INTRODUCTION

This report includes the results of the 2018 Detroit Department of Transportation (DDOT) Non-Rider Survey. Power Marketing Research (PMR) designed, developed, and analyzed a 19-question, self-administered survey that was fielded from September 11, 2018 through September 20, 2018. The purpose of the project was to gather data from individuals who do not use DDOT transit services in order to measure overall awareness and to help inform future marketing efforts. A total of 309 surveys were collected at various locations throughout the DDOT service area.

The overall goals of the non-rider survey were to measure the following:

- Help DDOT gain an understanding of non-riders' demographics, travel patterns, and preferences in order to improve service planning, marketing, and public outreach.
- Gather data to assist DDOT to better respond to resident's needs and in setting customer service goals.
- Measure non-riders' use of public transit systems and barriers from using public transit.
- Provide DDOT with information on awareness levels of non-riders about DDOT services.
- Gauge perceptions about DDOT services and rate safety, convenience, reliability, and affordability.
- Identify reasons why non-riders do not use DDOT services.
- Gather core demographic data about non-riders, including gender, age, ethnicity, residency, employment status, and household income.

This report includes percentage responses for each question and category of response based on all valid surveys collected. An in-depth analysis of results, all open-ended responses, and cross-tabulations of selected survey questions is also included in the Appendix.



Please note that conventional rounding rules (.5 or above is rounded up to the next whole number, and .4 or below is rounded down to the previous number) have been applied to the percentages in the report tables. As a result, the percentages below may not always add up to 100 percent. Several questions allowed for multiple responses as well, and in those cases the results might be more than 100 percent.

METHODOLOGY


A summary of the target audience and survey details are below. This project was disguised—in other words, it was not disclosed to participants that DDOT was sponsoring the research.

Data Collection Procedures

The survey was administered as an intercept survey—interviewers greeted potential respondents, explained the survey purpose, and asked them to participate. Respondents were given an incentive for participating. The survey was administered on the following dates and locations:

- September 11, 2018—Hamtramck (Joseph Campau Ave.)
- September 12, 2018—Downtown Detroit (Campus Martius)
- September 13, 2018—Wayne State University & Livernois Ave
- September 14, 2018—Downtown Detroit & Wayne State University
- September 15, 2018—Livernois Ave. & Chandler Park
- September 19, 2018—Southwest Detroit (Vernor Ave.)
- September 20, 2018—Fairlane Mall (Dearborn)





Due to the higher density of pedestrians and the potential of more people sitting outside having lunch, working, or enjoying the weather, survey efforts were focused on the Downtown Detroit and Wayne State University areas. The surveyors had a limited amount of time to collect the surveys and high traffic pedestrian areas typically yield the most efficient results. The other locations outside of Downtown and Wayne State University were less efficient as pedestrians were usually looking to get to their destination and did not have time to take a survey.

All respondents were screened to ensure that they had not ridden a DDOT bus in the past 12 months and were 18 or older. An incentive was offered for participation in the survey. Although it was not required, if a respondent needed the survey translated into a language other than English, a card was available with a phone number to call to take the survey.

Survey Instrument Preparation

A draft survey instrument was prepared by Power Marketing Research and presented to DDOT staff. After a round of adjustments were made to the document the finished product consisted of 19 questions.

Additional Findings


- Of the 309 respondents, more than half (60%) have previously used local bus-based public transit. Of those, 52% had used DDOT, 44% used the QLine service, 41% used SMART, and 40% used AAATA/The Ride.
- Respondents were asked to indicate reasons why they did not use bus services. 40% felt that the bus takes too long or isn't convenient. Another 31% prefer to drive, and 26% noted that the bus does not run close to their destinations. 22% and 16% were concerned about safety waiting and on the bus, respectively. 15% said they were unsure of how to ride the bus.
- 74% of survey respondents use their private vehicle as their usual mode of transportation. Another 45% walk and 20% use a bicycle. 27% use a taxi or Uber/Lyft.
- 29% of respondents are very familiar with public transit near their home, and 25% are very familiar with DDOT.
- Half of respondents' perception of DDOT is somewhat favorable, with 13% seeing DDOT as very favorable and 24% not very favorable.
- 76% of all respondents would consider using public transit in Detroit. If survey
 respondents were to use public transit, 66% would use it to travel to work, 30% to travel
 home, and 22% for entertainment. Smaller percentages of potential riders would use it
 for errands, shopping, visiting family/friends or for medical visits.
- Non-riders were asked to report their opinions about various aspects of DDOT. More than half—62%—feel DDOT is safe and 52% feel it is convenient. 41% feel DDOT is reliable, and a majority—90%—feel it is affordable.
- 54% of respondents were male and 46% were female. 44% were ages 18-25, 23% were 26-34, and 17% were 35-54.




- Of those non-riders surveyed, 37% were Black/African American, 47% were White/Caucasian, and 5% were Hispanic/Latino.
- Almost all—92%—of respondents had a smartphone, while 8% had a cell phone without internet access.
- 100% of respondents spoke English, while 92% spoke English in their homes.
- 51% of non-riders were employed full-time, 20% were employed part-time, and 22% were students.
- Overall, familiarity with DDOT increased as respondents' age increased.
- As respondent income increased, use of a private vehicle as the primary mode of transportation increased.

This document outlines the data collection plan and procedures for the 2018 DDOT Non Rider Survey. The goal of the project is to gather data from non riders to gauge opinions about use of public transit, perceptions of DDOT bus service, and potential use of DDOT service. The survey will be administered as in intercept—staff will greet potential respondents, explain the survey purpose, and ask them to participate. Survey details include:

- Surveys will be gathered at the following locations: Downtown, Livernois Ave., Vernor Ave., Jos Campau Ave., Chandler Park, Wayne State University, and Fairlane Mall. If permission is required to survey in any location it will be obtained in advance of survey deployment.
- All respondents will be screened to ensure that they have not ridden a DDOT bus in the past 12 months.
- All respondents will be 18 or older.
- Surveys will be self-administered unless a respondent needs assistance.
- An incentive will be offered for participation in the survey.
- If a respondent needs the survey translated into a language other than English, a card will be provided with a phone number to call to take the survey.
- Surveys will be administered over a two-week period in September, 2018.

Survey Team

The survey team will consist of the Project Manager (AECOM) and the Data Collection Team (Green Arrow). The role of the Project Manager will be to respond to any direct questions from staff in the field. The role of the Data Collection Team will be to administer all surveys to the general public. Staff will also have a card with general contact information (phone and email) if a non rider has additional comments to share.

Members of the Data Collection Team will all wear a DDOT badge to identify themselves. Data collection will occur in teams of two. A small incentive will be given to the non rider after the non rider turns in the survey.



Training Briefing

The Project Manager and Power Marketing Research will conduct a brief training with the Data Collection Team members. The purpose of the training will be to brief staff on the purpose of the project, review the data collection process, review safety protocols, and respond to any questions.

Data Collection Process

Members of the Data Collection Team will be stationed at the locations noted above during weekdays (Monday-Friday) and on weekends (Saturday-Sunday) during September, 2018. A goal of 300-500 surveys is desired.

The process for administering the survey is:

- 1. Staff member of the Data Collection team will randomly choose potential respondents at their location. Depending upon the potential pool of participants, every 5th or 10th individual will be approached.
- 2. The individual approached will be told the purpose of the survey and asked specifically if they have used DDOT service in the past 12 months. If they <u>have</u> they will be thanked and the staff member will move on to the next potential participant. If they <u>have not</u>, they will be asked to participate and the incentive will be mentioned.
- 3. Only one individual from a group of potential participants will be approached. So, for example, if a family of three people is walking in Fairlane Mall, only one survey response will be gathered.
- 4. Staff hands out survey instrument on a clipboard with a pen to the respondent.
- 5. Staff politely asks non riders to fill out the survey.
- 6. Staff assists anyone having problems reading/filling out the survey.
- 7. Staff gathers all surveys from non riders and thanks them for participating.
- 8. When the survey is collected the non rider receives the incentive.
- 9. Staff member approaches next potential participant.
