

Greater Corktown Neighborhood Framework Plan Traveling Survey



Ford Motor Company, the City of Detroit, and PlanetM have teamed up with Dell, Microsoft, AT&T, and local partners to launch the City:One Michigan Central Station Challenge. The Challenge is offering up to 5 winners up to \$250,000 in pilot grants for new mobility solutions that Improve Access to Mobility Information, Make Mobility More Affordable, Build an Inviting Environment and/or Connect People, Places, and Opportunities. The Challenge is governed by these Official Rules along with the Terms of Use and Privacy Policy.

For this Challenge, we are aiming to answer the question: "How might we improve mobility for residents, workers, and visitors of the Michigan Central Station Impact Area today while also preparing for the future of the area?"

Other items to note:

- One Finalist spot will be reserved for a student team, and one spot will be reserved for a team from the Michigan Central Station Impact Area.
- Solutions may take many forms, from innovations in technology and services, to innovative street and infrastructure design—all pilots must directly benefit residents, workers, or visitors of the Michigan Central Station Impact Area
- Up to 12 proposals will be selected as Finalists and each will receive a \$6,500 stipend to develop their final proposal

• Finalists will have applications reviewed by other groups at Ford, and Winners will have the opportunity to pitch to other groups at Ford for potential additional investment

The deadline to submit a proposal is October 31, 2019 at 4 pm EST.
