

How to Become a City of Detroit Vendor?

- Vendors must be licensed to sale by the Buildings, Safety, Engineering and Environmental Department. (BSEED)
- Vendor License is \$115 per event.
- This process is managed by the BSEED licensing division.

- The General Services Department does not have authority or input in vendor selling outside of recreation assets: city parks and recreation centers.
- It is strictly prohibited for vendors to pull up and sale at city parks.
- Vendors must be scheduled or booked by an event organizer.
- Event Organizers: Groups that host events in city parks.
 - City Departments
 - Community Groups
 - Organizations
 - Businesses
 - Sororities, Fraternities, etc.




General Services Department-Licensed Vendor List

- The General Services Department in collaboration with the Buildings, Safety, Engineering and Environmental Department, the Health Department and the Fire Department launched a new process to lessen the cost to do business in city parks, city recreation centers and at Spirit Plaza.
- As the administering agency, the General Services Department is an event organizer during the peak event season, April-October.
- This allows vendors to pay the license fee one time for the season rather than each they that they are hired.
- Once payment is made, approved vendors are added to the licensed vendors list to be booked by the General Services Department, other departments and other event organizers.



Licensed Vendor List Process







Non-Mobile Food Units

- Businesses selling convenience items, baked goods, etc. are not eligible for the licensed vendor list.
 - These business are still allowed to be booked by an event organizer. However, they are not eligible for the licensed vendor list due to health and safety relative to public food consumption.



Scheduling

- The General Services Department only schedules vendors for departmental events at city parks, recreation centers and at Spirit Plaza.
- Other event organizers receive the list and book at their needs.



Scheduling

- The General Services Department events team schedules vendors for annual calendar events,
 Spirit Plaza and for event park partners.
- Recreation center staff schedules vendors for recreation center events.



Any event of over 25 people in a park should apply for a permit at: **detroitmi.gov/recreation**Picnic shelters and sports fields are on a first-come, first-served basis if not reserved



PRESS 2 Park Mowing + Trash Pick Up

For questions, comments on mowing or trash pick-ups in a City park



PRESS 3 Park Repairs

Report any damaged or broken park equipment, such as swings, to the Park Development Unit or via the Improve Detroit app



PRESS 4 Forestry

Report a dead or hazardous tree or request a new tree on City property or in the public right of way (between the street and sidewalk)



313-628-0900 Vacant Lot Cutting

All vacant lots within the city will be cut four times this summer.
