

# Disaster Food Assistance Available

For Wayne and Washtenaw County residents who have been affected by recent floods.

## How to Apply

Residents **must apply and interview in person** between August 12–19 (locations and hours of operation on page 2). **Individuals who currently receive food assistance are not eligible.**

**Note:** Only **one person per household** needs to be present to apply. Please limit the number of people from the same household.

## What Do I Need to Apply

Applicants should bring some form of identification. Applicants are encouraged to bring proof of residence, proof of any income and any liquid assets, if possible. **Masks are required inside of the facility.**

### Proof of Identity

- Driver's license
- State-issued ID
- Military ID
- School-issued ID
- Social Security Number
- Signed affidavit on application

### Proof of Residence

(encouraged to bring)

- Driver's License
- Other ID with address
- Utility bills
- Tax bills
- Will accept client statement

**Note:** Proof of citizenship or alien status is **not a requirement.**

## Eligibility Requirements

- ☐ Lived in Wayne or Washtenaw counties on June 25, 2021.
- ☐ Not already receive food assistance benefits (SNAP).
- ☐ Meet income and asset requirements for your household size (see chart on page 3).

- ☐ Be directly affected by the recent flooding. Must have experienced **at least one of the following:**
  - Destroyed or spoiled food.
  - Disaster-related personal injury.
  - Lost or no access to income or assets due to the disaster, including reduced, terminated or delayed receipt of income, for a large part of the benefit period.
  - The need for home or business repairs.
  - Temporary shelter expenses.
  - Evacuation or relocation expenses.

# Disaster Food Assistance

## Benefit Amount

Eligible households will receive a one-time-only benefit. Households must not exceed the income limit for their family size **during the disaster benefit period**.

This is based on:

- **Adding** household's take-home income and accessible liquid resources, and
- **Subtracting** unreimbursed disaster expenses as determined by MDHHS

See chart below for benefit amounts.

7	\$4,133	<b>\$1,232</b>
8	\$4,506	<b>\$1,408</b>
For each extra member in household	add \$374	<b>add \$176</b>

Households approved for the Disaster Food Assistance Program will receive a Bridge Card, an electronic benefits card similar to a debit card that can be used to redeem their food assistance benefits at eligible retail stores and farmers markets.
