What is a CBDO?

Generally, a nonprofit that undertakes specific CDBG funded activities CBDOs can be for profit or non profit organizations, but they *cannot* be a government entity

CBDOs may be designated as a subrecipient by a grantee



CBDO- Eligibility

What are eligible activities?

Neighborhood Revitalization Activities of sufficient size and scope to have an impact on the decline of a geographic location within the City of Detroit (but not the entire City of Detroit) designated in comprehensive plans, ordinances, or other local documents as a neighborhood, village, or similar geographic location

Community Economic Development Activities that increase economic opportunity, principally for persons of low-and-moderate income, or that stimulate or retain businesses or permanent jobs, and projects that consist of one or more such activities that are clearly needed to address a lack of affordable housing accessible to existing or planned jobs

Energy Conservation

Activities that address energy conservation, principally for the benefit of the low-and-moderate income residents of the City of Detroit



What is required to apply?

Your organization must meet requirements under:

Exhibit A- 24 CFR 570 204 (c)(1)
 or

Exhibit B- 24 CFR 570 204 (c)(2)



Exhibit A for 24 CFR 570.204 (c)(1)

An association or corporation organized under State or local law to engage in community development activities primarily within an identified geographic area within the City of Detroit

Its primary purpose is the improvement of the physical, economic, or social environment of its geographic area of operation, by addressing one or more critical problems of the area, with particular attention to the needs of LMI persons

Either nonprofit or forprofit, provided that any monetary profits to shareholders or members must be only incidental to its operation Maintains at least 51% of its governing body membership for LMI residents of its geographic area of operation, owners or senior officers of private establishments and other institutions located in and serving it's geographic area of operation, or representatives of LMI neighborhood organizations located in its geographic area of operation



Exhibit A for 24 CFR 570.204 (c)(1)

Is not an agency or instrumentality of the City of Detroit and does not permit more than 1/3 of the membership of its governing body to be appointed by, or to consist of, elected or other public officials or employees or officials of an ineligible entity

Except as authorized above, requires the members of its governing body to be nominated and approved by the general membership of the organization or by the permanent governing body

Is not subject to requirements under which its assets revert to the recipient upon dissolution

Is free to contract for goods and services from vendors of its own choosing



Exhibit B for 24 CFR 570.204 (c)(2)

Is an entity organized per Section 301 (d) of the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 (15 U.S.C 681 (d)), including those that are profit making

Is a Small Business
Administration (SBA)
approved Section 501
State Development
Company or Section 502
Local Development
Company, or an SBA
Certified Section 503
Company under the Small
Business Investment Act of
1958, as amended

<u>OR</u>

Is a Community Housing
Development Organization
(CHDO) under 24 CFR 92.2,
designated as a CHDO by the
HOME Investment Partnerships
Program by the City of Detroit,
with a geographic area of
operation of no more than one
neighborhood and has received
or is expected to receive HOME
funds under 24 CFR 92.300


Both applications require the following support documentation:
