





Put a rain garden in the big parking lot to help manage rain water, reduce heat, discourage cars making donuts


Construction is anticipated to start in Fall 2023/Spring 2024




#### **DETROIT BIRD CITY PROJECT**



City of Detroit, in partnership with the Audubon Society, has allocated funding to create community green spaces (Bird Meadows) with natural habitat beneficial to wildlife such as birds and pollinators

Planting is anticipated to start in Early Spring 2024







### SUBMITTED FOR ANOTHER GRANT FOR MORE IMPROVEMENTS AT PATTON

- Additional greening of parking lot
- Picnic area
- Playground renovations
- Nature play area
- Wayfinding and interpretive signs
- Welcoming entries at Vernor and Lonyo

Approximately 30 miles of pathway that provides a safe loop around the region and:

- Consists of new trails and on-street bike lanes
- Links to existing trails and an international pedestrian and bicycle crossing
- Connects Dearborn, Hamtramck, Highland Park, and five council districts






#### JOE LOUIS GREENWAY IN PATTON PARK

We have **FUNDING** to do a section of the JLG in Patton in 2024

- JLG trail section between Vernor and existing path along Dix
  - Biking/walking trail
  - Picnic shelter near parking lot
  - Trail connection to parking lot
  - Tables, benches, bike racks
  - Native trees
- Construction of this section of trail is anticipated to start in 2024.



#### MOST RESIDENTS USE THE PARK


to enjoy nature, walk, run, sit and relax, and play or watch soccer.


#### **MOST RESIDENTS WHO**




#### INITIAL IDEAS FOR FEEDBACK
