Except for the 143 items prohibited in Subsection (a) of this section, the Board of Zoning Appeals may approve the change of one nonconforming use to another nonconforming use only where the Body determines that the new proposed use will be less injurious to the surrounding area than the previous nonconforming use. Where a change in use is approved, the Board of Zoning Appeals shall be authorized to impose conditions that the Body deems necessary to reduce or minimize any potentially adverse effect upon other property in the neighborhood, and to carry out the general purpose and intent of this chapter. Any condition that is imposed must relate to a situation created or aggravated by the proposed use and must be roughly proportional to its impact.

Specially designated merchant's (SDM) establishment	A retail establishment, consisting of less than 15,000 square feet of gross floor area, utilized for the distribution of alcoholic liquor, licensed by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission to sell beer and/or wine for consumption off the premises; an SDM is also any retail establishment, regardless of size, where more than ten percent of the usable retail space is utilized for the display or distribution of alcoholic liquor and is licensed to sell beer and/or wine for consumption off the premises.
Specified anatomical areas	Specified anatomical areas means and includes less than completely and opaquely covered: (1) Female breasts below a point immediately above the top of the areola; (2) Male or female buttocks; (3) Male or female genitals and pubic area; and (4) A penis in a discernibly erect state, even if completely and opaquely covered.
Specified sexual activity	Specified sexual activity means any of the following: (1) Intercourse, oral copulation, masturbation or sodomy; or
