WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY OUTREACH ORDINANCE???

- An opportunity for the community to be informed and provide comment on specific actions taken by the Mayor's Office prior to City Council approval or Administrative action.
- Any items related to the Community Benefits Ordinance are EXEMPT from this process.
 - If there are concerns with development thresholds and other items, the Community Benefits Ordinance is currently being amended. Follow up with Linda Wesley at <u>wesleyl@detroitmi.gov</u>.
- This ordinance DOES NOT prevent additional outreach.
- This ordinance DOES NOT prevent any additional outreach required by law.

WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT RESOLUTION?

- Some items were not able to be added to the ordinance due to fiscal impact or a violation of Separations of Powers as laid out in Section 4-113 of the Charter.
- However, the ordinance will be accompanied by a Community Engagement Resolution expressing support for community engagement actions.




COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT

WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF OUTREACH?

- Various Outreach Types allows for outreach flexibility to ensure that outreach is able to occur in all conditions including but not limited to staffing and financial restrictions.
- For items requiring City Council Approval, if the City Council is not satisfied with the outreach type, the item can be held at the table and require additional outreach.



WHAT IS REQUIRED FOR THE OUTREACH NOTICE?



City Website Social Media Channel 10 Minimum Email/Text to 10-day notice residents in Registration requirement Outreach Database Notice Distribution Hard Copy Distribution Email/Text to 300ft. for in City Council and CAC person meetings

- The Community Advisory Councils (CACs) are community elected bodies created by the Detroit City Charter.
- It was crucial that the CACs be notified of the outreaches to participate in the process and spread the word.

- Due to financial and staffing restrictions, additional spacing for the in-person notification is not feasible.
- However, the Community Engagement Resolution will urge an increase in distribution spacing based upon the future availability of additional financial and staffing resources.

- The creation of the registration database was removed due to a separation of powers violation.
- However, the Mayor's Office supports the creation of the database and the creation of the database will be a part of the Community Engagement Resolution.

- Providing notification to all those in the registration database empowers the following groups to be apart of the process and spread the word ensuring maximum community outreach :
 - Residents
 - Block Clubs
 - Community Groups
 - Businesses
 - Food Pantries
 - Non-Profit Organizations
 - Senior Citizen Facilities

 The CACs and City Council Members representing the impacted neighborhood are also required to notify registered users to spread the word ensuring maximum community outreach.

WHAT MUST OCCUR AT THE OUTREACH MEETINGS?

- Specific details on the management of the meetings such as speaking time, facilitators, etc. are exempt from the ordinance due to a violation of separation of powers.
- However, we can add requests to the Community Engagement Resolution.



WHAT MUST BE IN THE COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORT?

If provided, a report from the established Community Advisory Council representing the impacted neighborhood
