The City of Detroit is progressing in carrying out its 5-year Consolidated Plan strategy and is implementing action plan projects that support it. For an example, the Blight removal and Demolition strategy, although the focus was shifted towards using CDBG funds for commercial structures, however, other city funding sources will be used for residential properties. The goal could not be achieved without the department's collaborating efforts working with the Detroit Building Authority and the City's Building Safety and Environmental Engineering Department (BSEED).

The Department was granted approval to extend housing affordability with existing HOME developers and borrowers. Some of these projects were nearing the end of their respective affordability periods, and are no longer able to keep pace with increasing overhead costs to make required repairs. Through negotiated partial loan payoffs and loan modifications, the City was able to keep these projects on-going to completion.

There were also major housing rehabilitation programs implemented throughout the city using a loan program and grants to stabilized neighborhoods. Throughout the year, several new initiatives such as the auction of publicly-owned residential properties, sale of vacant lots, aggressive code enforcement and an expansive demolition effort also helped stabilize neighborhoods.

In partnership with the Detroit Economic Development Corporation, the City's Economic business development called the Motor City Match program celebrated over two years of help for new or expanding Detroit neighborhood businesses, leveraging \$24 million in total new neighborhood business investments. In all, 763 entrepreneurs have received some form of assistance and 78% are minority owned. At the end of the fiscal year there were 25 new businesses opened and another 48 under construction or soon to be under construction. The program used a variety of approaches and tools to attract new small business investments, retained and expanded existing small businesses and improve the physical environment along commercial corridors.

Detroit Employment Solutions Corporation (DESC) provided job placement and training services to 23,000 jobseekers and 1,500 businesses this past year. Through partnerships with community-based and faith-based organizations, foundations and many others, DESC provided employers

with access to the broadest talent pool in Detroit jobseekers with the widest range of job-related services.

The City has invested \$1.75 million on the Summer Youth Jobs training program in partnership with private businesses and nonprofit organizations. The program is designed to help employ youth in the City's NRSA areas. The activity will not affect the 15 percent cap on public services because of the NRSA designation. The program will provide job training, skill building, and employment opportunities for "at risk" and low-income youth to help them gain valuable workplace experience. CDBG funds were leveraged with a corporate match.

The city expended CDBG-DDR funds on several projects with the goals of supporting resiliency and mitigating future flood hazards. There were two large neighborhood planning studies completed, one in northwest Detroit and one on the lower eastside. The planning studies focused on increasing community resiliency through improved public infrastructure, economic development, and neighborhood amenities, with a focus on flood mitigation and seeking opportunities for green stormwater infrastructure. These studies included community outreach and varying degrees of pre-development work on three new public greenways.

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is a principal revenue source for the City to address the needs of low, and low-moderate income citizens and neighborhoods. Our Five Year Goals for housing, public services, and development activities (including public

facility rehabilitation, and economic development) were designed to address the overwhelming need in the City of Detroit. While we remain optimistic, the goals set in 2015-2019 require resetting. In many instances the needs within the City of Detroit are far greater than the available resources. Our overall priority, this past year, was to help low and moderate income Detroiters access housing, rehab housing public service and the economic opportunities afforded to all citizens country wide. Shown below are the priority categories funding objectivies:

- Housing priorities include: 0% interest loan housing rehabilitation program, Emergency Home Repair for low/moderate income grant program for home owners, and those with special needs (including the elderly).
- Public Service priorities include the following services: homeless, disabled, transportation, substance abuse, employment training, health, elderly, and youth.
- Public Facility Rehabilitation (PFR) priorities include: neighborhood, park/recreation, youth, senior and health facilities.
- Infrastructure priorities include: increase community resiliency through improved public infrastructure, with a focus on flood mitigation and impoved public greenways for existing paths through parks in areas in the city (CDBG-DDR).
- Economic Development priorities include: direct financial assistance for small businesses, technical assistance, and other economic development activities to businesses.
- Demolition priorities included: demolition of dangerous, abandoned, vandalized structures and boarding of structures to prevent trespass prior to demolition with the priority focus on large commercial buildings. However the city will continue to demolish residential

structures using other non CDBG funding sources.

Narrative

The 2016-2017 CDBG allocation was \$31,372,385. The amount expended was \$39,331,964.61 for the fiscal year of 2016-2017. The expended amount includes prior year awards as well, to expedite spending to meet the annual 1.5 spending requirement.

The 2016-2017 HOME allocation was \$4,752,103. The amount expended was \$8,329,988.66. The 2016-2017 expenditure includes prior year awards for multi-year HOME projects.

The 2016-2017 HOPWA allocation was **\$2,695,671**. The amount expended was **\$2,332,825.87**. HOPWA expenditures are slightly lower than the actual allocation.

The 2016-2017 ESG allocation was \$2,838,335. However, the amount expended thus far was \$2,065,227.69. Even though the expenditure is less than the allocation, the expenditure has been fully obligated through contracts.

Narrative

The Housing & Revitalization Department plays a vital role in pursuing and supporting neighborhood investment. Through Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas (NRSA), the City of Detroit uses CDBG funds to address economic development and housing needs in designated neighborhoods. The City of Detroit NRSA plan seeks to focus investment in five areas, leveraging partnerships to implement initiatives around five goals: 1) stabilize neighborhoods; 2) support small businesses; 3) create jobs; 4) create summer youth employment; and 5) build wealth. The following is a description of the five NRSAs within the City of Detroit:

NRSA 1

Located between Jefferson Avenue and the Detroit River on the far-east side of Detroit. NRSA1 have a large number of vacant housing and vacant parcels that threatens stability. This NRSA have neighborhoods such as West Village, Jefferson Village, Jefferson-Chalmers and Marina district.

NRSA 2

Located on the City's Northeast side. NRSA2 have high levels of mortgage foreclosure that has led to an increase of abandonment and tax foreclosure. This NRSA have neighborhoods such as, Osborn, City Airport, Morning Side, Regent Park, East English Village, and East Warren Avenue commercial area.

NRSA 3

Located in the Southwest Detroit target area. NRSA3 have a strong resident Hispanic community that is significantly investing in the housing market as well as the commercial district. The historic neighborhoods included in NRSA3 are Corktown, Hubbard Farms, and Woodbridge. Other neighbors are Springwells Village, and Mexicantown. The NRSA3 commercial districts include Vernor Highway and Michigan Avenue.

NRSA 4

Located within several historic neighborhoods such as the Boston Edison District, New Center and Arden Park. It also have neighborhoods including Hope Village, Dexter-Linwood, and Northend that have high vacancy rates, a concentration of City owned properties and significant tax and mortgage foreclosures. NRSA4 contains commercial districts, such as, McNichols and New Center. The McNichols commercial corridor is characterized by low-density service related business.

NRSA 5

Located on the Northwest side of Detroit. This NRSA includes areas surrounding the historic neighborhood of Grandmont-Rosedale, and Brightmoor neighborhood. There is a significant decline in population in the Brightmoor community. This NRSA area is surrounded by distressed housing markets with a considerable amount of publically-owned parcels and tax foreclosures.

Slum and Blight Area

Zero Percent Home Repair Loan Program

The Detroit 0% Interest Home Repair Loan Program is designed to help homeowners address health and safety issues, complete home repairs or improvements, and eliminate blight. Low-moderate income Detroit homeowners can qualify based on income or if living in an eligible slum and blight, or NRSA designated area. The income limit for NRSA can exceed 80% AMI and income limit for slum/blight area is up to 80% AMI. There are three (3) designated slums and blight target areas within the City of Detroit. Approved homeowners have ten years to pay back their loans, which are provided at 0% interest. The homeowners pay back only what they borrow. This home repair program is a city-led partnership with the Detroit Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) and Bank of America. This partnership is a public-private commitment focused on revitalizing Detroit's neighborhoods.

Leveraging

The following additional leveraging resources enables the City to complete projects that will revitalize neighborhoods, expand affordable housing opportunities, to improve community facilities and public services.

Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program (LIHTC) - The LIHTC is an investment program to increase and preserve affordable rental housing by replacing earlier tax incentives with a credit directly applicable against taxable income. The following six housing projects received LIHTC during FY 2016-2017: Himelhoch Apartments, \$ 385,504.00; Saint Rita Apartments, \$511,298.00; Brush Park South, \$1,462,990.00; The Peterboro Arms, \$1,050,000.00; Roberts III Apartments, \$1,179,424.00; Ryan Court Apartments-Phase II, \$721,569.00. Section 108 Loan **Program** - Section 108 is the loan guarantee provision of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The Section 108 loan guarantee program allows local government to transform a small portion of their CDBG funds into federally guaranteed loans large enough to pursue physical and economic revitalization projects capable of renewing entire neighborhoods. Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher - The Housing Choice Voucher program is a federal program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and the disabled to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market. Participants are able to find their own housing, including single-family homes, townhouses and apartments. Historic Tax Credit - The Federal Historic Tax Credit incentives is available to stimulate private investment in the rehabilitation of historic structures. Historic property owners may receive a 20% tax credit that is available for properties rehabilitated for commercial, industrial, agricultural, or rental residential purposes, but it is not available for properties used exclusively as the owner's private residence. Motor City Match - Motor City Match is a unique partnership between the City of Detroit, the Detroit Economic Growth Corporation (DEGC), the Economic Development Corporation of the City of Detroit (EDC) and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Motor City Match connects new and expanding businesses with Detroit's quality real estate opportunities, providing them with funding and tools to fuel the city's entrepreneurial revolution. The Motor City Match program leveraged a total of \$24 million in Detroit's neighborhood commercial corridors. Lead Hazard Reduction Program - The Lead Hazard Reduction (LHR) program funds are used identify and remediate lead based paint hazards in privately owned rental or owner occupied housing. The LHR program is targeted to cities that have at least 3,500 pre-1940 occupied rental housing units. The Lead Hazard

Reduction Program is required to provide a 100% funding match using the CDBG allocation. **Emergency Shelter Grant** - The Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) requires a match contribution in an amount that equals the amount of ESG funds provided by the Department of HUD. The FY 2016-2017 ESG match contribution of \$2,838,335.00 was matched with the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) federal funds. **HOME** - The HOME program requires a 25% local match of funds that are expended on affordable housing. Currently, the City of Detroit does not have a matching requirement for the HOME program. For Fiscal Year 2016-2017, the City of Detroit met the HUD criteria for severe fiscal distress. The City of Detroit match requirement was reduced by 100%.

Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

Although the city is progressing to meet its goals, however it has taken longer to actually implement non-traditional funding programs and financing sources that will actually increase the number of affordable housing in the Department's pipeline. For an example, the City is developing ways to match the allocation of project based vouchers with recipients of Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) that are not also participant's in the City's HOME loan program. The Department is also utilizing infrastructure financing through the City's general fund to expand the resources already in progress, for

development of affordable units for non-LIHTC projects. We expect that these efforts will result in a larger number of mixed income projects with affordable units completed over the next funding period.

The City will also utilize non-HOME funding sources to finance acquisition and rehab projects. The first of 5 units are starting to move through the development phase to completion promoting homebuyer assistance.

Although there are typically fewer new construction projects in the City's pipeline, one mixed project will be completed during the next CAPER reporting period. There are 2 new construction projects presently in pre-development stages, however, new construction will continue to represent a smaller portion of the City's affordable housing portfolio over the next few action plan years.

In future Action Plans, the City look forward to increasing a significant amount of units reflected in the previous table, this includes the number of households assisted with rental assistance and households supported through Rehab of existing units. The City plans to acheive this through partnerships with developers of mixed income rental projects. There are also more developeres making use of CDBG and other funding sources to assist low and moderate income households purchase and rehabilitate single family homes. Future action plans will show a shift in both of these indicators to assist in absorbing some of the short-fall from earlier plan years.

Narrative Information

The City of Detroit uses CDBG funding to provide home rehabilitation through the Emergency Home Repair and zero percent interest loan programs targeted in throughout the city and NRSA/Slums & Blight designated areas. Through this process we were able to serve 185 extremely low-income, 159 low-income and 114 moderate-income households. There were 9 households that were over the moderate-income guidelines. The HOME Investment Partnership program provided affordable rental and some ownership housing for low-income families. This past fiscal year the HOME program supported 342 low-income households.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The City of Detroit is a key partner on a citywide chronic homelessness initiative that has focused on expanding outreach efforts on homeless individuals who are unsheltered. Since September of 2016, we have also used ESG to fund an outreach program in the City's central business district. Through our collaboration with the CoC, our community is currently preferencing chronically homeless, unsheltered households for permanent supportive housing.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Through our support of a wide variety of shelter programs for single adults, young adults, victims of domestic violence and families, the City of Detroit aims to address the immediate service needs of those in crisis to ensure they are safely sheltered. In addition, we have funded a diversion program that tries to avoid shelter entry to the time that a household presents at shelter door. When diversion is not an option, the immediate needs of shelter are addressed through our local coordinated assessment system, households are routed to the appropriate service.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The City of Detroit funds several subgrantees to do homelessness prevention activities including intervening on behalf of households facing eviction through the court system. Working through the Youth Taskforce established by a city council member, the City of Detroit has been an active member in discussing how best to meet the needs of youth exiting foster care and other institutional settings. A collaborative of youth providers have recently been approved to receive funding for a CoC Rapid Rehouisng program targeted specifically to youth experiencing homelessness.

The City of Detroit is also collaborating with the Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority to ensure appropriate exits for individuals exiting mental health facilities, and is working with the State of Michigan on a statewide initiative targeting frequent users of health systems who are homeless.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Through the use of program standards, the City of Detroit is a partner in improving the Continuum of Care's response to homelessness and ensuring that programs that meet the needs of target populations (namely Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing) are achieving their target outcomes of helping households obtain and maintain housing stability. In addition, due to a homelessness preference from the Michigan State Housing Authority, many households experiencing homelessness in Detroit are able to obtain housing with Housing Choice Vouchers to ensure stability to extremely low income households with multiple barriers.

We are in regular contact with the Continuum of Care regarding our progress on HUD's system performance measures as well. We use this information as a way to check in on our progress and set performance goals.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The Detroit Housing Commission (DHC) is the public housing agency for the City of Detroit. DHC administers approximately 6,000 Housing Choice Vouchers per year under the Section 8 program and encourages homeownership opportunities. The DHC owns and operates 19 family and elderly public housing developments totaling approximately 4,000 units.

During 2016-2017 development continued at two (2) federally funded HOPE VI revitalization projects as discussed below:

- Woodbridge Estates: Preparing for the financial closing of Phase IX. The developer has agreed
 to develop the site as a combination retail/rental phase, with retail spaces located on the first
 floor of a four-story building with 80 senior units.
- Gardenview Estates: A financial closing on 97-units took place in June of 2017; construction is scheduled to start no later October 2, 2017. To date this is the last planned rental phase at Gardenview Estates.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

During the year DHC continued to work with both Resident Advisory Boards (RAB) and the elected Resident Councils (RC) at each development. DHC staff also met regularly with RAB and RC groups. These forums allowed residents of public housing to provide DHC with input regarding public housing program management. Residents were also encouraged to participate in the annual plan process by attending numerous planning meetings and the public hearing.

DHC presented its draft annual action plan to the public in a meeting during February of 2017. DHC encouraged the public to comment on the draft throughout the 45-day comment period. At the conclusion of the comment period, DHC's Board of Commissioners also held a public hearing to seek feedback and input from the public. At the conclusion of the comment period and public hearing, DHC's Board of Commissioners finalized the plan. It was filed with HUD on April 13th, 2017.

The DHC has also partnered with several HUD certified non-profit organizations to assist with the preparation of residents to become home ownership ready. These programs and services include but are not limited to credit counseling, basic home maintenance, financial assistance and homebuyer education. Additionally, the DHC offers two homeownership programs exclusive to DHC residents.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The DHC is designated as a standard performer. DHC staff is diligently working towards achieving high

performer status in both the Housing Choice Voucher and Public Housing programs.

CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

The City of Detroit, is post-bankruptcy, with state financial over-site and yearly monitoring. The City has established strategy neighborhood investment area's to maximize both: Affordable and Mixed Income Multi- Family rental, and Home Ownership opportunities. The 2016 census puts Detroit as the 23rd largest city in the country. The rate of population decline in Detroit has slowed, and there is renewed expectation that the city's population will begin to grow. The tax burden cost for maintaining an aging infrastructure that once providing services to 1.8 million and now just over 700,000 thousand falls on fewer property owners.

The Housing and Revitalization Department (HRD) continues to provide housing assistance thru the HOME multi-family rental / Home-Ownership Programs and CDBG, home repair Zero Percent Home Loan Program. These programs are available to homeowners living in targeted NSP, NRSA, Slums and Blight and city targeted housing development areas i.e. (20 Minute Neighborhoods). The City's taxing policies for real estate development continues to offer incentives via Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT), and the Neighborhood Enterprise Zones (NEZ) programs. Zoning, Building code fees and charges have kept pace on residential and commercial investments in proportion to economic growth.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The homeless population in general is underserved, as many experiencing homelessness may have cooccurring mental, physical or behavioral health issues that may make it difficult for them to fully
advocate for the needs of their families. Through the use of the coordinated assessment system, or
CAM, as it is known in Detroit, the VI-SPDAT is administered to all households experiencing
homelessness. The use of this tool allow the community of providers to understand the level of
vulnerability those experiencing homelessness have and ensure that they get access to services that can
assist them in reaching a level of stability. For individuals who do not present at shelters or other
providers to seek assistance, the City of Detroit has enlisted several subgrantees to do homeless
outreach to ensure we are reaching the most vulnerable residents experiencing homelessness. In
addition, we have created a by name list of unsheltered individuals and families experiencing
homelessness. This list helps to ensure a full linkage to services for those who may want to be involved
in services initially.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Housing & Revitalization Department (HRD), the Detroit Health Department (HD) and the Green and Healthy Homes Initiative Detroit-Wayne County (GHHI) are continuing to take steps to address lead hazards in Detroit. Exposure to lead can cause lead poisoning which can cause irreversible health damage. Lead exposure/poisoning is particularly harmful to children under six years old. To respond to lead problems, HRD continues to administer and implement several programs including:

Lead Hazard Reduction Program: HRD applied for and received its fourth Lead Hazard reduction Demonstration Grant in December of 2014. The program will conclude in November of 2017. The goal of the grant is to reduce and/or eliminate lead hazards in owner-occupied and rental properties where a child under the age of six (6) or a pregnant woman resides. This is primarily done through property rehabilitation. The program gives priority to households with children who have elevated blood lead levels (EBLL). Rental property owners require work to be inspected by Buildings, Safety Engineering and Environmental Department (BSEED) before a lead clearance is issued.

HRD provides a 100% funding match using its CDBG allocation. In addition to rehabilitation work, HRD also coordinates an educational and informational awareness campaign with various partners in an effort to provide preventive strategies and resources assistance. HRD plans to complete and closeout up to 240 housing units by March 30, 2018. Projects began in July of 2015. During 2016-2017 program year, 59 homes were rehabilitated and cleared of lead hazards in the City of Detroit.

To respond to lead problems in Detroit, the Detroit Health Department (DHD) will continue to administer the **Lead Prevention and Intervention Program (LPIP).** LPIP's achievements includes the following:

- Implemented comprehensive case management protocols for lead-burdened children to include home visits from advocates and public health nurses
- Maintained a surveillance system for data accuracy
- Distributed lead prevention education materials and provided presentations to community professionals and citizens
- Developed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Housing and Revitalization Department to provide EBLL investigations and to facilitate the completion and submittal of grant applications to remediate the homes of lead-burdened children.

Green & Healthy Homes Initiative (GHHI) Detroit-Wayne County was formed by building on the Kresge Foundation's "Get the Lead Out" program, and efforts by the City of Detroit and the Skillman Foundation. GHHI Detroit-Wayne County is comprised of nearly 50 partner organizations dedicated to creating green, healthy, and safe homes for children and families in Detroit and Wayne County. GHHI Detroit-Wayne County is successful at reducing housing-related risks and increasing energy efficiency; and sustaining safe and healthy homes. GHHI's success is maintained through advocacy, policy change and increased enforcement. Goals include improving health outcomes for children, seniors, and families

by creating safe and healthy home environments, increasing energy for low and moderate income families, and supporting neighborhood stabilization (by making Detroit's existing housing stock safe, healthy, and energy efficient).

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

As noted in the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan: housing, education, transportation, and job opportunities are important aspects of Detroit's anti-poverty strategy. These anti-poverty factors are discussed below:

Housing

Affordable housing is key to an anti-poverty strategy. Detroit's low-income persons were aided by several grant programs. HOME and CDBG funds were used to build rental housing, help with down payment assistance and rehabilitate homes for low and moderate income persons/families. The City of Detroit used CDBG and ESG funds to prevent homelessness and assist those that are already homeless with shelter and supportive services. The City of Detroit also received HOPWA funding to address housing problems faced by those struggling with an HIV/AIDS diagnosis.

Education

Education is also a key anti-poverty strategy. Educational attainment is directly related to employment. To assist with educational attainment Detroit Public Schools (DPS) will continue to combat high illiteracy and drop-out rates as it continues under its financial emergency. The dropout rate of DPS has decreased by 7%. Graduation rates for DPS have greatly improved between 2008 and 2016. The DPS graduation rate has risen more than 19 percent and is now just 2.4 percent below the state average.

DPS's partnership with Life Remodeled, a non-profit organization that helps remodel a DPS school each year, worked on Detroit's Durfee Elementary Middle School and Central High School, the city's first public high school, in 2016. The organization is spearheading the transformation of the vacant Durfee building into what will be known as community innovation center which will operate in partnership with Central High School and DPS district to provide hands-on education to students.

To support educational efforts, CDBG funding was allocated to literacy and other educational/tutorial services.

Transportation

Studies have shown that transportation is also a key component to fighting poverty. Transportation systems provide a means to connect residents to each other as well as access to employment, retail centers and other services. The Detroit Department of Transportation (DDOT) and a separate suburban SMART bus system has made it difficult for low-skilled residents without cars to get jobs in the suburbs. However highlights of transportation improvements over the last year include:

The new QLine, originally known as M-1 Rail Project, is up and running. Passenger service has begun as of May 2017. The project will be operated by Transdev Services Inc. This Lombard, III based transportation management firm signed a five-year, \$15.5 million deal to run the six-vehicle streetcar system. The curbside streetcar system has 20 stations at 12 stops along Woodward Avenue with plans to have a rail line extend into the Suburbs.

To assist with transportation needs HRD allocated CDBG funding to several programs (with transportation components) serving low/moderate income persons in Detroit.

Employment

Employment may be the single most important anti-poverty strategy. For example, a significant cause of poverty in Detroit is the lack of employment opportunities. To combat unemployment the City of Detroit provides job training and opportunities through the Detroit Employment Solutions Corporation (DESC), a non-profit agency dedicated to matching Detroiters to jobs. In 2016, updated details were announced for the JP Morgan Chase & Co.'s five-year, additional \$50 million, for a total of \$150 million commitment through year 2019 to invest in Detroit's economic recovery.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Institutional structure for H&RD housing programs begins with program administration and oversight by H&RD staff. H&RD staff then procure qualified subrecipients to carry out the following programs:

- Zero Percent Interest Loan Program
- CDBG Conventional Home Repair Grant Program
- HOME program

H&RD continues to implement the Zero percent interest housing rehabilitation loan program with the help of Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC). When a Detroit homeowner

applies for a home loan LISC does a preliminary review of the application. If LISC deems the application viable then it is forwarded to a local banking institution for underwriting and approval. The application is then forwarded to H&RD for inspection, approval, and loan closing. H&RD then oversees the rehabilitation of the home (carried out by contractors). H&RD staff continue to refine the application process for the Housing rehabilitation grant programs. Applications can be received from the Detroit Health Department, H&RD walk-ins, or at community events. H&RD staff members then review applications for compliance with program requirements. If the applications are approved, they are forwarded to a rehabilitation specialist who then inspects the home and develops specifications. When the homeowner and H&RD approve of the specifications then work can begin. Approved contractors then perform the rehabilitation work.

The H&RD system in place for the HOME program begins with H&RD staff selecting qualified "For-Profit", Non-Profit or Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) developers to undertake "shovel-ready" affordable housing projects through a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). The NOFA is advertised and interested parties obtain applications and

make submissions directly to the Department. Projects are rank-ordered and scored for leverage, readiness to proceed characteristics, and development experience. The most advantageous projects are identified during staff review and underwriting analysis. HOME funds are committed to the project as gap financing after City Council approval, followed by

environmental review. In return for this gap financing a developer must provide a commensurate percentage of units with affordable rents to income eligible low to moderate income residents. The developer is required to assemble a team with demonstrated experience in the type of development proposed, in order to successfully compete in the NOFA process. Staffing is usually a combination of inhouse expertise and externally procured consultants and

contractors to carry out the project. The selected general contractors bid for subcontractors in the construction trades required to complete the scope of work for the project.

The City of Detroit has been coordinating with the State of Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) and MSHDA to align funding and performance priorities for organizations delivering ESG eligible activities. This work includes training for providers to improve program performance and reducing the length of time families and individuals are homeless. In addition, the City of Detroit is launching a homelessness diversion pilot program that includes financial and service support from MDHHS and Wayne Metropolitan Community Action Agency. The City of Detroit is also represented on the newly established Continuum of Care board that brings together a diverse group of stakeholders focused on homelessness.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City of Detroit is an active member of the Detroit Continuum of Care, which includes state and local level services organizations. In addition, the City participates on the CoC Housing Resource Committee which works to engage local landlords to expand access to services. We are also working with the Michigan State Housing Development Authority and Detroit Housing Commission. Through the Continuum of Care, both housing authorities have pledged vouchers through their administrative plan specifically to residents of Detroit experiencing homelessness. In addition, the City of Detroit meets regularly with the Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority to ensure the behavioral health needs of those experiencing homelessness are met. We also meet with the State of Michigan Department of Health and Human Service regularly to check in and align priorities.

Lastly, the City of Detroit Housing and Revitalization Department represents the city on the Wayne Metropolitan Community Action board. As a community action agency and the recipient of Detroit Community Service Block Grant funds, WMCA collaborates with the City to target community service block grant funds to address the unmet needs of Detroiters who are living in poverty, and helps the city leverage mainstream resources to ensure housing stability. This may include assistance with utilities, home repairs, weatherization, etc.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing is a requirement for CDBG program compliance. The

purpose of the analysis is to determine the possible existence of impediments to fair housing choice based on race, religion, sex, color, national origin, disability, or familial status. The following impediments to fair housing choice exist:

- 1. Discrimination in Housing: families with children, disability, and race are high
- 2. Rental Market: single mothers not able to get rental housing
- 3. Home insurance discrimination: different rates offered between black and white testers in the Detroit area.
- 4. Lack of education and awareness of Fair Housing
- 5. Partnerships to further fair housing
- 6. Language barriers for non-English speaking population

The following actions were taken to affirmatively further fair housing:

- 1. In March 2017, the Housing & Revitalization Department (HRD) staff attended a technical assistance conference that addressed topics related to fair housing
- In April 2017, HRD participated in the Fair Housing Month campaign. The following activities
 occurred:Posters were placed in the City of Detroit municipal building and public
 libraries.Posters were placed in non-profit agencies serving low-moderate income persons.Fair
 Housing booklets were placed at HRD office.
- 1. HRD staff attended the 2017 Fair Housing Center of Metropolitan Detroit annual meeting

Effective October 2016, The U.S. Department of HUD issued a final rule on Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing which requires all HUD recipients to conduct an Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH) rather than an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI).

The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) is the annual report provided to HUD describing the outcomes for federally funded CDBG, HOME, ESG and HOPWA grant programs.

To provide citizens with reasonable notice and the opportunity to comment on the CAPER report, a draft CAPER was made available for public review and comment. The review and comment period was September 15, 2017 to September 25, 2017, from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm in the offices of the Housing and Revitalization Department, 2 Woodward Ave., Ste. 908, Detroit, MI. Citizens were invited to comment on the draft CAPER anytime during the review period--in person, by phone, or at the public hearing. The public notice was posted on the City of Detroit website on September 1, 2017. The public notice was published in the Detroit Free Press/Detroit Newspaper on September 20, 2017.

The CAPER public hearing was held on September 22, 2017, from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm in the offices of Housing and Revitalization Department. The following financial reports were available for public review:

In 2016, there were no significant changes to the City of Detroit CDBG program objectives. However, there were various amendments to the CDBG program allowing the City to reach its 1.5 spending achievement with a series of 108 Loan defeasance. Also, the activity Relocation was added to the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2016-2017 Action Plan. The additional Relocation activity is necessary to assist with the 40 Davenport project, rehabilitation of 93 unit multi-family building.

Please find the attached chart of HOME projects with Units requiring inspection during the following years: 2013-2017. The chart shows that the City of Detroit did not complete inspections on units for 74 of the projects listed. The exceptions are those projects in which the HOME affordability period ended during the Caper reporting period.

The City's HOME rental inspection effort is coordinated through a third party firm that certifies tenants for compliance with HOME income and rent limits during the HOME affordability period. A file review is completed and inspections are scheduled for each project prior to the anniversary date it was closed in IDIS.

Project File reviews that were required for monitoring the years 13, 14, 15 and 16 are now substantially completed. Project units have been selected for inspection on a random sampling basis for all projects with 25 or more units for each year, respectively. The units inspected must match the units that are subject to file review. For the 2017 program year, the requirement for random sampling monitoring and project inspections, are in progress.

HRD has taken the steps to ensure current year's inspections are completed during the current year and previous years are completed over time (the next two reporting period). These steps are listed below:

- The National Consultant Services, LLC (NCS) has started pulling multiple year samples for
 projects as tenants are monitored in order to capture inspections previously required. The
 department is currently scheduling and conducting inspections matching those units sampled
 and necessary to satisfy annual inspection requirements for the 2016 and 2017 program years.
 During the next reporting period (2018) the department intends to schedule and conduct
 inspections to satisfy the annual inspection requirement for years 2018, 2015 and/or prior
 years.
- 2. The Department has recently assigned one staff person whose primary responsibility is completing required inspections.
- 3. The three year contract for Compliance monitoring has two years remaining.

4. As HOME Loans are modified, the city will continue to utilize project syndicators to ensure developers modifying loans are providing timely information required by our third party monitor. The City has modified eighteen loans during the current caper reporting period.

The City requires all HOME or CDBG funded developers to notify the Detroit Housing Commission first when any rental units are vacated and prior to filing those respective vacancies. The Department will be aggressively monitoring and enforcing this provision, currently contained in all of our rental development agreements, through our Contract Compliance Administrator. This function is also managed through the compliance monitoring contract with NCS.

The Department will also provide the notices to the newly formed Office of Immigrant Affairs. This Office is a gateway to facilitate access to housing resources for incoming immigrants and the greater immigrant community. The Office is also currently developing a strategy for refugee resettlement. (This process is being developed now that the new compliance contract is active.)

\$673,879.42 was received on the last day of the reporting period. There were \$0 drawn down to fund hard and soft costs for multi-development projects during the reporting period. Also, there were no costs for project administration.

Describe other actions taken to foster and maintain affordable housing. 91.220(k) (STATES ONLY: Including the coordination of LIHTC with the development of affordable housing). 91.320(j)

Housing Services has aggressively worked with a major LIHTC syndicator to close 27 of 32 loan modifications on existing HOME Loans to ensure long term viability and improve loan repayment expectations for the balance of the affordability period. The Department closed one preservation deal with MSHDA or FHA participation to fund prior HOME projects nearing the end of the original affordability period. Finally, the Department was working to closed 18 additional loan modifications on existing projects with individual developers over the next twelve months.

The Department also issues, annually, a locally funded Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). This NOFA now includes CDBG and NSP program income funding in addition to HOME funds and is usually released in concert with the State of Michigan's Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) funding rounds. The NOFA is designed to leverage between two and ten dollars for each local dollar provided for a LIHTC project.

Narrative

HOPWA was successful in addressing the housing needs for "215" families who otherwise would have been in a Homeless environment.

Most individuals present to the program with extremely low income (some may have no income) and job prospects are minimum mainly due to a lack of education or marketable job skills.

Many of the adjustments to the program were based on the service support needs of these individuals to address their ongoing homelessness and aid them in maintaining permanent housing. These included identifying what each individuals housing needs were through housing assessments and plans, goal setting and offering in-house life skills sessions. Addressing barriers, for example, transportation concerns, and linking clients with appropriate agencies for job training were additional strategies implemented, and will be continued.


























2010 Census Map




2000 to 2010 Population Change



Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

The Housing & Revitalization Department (HRD) is the responsible agency for ensuring compliance with all regulatory and statutory requirements relative to Community Planning and Development awards for the City of Detroit. Subrecipient contracts and service-level agreements are executed with partner agencies to facilitate programmatic activities. The agreements detail assigned responsibilities and performance measures to establish accountability standards. An enhanced monitoring strategy is used to assess subrecipient performance and program effectiveness. Also, more effective work standards and protocols were established to thwart and mitigate challenges that could impede successful program performance. To be more strategic in our efforts and maximize available resources, risk assessments are applied to draft monitoring plans. Risk analyses target attention to program activities and participants that represent the greatest risk and susceptibility to fraud, waste and mismanagement. Once the level of risk is determined for each subrecipient, the appropriate monitoring strategy is implemented to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. To determine if a subrecipient is carrying out its community development program, and its individual activities, as described in the application for assistance and the Subrecipient Agreement.
- 2. To determine if a subrecipient is carrying out its activities in a timely manner, in accordance with the schedule included in the Agreement.
- 3. To determine if a subrecipient is charging costs to the project that is eligible under applicable laws and regulations and reasonable in light of the services or products delivered.
- 4. To determine if a subrecipient is conducting its activities with adequate control over program and financial performance, and in a way that minimizes opportunities for waste, mismanagement, fraud, and abuse.
- 5. To assess if the subrecipient has a continuing capacity to carry out the approved project, as well as future grants for which it may apply.
- 6. To identify potential problem areas and to assist the subrecipient in complying with applicable laws and regulations.
- 7. To assist subrecipients in resolving compliance problems through discussion, negotiation, and the provision of technical assistance and training.
- 8. To provide adequate follow-up measures to ensure that performance and compliance deficiencies are corrected by subrecipients, and not repeated.
- 9. To ensure that required records are maintained to demonstrate compliance with applicable regulations.

HRD's monitoring plan involves a collaborative approach of programmatic and financial monitoring. HRD's program staff is responsible for monitoring the programmatic efforts of our subrecipients and service partners. Each project is assigned a dedicated analyst to complete an initial assessment of each contract award and facilitate programmatic monitoring of all subrecipient activities as defined in the executed agreement. The City of Detroit's Office of Grants Management (OGM) is assigned to conduct financial monitoring of covered activities. As the project advances, each organization is further evaluated for performance and effectiveness. This information is considered when determining future awards, as well. Below are more specific monitoring processes for HRD programs and activities.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

Scheduled Program Site Monitoring: Once a sub-recipient has been identified for an on-site program monitoring, a monitoring date is established with the subgrantee. A formal written letter is forwarded to the organization at least two (2) weeks prior to the scheduled visit (where possible), confirming the meeting date, purpose, as well as advising of specific documents, processes and areas subject to review. During this visit, staff will verify that the programs outlined in the contract scope are being carried out as described in the agreement, as well as review documentation, conduct interviews with staff, and complete site inspections. The HRD staff conducting the program monitoring shall inform the subrecipient of any program findings and/or concerns within thirty (30) days after the conclusion of the monitoring visit.

Unscheduled Program Site Visit: When necessary, staff may be required to conduct unscheduled visits to investigate and confirm critical information and/or egregious practices that could pose serious threats to the program.

Desk Monitoring: Desk Monitoring is performed on each contract award to ensure the standards and requirements are met according to the subrecipient agreement, department policy, and regulatory requirements. Assigned program analysts complete a Desk Monitoring Review Checklist that includes reviews of support and reimbursement documentation, as well as performance reports. Feedback regarding subrecipient operations are communicated through deficiency letters and other documentation, as needed.

Public Facility Rehabilitation Program

The Public Facility Rehabilitation program is a construction based grant program. Subrecipients receive CDBG funds for rehabilitation costs of public facilities that have CDBG-eligible public services activities. After an award is granted, the HRD staff monitors the award as follows:

- 1. Requiring the subrecipient to submit a final inspection that is certified by a licensed architect or engineer
- 2. Requiring ongoing public service activities within facility for 5-years
- 3. Filing a lien encumbering the facility
- 4. Conducting periodic on-site visits to ensure progress on a project and adherence to the award contract

EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT

In order to manage ESG subrecipient risk, the City of Detroit conducts a thorough vetting of subrecipients prior to grant award in the procurement process. Following award, ESG compliance monitoring is driven by a risk assessment that is completed jointly with the HRD and OGM. Prior to expenditure, the programmatic and financial team meet to assess risk on the basis of three key factors: grant management, financial management and services, and satisfaction.

The risk assessment drives on-site and desk monitoring with the general expectation that all groups will have an on-site monitoring at least once every other year. Monitoring encompasses ESG program awards, but all CDBG funds are utilized as match.

Monitoring is conducted monthly through payment review. Also, all groups will receive a desk monitoring each year to ensure documentation of homelessness status, recertification of program participants and compliance with the Detroit Continuum of Care's written standards. In cases where findings are identified, corrective actions plans with clear timeframes are identified. Subrecipients who are not responsive to this process may face the loss of grant funds.

FINANCIAL MONITORING

OGM is obligated to conduct financial monitoring for all subrecipients receiving grant funding in accordance with federal, state and local government requirements. Their purpose is to provide uniformity and guidance for grantee departments. The monitoring process includes conducting a desk audit requiring a telephone interview and requesting answers to a series of questions, or an on-site monitoring review in which both relates to inquiry regarding internal controls and financial management. During both reviews, a request is made for specific documentation that will substantiate the answers provided by the subrecipient. Through regular monitoring, the audit staff ensures that the subrecipients abide by all the applicable federal, state and local standards and contract specifications. During this process, the audit staff also monitors for the potential of fraud, waste, mismanagement, and/or other opportunities for potential abuse. The

audit staff also works with subrecipients to provide guidance in correcting identified deficiencies through discussion and or technical assistance.

As part of the year-end audit requirements, subrecipients are required to submit fiscal reports. Non-profit organizations expending more than \$750,000 in federal funds are required to submit a copy of their Single Audit to adhere to the OMB A-133 Audit requirements. The Single Audit serves as an additional monitoring tool used to evaluate the fiscal accountability of subrecipients and is required to be submitted whether or not there were findings. If the Single Audit is not applicable the subrecipient must ensure that Audited Financial Statements are submitted for a desk review.

HOPWA

The Detroit Health Department monitors the HOPWA contract and Southeastern Michigan Health Association (SEMHA) staff administer the HOPWA program and assures program quality management with fiscal and program monitoring.

HOME

The Program Administrator (PA) for the HOME Investor Compliance Monitoring implements required guidelines and procedures to monitor, review and perform scheduled on-site inspections of HOME-assisted rental housing to determine compliance with household housing costs, household income guidelines, and Section 8 Housing Quality Standards (HQS), and procedures to comply with post-rehabilitation lead-based paint activities for rental properties rehabilitated using HOME funds. The PA schedules a compliance monitoring, necessary to complete compliance monitoring requirements on all HOME-assisted units. The PA submits a HOME Compliance Monitoring schedule to HRD management for review and approval. Staff will conduct a site inspection of rental units for HQS compliance and compliance with HUD's Lead-Based Paint Regulations for projects rehabilitated using HOME funds. HRD staff reviews the HQS report and notify owners of compliance or non-compliance. Review all leases of HOME-assisted units to ensure leases are in compliance with the Affordable Housing Restriction document executed at loan closing.
