COUNCIL MEMBER'S CORNER

LEGISLATIVE/POLICY UPDATES

- Council Member Calloway has introduced requesting an ordinance that will regulate electric scooters. Electric scooters have operated in Detroit for four years without any rules for their usage. The Council Member has proposed:
 - Scooter operators register for licensing and certification every year
 - Council work alongside the Office of Mobility and Innovation to improve the infrastructure to support E-scooter usage, including parking spaces, better street access to get scooters off of sidewalks, and expanded education on the benefits of alternative forms of transportation.
- Council Member Calloway has spent the last month working with tenant advocates and housing experts to end unjust evictions in the city of Detroit. She has since submitted a request to amend the current Detroit Renters Ordinance that would strengthen the existing enforcement of compliance standards. She has also proposed increasing funding and resources toward Eviction Diversion and Rapid Re-housing programming. We have also requested a financial assessment for lead abatement funding for our small "mom and pop" landlords to help provide a source of funding to help those get into compliance and to support an ecosystem for responsible homeownership.

COUNCIL MEMBER CALLOWAY TALKS ABOUT REGULATIONS FOR E-SCOOTERS

Last week Council Member Calloway said in an interview with Peter Maxwell of WXYZ, "I want to make sure these companies are regulated and are licensed to do business in our city. I've been on the council for eight months, and I have not seen an e-Scooter contract yet."

COUNCIL MEMBER CALLOWAY INITIATES DISPARITY STUDY FOR CONTRACTS & PROCUREMENT

One of Council Member Calloway's primary focuses is on expanding and strengthening opportunities for disadvantaged and underserved people in Detroit. To increase the diversity of businesses that contract with the city, re-evaluating the city's Contracting and Procurement process must be the first step in dismantling inequalities. By focusing on diverse local businesses, the Office of Council Member Calloway believes we can be more effective in utilizing them for contracts. Council Member Calloway has also advocated for a Disparity Study within the city. The study aims to determine if inequalities exist in the current public procurement and contracting process that adversely affects minorities and women. During recess, Member-At-Large Mary Waters, Member Latisha Johnson, and Member Calloway met with the Philadelphia City Council President, members of the City Council, and select staff from the Department of Contracts and Procurement. This meeting served as a great learning opportunity for the Detroit City Council.

COUNCIL MEMBER CALLOWAY WELCOMES B3 ELEVATION

Black-owned businesses have historically been neglected and underutilized. With programming, such as B3 Elevation, founded by Diane Palmer, businesses now have the tools to grow, sustain, and compete in the marketplace. Palmer aims to close the racial capital gap and get 100 Black-owned businesses to millionaire status. During last month's press conference, Council Member Calloway says, "These pioneers (Ms. Palmer and Ms. Mills) are why Black children in this city and, more importantly, in this community will grow up normalizing Black business ownership." REMEMBERING THE VICTIMS SLAIN IN SHOOTING RAMPAGE

Danielle Hall, District 2 resident, and the Office of Council Member Calloway planned a prayer vigil for the entire city. "We don't need another program," said Calloway, "we need prayer." City of Detroit officials, community members, loved ones, and friends gathered at Wyoming and 7 Mile to honor the lives of those tragically killed late last month. Individuals assembled for the candlelight vigil to pray for the families and friends of the victims. The sole survivor of the senseless shootings also spoke, emphasizing the importance of having a close-knit neighborhood. He also thanked his neighbors for stepping up and standing their ground to deter the shooter from continuing his rampage. Members of the pastoral community also shared prayers and condolences for the families. "Members of Oak Grove AME are here tonight because we want everyone to know that we are not simply here to take up space in this community, but we are here to serve this community," said Reverend Cindy Rudolph.
