**Chairperson's Report:** Chairperson Bell provided opening remarks regarding the Board's oversight role, Charter-Mandated Authority, and proposed oversight reform efforts to seek feedback from the community through a BOPC-community survey. **Commissioner Shirley Burch and Commissioner Jesus Hernandez** also shared remarks regarding important BOPC updates and information for the Board and the community's awareness.



is finalizing the report for completion to submit to the Chief of Police regarding a recommendation of the duty status of Sergeant Geelhood. Currently, Sergeant Geelhood remains full duty, assigned to the Eighth Precinct; however, once the investigation is complete, the Internal Affairs Unit will be able to better advise regarding his duty status.

**Commissioner Holley** inquired about the protesters' demands of the Department. **Commissioner Davis** inquired about the status of the investigation concerning a Department member fraudulently signing the Chief of Police Craig's documentation, noting future follow up on various critical updates. **Commissioner Davis** inquired about the status of the previously requested mobilization report regarding the length of time it takes for an officer to respond from his residence to an emergency. Regarding the previous investigation involving forgery, **Director Graveline** reported that the initial investigation findings revealed inconclusive based on several persons previously assigned to the Department are no longer with the Department, referencing the challenges associated with interviewing persons who are no longer with the Department. The Department was not definitively able to identify persons who committed the forgery. **Commissioner Burch** inquired about the ordinances concerning the quality of life instances (i.e. mini pool and parking in the front yard). **Commissioner Burch** also inquired about the status of the officer who committed a traffic violation in Greektown. **Commissioner Burch** inquired about the Department's efforts to provide special attention in the area of 6 Mile, and Dequindre areas. **Commissioner Brown** thanked the Department regarding their work on the drag racing enforcement as well as the Neighborhood Police Officers activities. **Commissioner Brown** also asked about the Municipal Parking Enforcement and BSEED enforcement services regarding parking violations. **Commissioner Burton** requested for the Board to see the video footage regarding the police-SUV incident, requesting to observe (2) hours prior and (1) hour after the incident. **Commissioner Burton** also requested police response times for Priorities 1-4. **Deputy Chief Bryant** reported the Department is currently averaging approximately 14 minutes regarding police response time, noting improvement efforts and the high volume of requests for service received recently. Deputy Chief Bryant also noted the Board receives a break-down of priority 1 and 2 police response times, also by precinct in the weekly Tuesday packet. **Director Graveline** reported the Department will arrange a time to show the BWC video to Commissioners; however, the video will not be released to the public at this time.
