


SAFETY & ACCESS FOR PEDESTRIANS

- Repair Sidewalks
- Bicycles off the sidewalks
- “Traffic calming” effect



- Shorter crossing distance
- Better visibility
- Refuge areas for crossing



SAFETY & ACCESS FOR DRIVERS

- Resurface Road
- Increased visibility
- Orderly flow of traffic
- Clearly marked parking
- Buffer for drivers to get out of car & Walkable areas



SAFETY & ACCESS FOR BICYCLISTS

- Increased comfort level for bicyclists of all ages
- Protected space
- Reduces fear & risk of collisions with vehicles
- “Traffic calming” effect to reduce speeding
- Reduces the risk of “dooring”



**WHAT DID WE HEAR FROM RESIDENTS AND
BUSINESSES DURING PLANNING?**

Existing Conditions & Priority Setting

- **Primary uses:** Commuting and Visiting Shops & Restaurants
- **Priorities:**
 - Outdoor amenities (trees, benches and lights)
 - Better Sidewalks and Crosswalks
- **Transit needs:** Better Signage and Amenities at bus stops

Specific Feedback & Workshops

- **Street Section:** preferred to keep existing lane configuration, but with added amenity, including bike lanes.
- **Top 3 New Amenities:** planting, bike lanes, and bus shelters
- **Priority intersections:** Lahser, Outer Drive & Greenfield.



March 2017 Meeting with 80 Attendees



Recommendations & Options

- **Feedback was mixed** between 3 and 4 lane options as shown
- **Top Priority:** Shorter crossing distances and additional crosswalks were a priority feature for all options
- **Top Concern:** Reducing parking to accommodate other uses

DESIGN GOALS FOR GRAND RIVER AVENUE

- Create a signature environment to strengthen retail and support new business growth.
- Slow traffic to posted speed
- Improve safety for crossing Grand River
- Improve experience for local neighborhood users (of all ages and modes)



Street Section:

A cut through the entire width of the Road Right-of-Way that shows how much space is allocated to different uses (Sidewalk, Plantings, Parking, Drive lanes, etc...)



**WHAT IS THE SCOPE OF THE UPCOMING GRAND
RIVER ROAD PROJECT?**

GRAND RIVER TRAFFIC STUDY COMPLETED

- Extended Scope to Re-surface and Re-Stripe Entire Corridor
- Plans for next year to continue project south toward 94
- Reducing travel lanes to one in each direction (3-lane section) will not accommodate MDOT traffic flow standards.







- Re-surface & Re-stripe including crosswalks
- Define Parking Lane
- Evaluate Signals & Turns
- Intersection Enhancements at commercial nodes
- Option to Stripe Protected Bike Lanes








