

The Detroit Board of Police Commissioners:

A History of Reform, Civil Rights, Community Partnership,

The City of Detroit has helped pioneer civilian oversight of law enforcement since the 1970s.

In the aftermath of the 1967 uprising, Detroit residents continued to work for lasting reforms to a police department that the community knew as abusive and biased. In 1973, voters approved a new charter with numerous changes to city government, including the creation of a civilian oversight board for the Detroit Police Department. The Charter took effect in 1974 and - with the mandate that "the police department is headed by a 5-member board of police commissioners" - vested the new body with significant powers to make the department more responsive to the community, including the Board's authority to hire the police personnel director.

The 1974 City Charter took effect under a new mayor who also saw police reform as a priority. Mayor Coleman A. Young convened the first meeting of the civilian board on Monday, July 22, 1974. The first Commissioners appointed by the mayor and confirmed by City Council were Charles Butler, Douglas Fraser, Edward Littlejohn, Susan Mills-Peek, and Alexander Ritchie. The Board fulfilled the people's vision of broad, community-driven oversight with the clergy, labor, civil rights, public interest, education, and other sectors represented.

The first Board also was diverse in race and gender, a reflection of the mayor's commitment to equality. In the spirit of community participation, Board members served as volunteers without pay.

With a clear mandate from the people of Detroit, the Mayor, and the City Charter, the Board of Police Commissioners began to reshape the department to better represent and serve all residents. The Board stood at the forefront of change - and withstood the controversy that change can bring. One of Mayor Young's first acts was to disband STRESS - Stop the Robberies, Enjoy Safe Streets - an undercover unit that killed 20 people, mostly blacks, in only 30 months. Young also implemented a 50-50 affirmative action plan to address longstanding bias in promoting black officers and female officers. With its weekly meeting and decision-making powers, the Board and its first five members led the City into a new era of accountability, transparency, and community-focused policing.

Detroit's pioneering vision for civilian oversight of the police made the City a national model. The 1974 model endured for almost four decades before residents again voted for changes.

Amid 21st Century challenges, residents created a new process to elect city officials and amended the Charter to establish seven electoral districts for City Council members - and for the Board of Police Commissioners. Today, under the 2012 Charter, the Board has 11 members, with seven elected by district and four appointed by the Mayor and subject to City Council approval.
