DDOT is proposing to increase service frequency on Route 9 - Jefferson and add supplemental trips on several other routes in January 2024.

Proposed Changes



Schedule changes in support of a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service pilot.

- Daytime frequency would be increased to every 10 minutes on weekdays, and every 15 minutes on weekends.
- Capital projects to provide BRT elements/features on Jefferson will follow later in 2024.


Scope: Entire length of Route 9 - Jefferson (Rosa Parks Transit Center to Alter Rd)

Corridor Profile

- One of eight corridors selected for enhanced BRT-quality service in *DDOT Reimagined*
- City jurisdiction; corridor identified by DPW for long-term streetscape and multimodal investment
- Regional corridor with a small number of peak commute trips on SMART

Pilot Approach:

Increase service frequency in January 2024, then layer on amenities to improve customer experience; future infrastructure changes to increase route speed will be coordinated with DPW streetscape plans.



East Jefferson Ave Enhanced Service with Future BRT Features



January 2024 Proposed Service Levels

- 10-minute daytime service on weekdays (currently 15)
- 15-minute daytime service on weekends (currently 30)

Introduction of BRT Features and Amenities (beginning in mid-2024):



- Temporary bus stop islands would eliminate the need for bus to change lanes and merge in and out of traffic
- Bus stop consolidations for a consistent ¼-mile spacing would also help to speed the service
- Permanent boarding islands in coordination with DPW improvements
- New/improved shelters with information displays at selected locations
- "Connection Corners" improvements at major transfer intersections

Proposed Changes

16 Dexter


• Improve/restore daytime frequency to every 20 minutes on weekdays.




• Begin 45 min. frequency at the start of the weekday service instead of after 8:00 am.
