DDOT Coolidge EA-Appendix H Public Involvement Report

Our current strategy has been to first inform, and second, we are continuing to consult with members in the affected community.

We have provided information on our website and social media, and at least 300 flyers were distributed throughout the city before each meeting with the help of our community members.

The Coolidge site is within Detroit's District 7, which includes the Southfield Plymouth Community Association. Members attending their November meeting were given flyers that included updates on the Coolidge project and information on how to provide input or ask questions.

The Coolidge project has also been featured online in the Michigan Chronicle https://michiganchronicle.com/2022/11/05/coolidge-terminal-replacement-project-proposals-underway/. The Chronicle is a weekly newspaper in Detroit that specializes in covering the interests and issues affecting the African American community.

DDOT is also preparing to send out its latest newsletter which includes information on the Coolidge project and how the public can learn more about it and where to provide comments and questions.

Environmental Justice Outreach

DDOT has and will continue to share and invite the EJ community surrounding the Coolidge Terminal site to learn about the project, provide input and comments, or ask questions during this planning process.

To continue our efforts to reach more members of the EJ community, DDOT is planning host information booths and workshops and hold information forums within the EJ community area and well as make ourselves available in the area to solicit input and answer any questions.

Since the EJ community includes District 7 residents in Detroit, DDOT reached out and asked our representatives from the Department of Neighborhoods in District 7 to assist in sharing information. We are also working with the City Council Community Liaison for District 7 to help us share information with residents, including the EJ community.

To further inform our EJ community members, they were included in our mass email distribution list of more than 14k subscribers. Emails were sent as notices prior to each public meeting and will be used to provide updates. Email invites were also sent to

representatives of TRU, Detroit People's Platform, and Motor City Freedom Riders, which are transit advocate groups that also represent members of this community.

Flyers will also be going door to door in the community, and information will be posted at the current site and nearby locations. During the October public meeting, interest from at least one attendee was expressed to volunteer with DDOT staff to help as we canvas the area with information.

The Coolidge information has also been added to our bus monitors so that passengers using the service will be able to about the project and know where to provide input.

Coolidge Terminal Replacement Project in District 7

DDOT is proposing to construct a new bus maintenance, storage, and operations center on the existing Coolidge Terminal site at 14044 Schaefer Highway in Detroit. The facility operated transit service from 1928 until December 2011, when a fire destroyed part of the facility, halting operations.

The proposed plans would replace the Gilbert Terminal, which is no longer suitable for DDOT. Three new buildings will be constructed during the project. They will be for bus storage and coach services, fleet maintenance with parts storeroom, and Operations and Administration.

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) is funding this project and so far, two public meetings have been held to provide the public with updates and an opportunity to provide feedback. The next public hearing is expected to take place in January 2023. The facility is expected to be completed by the end of 2014. To learn more about the project, visit www.detroitmi.gov/coolidge.
