What Is ARPA?

Detroit received \$826.7 million as part of the American Rescue Plan Act passed by Congress in March 2021 to combat the negative effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. In June 2021, City Council approved the \$826.7 million divided into 15 categories. Community input was considered during the process.
