
DPD Annual Report Purpose

Highlighted Neighborhood Police Officers who serve as the liaisons between the Police Department and the community.




2019 Theme: Then & Now

Then & Now: The Mounted Unit







- ➤ The Detroit Police Department's Mounted Police Division, was established in 1893, one of the country's oldest.

- They patrol most days and can be found at Detroit's major sporting, cultural, family events and parades.




