




Detroit had 16% fewer Part 1 Violent Crimes compared to 2015














Arrests for weapons-related offenses have increased by 48% from 2018 to 2019



Arguments were the leading motive for both Homicides (34%) and Non-Fatal Shootings (31%) in 2019

The city-wide average for gang-motivated homicides was 13%

- Above average: 4th Precinct (28%), 5th Precinct (21%) and 12th Precinct (18%)
- From 11/25/19 through 12/18/19, four groups were identified as responsible for 10 incidents
 - In response, enforcement action was taken, in addition to outreach
 - 12 arrests were made and 7 firearms confiscated
 - A truce was negotiated between gangs in the 10th precinct, reducing gang-related violence city-wide


In 2019, the 9th Precinct participated in all components of DPD's layered approach to violence reduction, which is comprised of coordinated efforts between local, state, and federal law enforcement and community partners.

This coordinated approach also contributed to:

- 73 gang-affiliated defendants receiving federal convictions
- 4,134 firearms recovered city-wide



Project Green Light Detroit Partners grew from 474 sites on January 1, 2019 to 666 on January 1, 2020




In 2019:

- An average of 4 sites became PGLD partners each week
- There was a 41% total increase in sites
- 101,516 Special Patrol Visits were made
 - 278 per day
 - A **48% increase** compared to 2018
