Project Background

East Jefferson Restriping

When it occurred

• 5.4 miles of E. Jefferson restriped in 2018

Why

- Converted road from seven (7) lanes to five (5)
- Created shorter crossing distances for pedestrians
- Aimed to calm traffic of 30,000 cars/day

How


- Installed new lane markings for vehicle traffic
- Installed clearer crosswalks for pedestrian safety
- Added protected bike lanes on with a painted buffer and designated parking
- Deployed brochures and street signs were deployed to educate residents



Project Background Corridor Enhancement Plan



This project represents the design and then construction phase that originated with the East Jefferson Corridor Enhancement Plan, which included four (4) goals for Jefferson Avenue:





Project Background Engagement

The East Jefferson Corridor Enhancement Plan included a rigorous engagement process:



Four (4) community workshops (March/April 2019)



Four (4) meetings of the advisory committee



Regular meetings with the project's working group

About the project

This project will include the revisioning of East Jefferson Avenue from Rivard Street to Alter Road

Rivard St.

Riopelle

Holcomb St.

Cadillac Blvd.

What's included:

Jean Ave

Montclair St.

- Full reconstruction of the road and sidewalks
- Replacement and relocation of underground utilities

About the project

- Current repaying (to be complete by September 3) will keep East Jefferson usable until the full reconstruction occurs
- Evaluate alternatives to make sure the future East Jefferson works for Detroiters
- Develop design plans and cost estimates
- Develop a strategy to make sure East Jefferson can be rebuilt on time, on budget, and with as little disruption to residents and businesses as possible
- Engage with residents throughout the entire project!






East Jefferson Reconstruction | Scenario A: One-Way Raised Bike Lanes (Each Side)












More on One-Way Bike Lanes: Example from Livernois








East Jefferson Reconstruction | Scenario B: Two-Way Raised Cycle Track (South Side)
