# NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS FOR TIERED PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS

On or after October 13, 2023, the City of Detroit will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Office of Community Planning and Development, for the release of Community Project Funds under Division L, Title II of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2022, to undertake the following project:

**Tier 1 Broad Review Project/Program Title:** Detroit Energy Efficiency and Home Improvement Program

**Purpose:** The Program will provide health and safety-focused home energy efficiency improvements to low-income homeowners in both the 2013-22 and current 13th Congressional District in the City of Detroit.

**Location:** Throughout the 13<sup>th</sup> Congressional District in the City of Detroit

Project/Program Description: The Detroit Energy Efficiency and Home Improvement Program (the "Program", DEEHIP) will be managed by Enterprise Community Partners, Inc. The project will provide 100 low-income homeowners with deep-dive energy efficiency retrofits and address the needed home repairs that may otherwise disqualify them from the existing energy efficiency programs, and/or that pose health and safety challenges. The Program will also connect homeowners with wrap-around services and address other causes of housing and financial insecurity, provide career-focused workforce development and job placement, and create energy-efficiency related community engagement and capacity-building programs to educate and empower residents. Tier 2 site specific reviews will be completed for those laws and authorities not addressed in the tier 1 broad review for each address under this program when addresses become known. Level of Environmental Review Citation: 24 CFR Part 58.35(a)(3)(i).

**Tier 2 Site Specific Review:** The site-specific reviews will cover the following laws and authorities not addressed in the Tier 1 broad review: Flood Insurance, Contamination and Toxic Substances, Floodplain Management, Historic Preservation and Environmental Justice.

Mitigation Measures/Conditions/Permits (if any): None

Estimated Project Cost: \$2,000,000.00

The activity/activities proposed are categorically excluded under HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58 from National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements per 24 CFR Part 58.35(a)(3)(i). ## **ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION**

The City of Detroit certifies to HUD that Julie Schneider, Certifying Officer, in her capacity as Director of the Housing and Revitalization Department at the City of Detroit, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Detroit to use HUD program funds.

### **OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS**

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Detroit's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Detroit; (b) the City of Detroit has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development – Detroit Field Office, Keith E. Hernandez, Director, Community Planning and Development at DetroitCPD@hud.gov Potential objectors should contact Mr. Keith Hernandez to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
