Long-Term Care Facilities

COVID-19 Best Practices

Detroit Health Department recommends the following best practices to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at long-term care facilities.



Facility Infection Prevention Best Practices:

- During periods of substantial or high transmission (see MI Safe Start Map for current risk level) implement the following regardless of vaccination status:
 - Daily health screenings or questionnaires (residents, patients, staff, visitors)
 - Conduct regular testing (residents, patients, staff)
- Promote COVID-19 vaccination among residents and staff
 - Request a vaccination event here or schedule an appointment at (313) 230-0505
- Ensure proper <u>ventilation</u> of rooms and common spaces
 - i.e. opening windows and doors, cleaning HVAC systems, installing HEPA filtration systems
- <u>Clean and disinfect</u> high-touch surfaces daily
- Provide hand sanitizer and/or washing stations
- Post social distancing and mask usage signs in high traffic areas
 - i.e. elevators, breakrooms, hallways, community areas, etc.
- Schedule visits in designated visitation areas or offer virtual or modified options.



How to Respond to a Positive Case:

- Call the Detroit Health Department at (313) 876-4000 to report positive case(s)
- Deep clean areas where the positive case was present within 24 hours
- Adhere to CDC isolation and guarantine guidance, even before test results arrive if infection is suspected
- Cohort groups of people based on exposure status, including a "well unit"

Isolation For people who test positive for COVID-19:

- Residents
 - Isolate and wear a mask for 10 days AND it has been 24 hours after major symptoms (i.e. fever) are gone
- Staff*
 - Stay home for 10 days OR 7 days with negative test

Quarantine For people who were exposed to COVID-19:

- Residents
 - Quarantine, wear a mask, and monitor for symptoms for 10 days (regardless of vaccination status)
- Staff*
 - Boosted: No work restrictions, with negative test on days 2 and 5-7
 - Not fully vaccinated: Stay home for 10 days OR 7 days with negative test

*Work restrictions for healthcare providers may be shortened in times of critical staffing shortages, see here.
