## **Museum of African American History**

## FY 2022-2023 Budget Analysis by the Legislative Policy Division

The Mayor is recommending a \$2,600,000 General Fund subsidy for the Museum of African American History (MAAH), in appropriation **26350** - **Cultural Institutions Support**, in cost center **350290** - **Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History**, located in the Non Departmental budget (**Pg. B35-8**), a \$700,000 (36.8%) increase from the current FY 22. In addition to the annual General Fund subsidy for the MAAH in the Non Departmental budget, for FY 23 in appropriation **4533** - **City of Detroit Capital Projects**, in cost center **350290** - **Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History**, the Mayor is recommending one-time capital spending<sup>1</sup> in the amount of \$2,000,000 for the MAAH (**Pg. B35-10**).

- 6) Please provide the number of budgeted positions. Please indicate the number of vacancies at the MAAH as of February 28, 2022. If there are any vacancies, please briefly describe MAAH's strategy to fill the vacant positions.
- 7) Please describe your strategy for increasing visitors and memberships to the MAAH.
- 8) Please briefly explain how MAAH has adjusted its operations to deal with the pandemic.
- 9) Please provide your current operating budget and your operating budget for FY 2023.
- 10) Please describe some of the planned exhibits for the upcoming fiscal year.

# **NON-DEPARTMENTAL (35)**

Access Channel 22, Neighborhoods Channel 21 and Public Access Channel 68. Media Services interfaces with the Mayor's Office; City Council; City departments and commissions; educational institutions; and community organizations to produce programming that is responsive to the public's diverse information needs and interests.

- Communications Services staff promotes a positive city image with effective communications with the City's customers residents, business
  owners, employees, visitors and the media. As the communications arm, staff provides high-quality service to city agencies and elected
  officials in their efforts to communicate programs, initiatives and information to various audiences. Services include strategic communications
  planning and counseling, media relations, event planning, website management, writing, graphic design, photography and Total Copy Center
  services. Staff support Motor City Makeover and Halloween in the D, under the Mayor's Communications Director.
- Pension Administration is responsible for the administration of the employee retirement systems, and it is the governing body for the Employee Benefit Plan. The Retirement Systems fully reimburses the City of Detroit for Pension Division personnel costs.

The Non-Departmental agency records the salaries and benefits for the 11 elected officials of the City of Detroit: Mayor, City Clerk, and City Council members, in the **Elected Officials Compensation** cost center. General Fund contributions are made to enterprise agencies, cultural agencies, other external agencies.
