Skills for Life

A work/training program that pays Detroiters to learn new job skills while removing educational barriers to employment.

Residents hired now work in the General Services Department Earned their GED and/or occupational credentials.



Jump Start

- Designed to ensure long-term employment success for Detroiters who have been out of the workforce for six months or longer
- Options to upgrade skills through job training, education programs, or work experience, plus job readiness training, financial literacy coaching, and individualized mentoring



Renew Detroit

Essential home repairs for senior citizens and persons with disabilities.

Phase 1 - 1,000 Roof Replacements

 Roof replacements are underway and will continue into 2024

Phase 2 – 1,000 Roof or Window Replacements (Priority is the roof if homes need both repairs)

- Applications currently under review
- Roof replacements to start in 2024

ShotStoppers: Community Violence Intervention (CVI)

The City is investing \$10 million to partner with local community groups to combat violence in high crime areas.

- Each group will spend two years focused intensely on preventing violence in specific, targeted areas with highest levels of crime
- City will pay for results: groups that successfully reduce homicides and shootings will earn performance grants
- The City received a robust slate of applications from many community groups. The program will select grantees, award funds, and begin services in summer 2023

ACE Arts Alley Initiative

An initiative to design and redevelop neighborhood alleys into unique community gathering spaces and centers of activity. Four new Arts Alley locations were added to Phase I.

Office of Eviction Defense (Right to Counsel)

Legal defense for Detroiters facing eviction.

- Lawyers available to assist individuals facing evictions
- Partnering with the United Community Housing Coalition to provide services and will soon add other service providers

Property Tax Foreclosure Prevention

Canvassers visit homes at risk of foreclosure to share vital information.

- Visited 17,000 properties since program launch in March 2022
- Held several HOPE events to help homeowners apply for exemption of property taxes
- Continuing to focus on the Make it Home
 Program to help keep residents in their homes

Basement Backup Protection Program

- Phase 1 Over 200 homes completed, receiving installation of backwater valve and/or sump pump, downspout disconnection and sewer lateral inspections to reduce basement flooding
- Phase 2 An estimated 1000 residential homes targeted to include sewer lateral repairs



Neighborhood Beautification

Grants of up to \$15,000 awarded to neighborhood associations, block clubs, faith-based groups and non-profits for beautification projects.

+100 Applications recevied*

+30 Projects funded

Joe Louis Greenway

- Utility installation is ongoing between Oakman Blvd. and Fullerton Ave. and Joy Road to West Chicago Blvd.
- The Planning and Development Department has begun its JLG Neighborhood Planning Study with over 160 residents joining community gatherings in four neighborhoods around the city



Dexter Elmhurst Recreation Center

\$8.5 million renovation of the Dexter-Elmhurst recreation center.

- Construction expected to begin in early 2024
- New recreation center will include a gymnasium, community rooms, and kitchen space for events and classes



Corridor Parking

ARPA parking lots for the commercial corridors are proceeding as planned.

- The schematic and engineering designs have been completed and will be ready to submit for permitting
- Residents and businesses will provide input on designs at monthly community meetings and will also receive regular updates

Dexter Avenue Streetscape

A redesign of Dexter Ave. to support development, reduce speeding and reckless driving, and improve safety and beautify the avenue.

- Residents voted for the option that includes three travel lanes, curb bump-outs, pedestrian safety improvements, enhanced bus stops, new lighting, landscaping, and a two-way cycle track
- City will continue working with the community to complete the design
- Construction expected to start in fall 2023

Downpayment Assistance Program

Landmark program that provides Detroiters, who do not currently own a home, with **up to \$25,000** in down payment assistance to help them realize the American dream of homeownership.

Packard Plant Demo

ARPA funds are being used to demolish portions of the abandoned Packard plant that pose a safety risk.

- Emergency demolition at 6199 Concord began in September 2022
- Additional work expected in 2023-2024

Chandler Park Fieldhouse

Will offer year-round sports activities inside a climate-controlled dome.

Construction to begin in early 2024
