

7 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Second.

8 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Properly moved and
9 supported.

10 Any discussion?

11 Seeing none, all those in favor aye.

12 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

13 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Opposed?

14 (No response)

15 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you very
16 much.

17 Just for the record, our chairperson should
18 be joining us shortly. At that time we will have a
19 more formal chairperson's support.

20 At this time we will move forward with the
21 report from the Office of the Chief.

22 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: At this time we do
23 not have a report from the Chief's Office.

24 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
25 Assistant Chief.

1 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: You're welcome.

2 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Is there a
3 presentation from the Detroit Public Safety
4 Foundation?

5 Good afternoon.

6 DIRECTOR GOVAN: Good afternoon, I'm
7 Catherine Govan, I'm the Executive Director of the
8 Detroit Public Safety Foundation.

9 On behalf of our board of directors, we
10 really appreciate you taking the time to learn more
11 about what we do for our great police department.

12 The Detroit Public Safety Foundation
13 mission is to provide equipment, assets and services
14 to the police department that, that are not in the
15 budget of the City of Detroit at this time. We have
16 provided critical resources and vital support to the
17 police department, since the foundation started in
18 2011, we've done more than 75 million in federal
19 grants, that's for police and fire department, and
20 additional 1.5 million in new programs, training and
21 equipment needs.

22 So we feel that we've grown quite a bit in
23 just a couple years and have become pretty robust.
24 We're a nonprofit 501(c)(3) with internal revenue
25 designation and the donations that come in the

1 foundation do benefit both the police and fire
2 department. We have eight board members at this time,
3 including presence by the Chief of Police and the Fire
4 Commissioner, and we are going to be adding more by
5 the end of this quarter.

6 In 2013 we were pretty busy, we, the cars
7 and ambulances that were presented to the city, we
8 were part of that, where we identified the needs of
9 the police department and the fire department, and put
10 together a presentation that was then brought to the
11 corporate entity and they chose to come to the table
12 by purchasing the 100 police vehicles and 23
13 ambulances.

14 We've also secured grant for executive
15 training in the police department, the two new dogs,
16 Molly and Mace, for the Canine Unit, you know, I'm
17 trying to go just through the police here, and new
18 equipment for the bomb squad, secured grant to
19 purchase driving simulators for the team traffic
20 safety classes, secured Dr. George Kelling to train,
21 from the police department and neighborhoods, the
22 broken windows, techniques, this was used in several
23 test neighborhoods bringing home invasions down by 28
24 percent in those areas, also provided comp stat
25 training, and other crime strategies have help the DPD

1 hone in on problem areas resulting in several
2 successful police raids. We continue to supply the
3 Mounted Police Division.

4 We provide resources to the police
5 department to conduct dozens of community outreach
6 programs and meetings and we started the signature
7 event in 2013 Above and Beyond Award ceremony, which
8 recognized 43 police officers and it was a big boost
9 for them and their families.

10 We had three signature events this year,
11 the first one is Women in Blue, and the money raised
12 for this will go to programs in the police department
13 that work with women and children, such as domestic
14 abuse, child abuse, rape prevention, stop the
15 bullying, anything that has to do with women and
16 children, the funding will go towards this.

17 In mid-July at Cobo we're going to be doing
18 a one-day public safety forum, and this is to try to
19 get all the different entities on the same page in
20 terms of what's going on in our streets so that we're
21 basically saying we've had enough, this is what we
22 want to do, and taking best practices from around the
23 country. We'll have national and local speakers
24 coming in and these are the areas that we're going to
25 be targeting in terms of the audience.

1 On December 3rd at Cobo we'll be doing the
2 2014 Above and Beyond Awards Ceremony. Last year we
3 had 600 people, that's really, really good for a
4 first-time event, I don't know, how many of you go to
5 events a lot, but that's extraordinary, so we expect
6 probably 7 to 800 this year, so we're pretty excited,
7 and as you can see, these are the donors that came to
8 the table last year, so this is extraordinary, too.
9 We're getting a lot of folks coming on board, we're
10 tightening up our branding so that people understand
11 that this is an organization that is out there to help
12 the police department, and I believe that as we become
13 more robust, that it's just going to get better and
14 better.

15 Questions?

16 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
17 Director Govan.

18 Are there questions?

19 DIRECTOR GOVAN: Letting me off easy?

20 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: I would offer a
21 question, Madam Director, I see you are listed as
22 501(c)(3) and soliciting funds on behalf of the police
23 department, as well as the fire department. The
24 connection, does it get approved through city counsel
25 or the actual grants that are submitted, is that just

1 through your office directly to different foundations
2 and funders or is it in concert with another entity?

3 DIRECTOR GOVAN: Great question. Federal
4 grants and state grants that are grant writers that
5 write go directly to the city, okay. Grants that come
6 in that are private come directly to our foundation
7 and then we present a letter to City Council to accept
8 the gift.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: So federal grants
10 go directly, you say to the city, so is that City
11 Council?

12 DIRECTOR GOVAN: I believe it would go to
13 the department that would be charged with distributing
14 the grant money.

15 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Okay.

16 DIRECTOR GOVAN: Whether it be the police
17 department or another entity.

18 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Any other
19 questions, Colleagues?

20 I see none, thank you very much.

21 DIRECTOR GOVAN: Thank you, I look forward
22 to working with you.

23 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Assistant Chief,
24 just as a follow-up, do we still have an internal
25 group that manages grants?

1 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: Yes, grants and
2 contracts.

3 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you. Who is
4 commanding that effort?

5 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: That would be
6 Director Bridget Odroski.

7 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thanks.

8 Anything further, Assistant Chief, before
9 we move on?

10 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: No, sir.

11 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Colleagues, there
12 is no standing committee reports before us at this
13 time.

14 Is there any new business?

15 Seeing none, any old business?

16 Commissioner Burton?

17 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Yes, I would like to
18 motion for the board to do a resolution for Reverend
19 Joe Jordan, as well as possibly if we can all do a
20 moment of silence in his honor.

21 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Let us start with
22 acknowledging Pastor Reverend Joe Jordan with a moment
23 of silence.

24 (Moment of Silence)

25 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, and

1 Colleagues, before us is a motion for a resolution
2 from this body honoring the life and work of Reverend
3 Joseph Jordan, is there support?

4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Support.

5 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Properly moved and
6 supported.

7 Any discussion?

8 Seeing none, all those in favor aye?

9 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

10 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Opposed?

11 (No response)

12 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you very
13 much.

14 Counselor, if you could, in concert with
15 Executive Secretary Anthony upon his return, complete
16 that resolution that we may properly vote that into
17 the record at a later date.

18 MS. SABREE: Absolutely.

19 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you.

20 Also, Colleagues, under old business in our
21 previous meeting we were approached by the family of a
22 missing person, although we won't be discussing the
23 details on the record as this investigation is still
24 underway, I did want the record to reflect and express
25 appreciation to the chief's office for the follow-up

1 in getting this information back to this body, and if
2 you could keep us apprised as the information
3 continues to unfold, we will be greatly appreciative.

4 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: Thank you very
5 much.

6 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Any other old
7 business?

8 Seeing none, under Announcements, please be
9 reminded our next meeting will be held Thursday,
10 February 13, 2014, at 6:30 p.m. We will be in the 9th
11 Precinct, at Samaritan Center, located at 5555 Conner,
12 in Detroit, Michigan, 48213.

13 Also, as an announcement calling all
14 seniors, the SALT Conference, Seniors And Law
15 Enforcement, together hosted by Detroit Chief of
16 Police James E. Craig will be held at the St.
17 Patrick's Senior Center, at 58 Parsons, Detroit,
18 Michigan, 48201. It would be held on February the
19 18th from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

20 The conference is designed to identify
21 concerns of senior citizens to increase and improve
22 senior crime prevention and education, allow
23 interactive training, and also attendees will be
24 eligible to receive free prizes and give-aways.

25 I believe we may have some fliers if anyone

1 wishes to have additional information following the
2 meeting.

3 At this time we open up the floor for oral
4 communications from the audience. If you wish to
5 address this body, we ask that you come forward for
6 the purpose of record, please state and spell your
7 name, and also please be mindful of the allotted
8 two-minute time period that everyone may have time to
9 address the board.

10 MR. WELLBOURNE: Good afternoon, Board, my
11 name is Bill Wellborne, W-e-l-l-b-o-r-n-e, I'm the
12 President of Detroit City Wide Police Public
13 Relations.

14 Last week I was here talking about the
15 awards ceremony that we had and that we didn't have
16 any women on the list that I got. But I was going to
17 let the board know that we did have the ceremony last
18 night, and they did have three, four women that they
19 had added to the board, but I'm still mad about it,
20 though, because it shouldn't happen in the first
21 place, but I do want to let the board know that, the
22 Chief heard me talk about this, and he took action,
23 and I'm glad of that, and made sure some were women on
24 the board, like I said, from now if I get a list of no
25 women on the board, I'll return it, I will not accept

1 it at all. Thank you.

2 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
3 Mr. Wellborne, and I think we all heard you loud and
4 clear at the last meeting, I'm sure they're happy to
5 receive your energy.

6 Yes, sir, Mr. Crawford?

7 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Mr. Wellborne, we
8 want to thank you for your activism last week before
9 the board and as a result of the impact of the
10 activism, I'm sure that's why there was some changes
11 that occurred. Thank you, sir.

12 MR. WELLBOURNE: Thank you.

13 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you.

14 Good afternoon, sir.

15 MR. HUGHES: Good afternoon, my name is
16 Demarcus Hughes. I came last week to voice my
17 complaints in regards to the service that I received
18 from the Detroit Police Department in regards to never
19 showing up to my home.

20 And then it was an investigation that went
21 on, I think Chief of Police, I mean, chief operation,
22 I can't remember, and I came here for some answers
23 because I was, the truth was misrepresented, so I came
24 here for some answers, I was informed that someone
25 would contact me on Friday. I also was informed that

1 someone would contact me on Monday. I called and no
2 one returned my phone call. If we're going to move
3 forward in the right direction for the police
4 department and citizens to be on the same page, I
5 believe that we have to work together and be honest
6 with each other, and I feel once again the honesty
7 have not been set or actually been displayed on the
8 police department's behalf.

9 I want to believe in the Detroit Police
10 Department because I lived here all my life, why to be
11 dealt with or talked to or treated with respect as a
12 human being in the City of Detroit.

13 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Certainly,
14 Mr. Hughes, before you step away, certainly, that is a
15 respectable request that you are communicating
16 effectively. I do applaud your steadfastness for
17 returning to ensure that the process is underway.

18 I do know there are two different tracks,
19 if you will, I believe one was going to follow up with
20 me from the Chief's Office, and I also believe you
21 spoke to our Officer Chief Investigator, so if you
22 would allow Chief Investigator Drake to come forward
23 for the update, you might be able to glean some
24 additional information.

25 MR. HUGHES: Thank you very much.

1 CHIEF INVESTIGATOR DRAKE: I apologize, I
2 had a death in the family so I've been off for a
3 couple of days, I wasn't able to get back with him
4 Monday, but I will follow up and get back with you
5 tomorrow, promise.

6 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you,
7 Mr. Hughes, we'll be certain to follow up with you.

8 MR. HUGHES: Thank you.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Are there any
10 other comments?

11 CAPTAIN ROCHET: Hi, good afternoon, I'm
12 Captain Rochet, Chief Neighborhood Liaison Office.

13 On Friday we had a community crime walk
14 over in the 7th precinct, which was attended by
15 Commission Willie Burton and Commissioner Lisa Carter.

16 I just wanted to go on the record and thank
17 them for their input and looking forward to having a
18 long sustainable relationship with the board.

19 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Certainly, thank
20 you.

21 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Would any
22 Commissioners like to weigh in on the experience?

23 COMMISSIONER CARTER: It was cold.

24 MS. ROMANO: Anna Romano, the 7th and 11th
25 Precincts, Seasoned Seniors Valentine's Day Luncheon

1 and Dance, February 14th from 11:00 a.m. to 3 p.m.,
2 everyone is welcome, it is at 18651 Mound Avenue,
3 Detroit, between Seven Mile and Nevada. I hope
4 everyone could make it.

5 If you could get the information out to the
6 citizens here, if they get information out to the
7 seniors and the district and the precincts, we'd
8 appreciate it.

9 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Ms. Romano, could
10 you read that date and time again.

11 MS. ROMANO: February 14 from 11:00 a.m. to
12 3 p.m.

13 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Address, please?

14 MS. ROMANO: 18651 Mound Round, between
15 Seven Mile and East Nevada.

16 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you.

17 MS. ROMANO: Thank you.

18 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Are there other
19 communications?

20 MS. NORRIS: Hello, my name is Kelly
21 Norris. I came and spoke with you three times before.
22 I filed complaints with some officers in my brother's
23 homicide in 2011. I submitted complaints against the
24 officers Internal Affairs here with Commissioners and
25 with you guys saying that my evidence was

1 untrustworthy, basically calling me a liar. I
2 received the FOIA of the information. I have the
3 proof that the officers did not tell the truth, they
4 accused my brother of having a weapon when the shooter
5 says he didn't have a weapon, I didn't see it, I just
6 heard some shots.

7 Where were you when you heard the shot?

8 I was in my car.

9 My brother did not shoot at him.

10 My brother's prints are not on the
11 so-called gun that was filed. The man lied to the
12 police, he tampered with the crime scene.

13 I have the proof in the FOIA, I tried to
14 come back and file a complaint after I got the FOIA
15 with the Internal Affairs again, I was deferred away.

16 I spoke with Captain Rochet in November.
17 He said he sent the information to homicide, with
18 which they deemed it appropriate to reinvestigate.
19 After that, I've been waiting for three months to hear
20 anything.

21 My father and I's concern was that the same
22 officers would not be involved in the same
23 investigation. Come to find out, they gave the
24 investigation back to the same officer that refuses to
25 reinvestigate it.

1 It's going on three years, this man is
2 walking the streets, he shot at my brother 14 times,
3 he hit him in the back 4 times and said it was
4 self-defense. I don't know what's going on, I know we
5 got a new Chief, I wrote letters to the Chief, I have
6 e-mailed him to try to get somebody to sit down, look
7 at this information and go after these police
8 officers.

9 You can't say if a person tells you I
10 didn't see him with a gun, he did not shoot at me, you
11 cannot -- you should not write in your arrest warrant
12 that the victim was in possession of a stolen weapon.
13 I don't know police procedure but that just seems to
14 me not to be right, and also to say in his report,
15 that Paul Jones and Tyrone Birch exchanged gunfire
16 when Paul Jones clearly wrote in his witness
17 statement, I didn't see him with a gun.

18 Now, I don't understand why police officers
19 write that, I didn't think you can make assumptions.

20 Oh, well, Ms. Norris, there was two people
21 in the alley, your brother and two guns, it had to be
22 your brother's gun.

23 His prints weren't on the gun.

24 We're going to assume it was his because it
25 was by his body.

1 His body was moved before investigators got
2 there, they measured the gun from a couple of blood
3 stains that was on the gun.

4 Now, all our family ever really wanted was
5 for somebody to sit down, the officer in charge, to
6 sit down and explain to us how he came to these
7 conclusions.

8 Detective Olson will not return my calls or
9 my family's calls, Internal Affairs, like I said, I
10 have the letters here, and from the Commission,
11 because I told, I complained that Detective Olson
12 allowed Paul Jones to lie and to tamper with the crime
13 scene without informing it to the prosecutor's office.

14 He told the police when he first got, when
15 the police arrived on the scene, he said, oh, that guy
16 was in the alley with the gun and Ever Fresh bottle
17 and he shot at me twice, and I returned fire, and then
18 when he gets in the office he said, you know what, I
19 just heard some shots, I was sitting in my car, I got
20 out.

21 He was running toward me, I feared for my
22 life.

23 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Ms. Norris, not to
24 cut you off, but I heard you say you spoke with
25 Captain Rochet.

1 MS. NORRIS: Yes.

2 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Did you file a
3 complaint with the officer, chief of --

4 MS. NORRIS: Yes, two, three times.

5 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: And you did
6 receive a finding back?

7 MS. NORRIS: Yes.

8 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: If you have
9 questions specifically as it relates to the findings
10 you received back from the officer, I would be happy
11 to speak with you more directly but at this time,
12 Assistant Chief Jones, I don't know if, through the
13 chief's office, if Captain Rochet, or where this
14 investigation is, if you care to comment, or any other
15 insight or assistance that you can offer Ms. Norris,
16 I'm certain it would be greatly appreciated.

17 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: Sure, I would like
18 to get the information, and Deputy Chief LaValley here
19 is in charge of our criminal investigations, and have
20 him review the case and sit down and have a meeting
21 with you to discuss our findings, and generally in
22 these cases refer our investigation over to the
23 prosecutor's office, and they make the ultimate
24 decision, so please allow some time to review the case
25 and get back to you so we can sit down and explain the

1 steps we took during our investigation.

2 MS. NORRIS: Okay. I understand and I
3 appreciate that. It's been three years that I've been
4 waiting for somebody to come back. I've talked to
5 over 30 people with Internal Affairs, the
6 Commissioners and also Homicide, everybody keeps
7 passing the buck, it's time for that to stop.

8 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: I understand those
9 three years I was not aware of it, I never had a
10 conversation with you. I'm sure Deputy Chief LaValley
11 never had a conversation with you.

12 Again, I humbly ask you to give us an
13 opportunity to review the case and to have a
14 conversation with you so we can discuss the details as
15 much as we can with you.

16 MS. NORRIS: What would you like from me?

17 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: I would like for
18 you to step aside and talk to Deputy Chief LaValley,
19 give him the information and allow him the opportunity
20 to review the case.

21 MS. NORRIS: Thank you.

22 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: You're welcome.

23 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you.

24 If we ask that you provide an update at the
25 next meeting, we might have the particulars as it

1 relates to Ms. Norris' situation.

2 ASSISTANT CHIEF JONES: Yes, sir, I'll make
3 that happen.

4 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Are there other
5 comments?

6 Are there other comments?

7 Are there other comments?

8 Seeing none, again, please be reminded --

9 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon, Bernice Smith,
10 political activist.

11 This morning the Chief was a guest at
12 O'Shea's, was a guest on our program this morning, did
13 a marvelous job.

14 I want to report to the Commission there
15 was so many people that were calling him and praising
16 the police department and what they were doing and
17 they were glad that the Chief was involved with all
18 the crimes that we have been perpetrating in this
19 city, and even some of the criminals telling them
20 they're glad to see him, but in the meantime, I do
21 wish that when Detroiters come before this Commission
22 that we would try to do a little more in effort to
23 help them so they won't have to wait this long period,
24 three years is too long to wait, we should help them
25 and do more for the citizens here in the city. I have

1 no problem with the police as long as they do the
2 right thing, but when you're lax in some cases I think
3 it's necessary for you to really get behind the cases
4 and help the people so they won't have the worry and
5 frustration by coming here today and reporting to you
6 in regards to what their situation is.

7 Also, Commissioner Burton, you made the
8 announcement about the Reverend but you didn't make
9 the announcement of his service. Was there one
10 available for the people to know?

11 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Yes, I have to get
12 that information before the Board.

13 MS. SMITH: Well, I'll get it today anyway
14 but I didn't know whether you were aware of the
15 service, because I do know it was announced Monday,
16 and also, I'm very upset about the Council, of course
17 you don't have anything to do with it, but I want you
18 guys to know that the City Council needs a little more
19 effort behind them, and we need someone like the
20 Police Chief to be in there behind, in other words,
21 because they are really messing up, giving the city
22 away, but I'm not going to go into that, but I just
23 want you to realize what's going on with your city,
24 and what's going to happen to your city if you do not
25 read and investigate, just like you do crime. You got

1 to investigate what's going on here, and I love living
2 in Midtown, but as far as them giving it away, a lot
3 of people who had their property boarded up in that
4 particular area that they wanted, I don't know whether
5 you're aware of it, they were giving \$4 million, and I
6 got proof, \$4 million, but yet still the organization
7 will not and refuses not to pay their taxes, such as,
8 for instance, Joe Lewis Arena. Now, are we supposed
9 to continue to let this perpetrate into our city and
10 not do anything about it? Nobody is talking about it,
11 nobody is raising the issue and it's sad, it's really
12 sad.

13 You men here, you have strength, you know
14 you have knowledge, so I feel as though some of you
15 should get out there and say something about it, I
16 really do, and go to their meetings, I'm through, just
17 frustrated this week, I really am, and I'm proud of
18 the police department, I am, because people do
19 appreciate what you're doing, and every time you look
20 up you're in the paper because your doing this, doing
21 that and the thieves are really scared what's going
22 on. I heard people say, I wish they'd come in our
23 neighborhood, so continue to do a good job, and some
24 of you got to sit up here and ask some questions
25 sometimes.

1 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you, Ms.
2 Smith.

3 MS. SMITH: No kind of questions to ask the
4 public.

5 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Thank you for your
6 time.

7 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Anyone in --

8 MS. SMITH: Excuse me?

9 COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: -- I'm just being
10 facetious.

11 MS. SMITH: I know you are, that's why I
12 love you.

13 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Any other
14 comments?

15 Any other comments?

16 Again, please be reminded our next meeting
17 next Thursday, it will be an evening meeting in the
18 9th District. Again, it's at the Samaritan Center,
19 5555 Conner, Detroit, Michigan, 48213.

20 There's no further business before us, at
21 this time a motion for adjournment is in order.

22 COMMISSIONER MOORE: So moved.

23 VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: There's support,
24 properly moved and supported.

25 Any discussion?

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Seeing none, all those in favor, aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Opposed.

(No response)

VICE CHAIRPERSON WHITE: Drive safely, see
you next week.
