COVID Emergency Rental Assistance

What is CERA?

A pandemic response, CERA helps renters with **past due** and **future** rent and utility payments to prevent evictions and provide basic housing security.

 The program is administered through MSHDA funds
Funds were allocated to Michigan through the COVID Relief bill that passed in December 2020



Who is Eligible for CERA?

- Renters behind on rent
- •Renters that have a household income less than 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI)
 - •Example: In Wayne County a family of four 80% AMI is \$64,000
 - AND -
- •Households who have experienced a "COVID hardship"
 - Unemployment income
 - A loss of income during COVID
 - Increased expenses due to COVID
 - Past due utility, rent notice, or other economic hardship



CERA Assistance Provided

Rent

Households up to 50% AMI

•Up to 12 months of assistance, with 3 months of forward rent

Households 50-80% AMI

- •Up to 10 months of assistance, with 3 months of forward rent
- •Can cover up to \$400 in late fees and up to \$150 in court costs
- Assistance goes back to March 13, 2020

 Can pay for electricity, home heating, water, sewer, and trash (if on water bill)

Household Size	Maximum Total One Time Utility Payment (Includes Future Payment)	Maximum Future Utility Payment as a Credit
1-2 persons	\$1,500	\$300
3-4 persons	\$2,000	\$500
5+ persons	\$2,500	\$500


