August Design scored the highest due to offering a 5-year warranty, access to carpentry resources both inside and outside their organization, realistic timeline, prior experience with historic homes, and comprehensive pricing.

Presidential Construction was the second highest ranked bidder. Their work approach lines up with HRD procedures, and they have 12 years' experience working in Historical Rosedale Park and Boston Edison neighborhoods. Unfortunately, they failed to furnish a bid bond with their proposal and was not able to produce one when asked.

The third highest ranked bidder was Great Lakes Roofing (GLR). GLR had a good work approach and multiple subcontracting resources. They also have 25 years working with the Historical District Commission and have worked on an historic apartment building on Woodward Ave.

DMC Consultants had a detailed approach, but there was concern with the amount of gutter and siding work mentioned but they did not reference roof work in historical experience. DMC only listed 2 homes in Detroit as references, and their pricing was not all-inclusive.

Ingram Roofing provided very few details in their approach with basic roof repairs referenced. The evaluators were concerned about their ability to propose an accurate price. Select Property Solution's pricing was considered solid due to their experience with contract work and with homes in the CoD, but their work plan wasn't detailed at all, and no carpentry resources were mentioned.

Bid Evaluation Background:

August Design scored the highest due to offering a 5-year warranty, access to carpentry resources both inside and outside their organization, realistic timeline, prior experience with historic homes, and comprehensive pricing.

Presidential Construction was the second highest ranked bidder. Their work approach lines up with HRD procedures, and they have 12 years' experience working in Historical Rosedale Park and Boston Edison neighborhoods. Unfortunately, they failed to furnish a bid bond with their proposal and was not able to produce one when asked.

The third highest ranked bidder was Great Lakes Roofing (GLR). GLR had a good work approach and multiple subcontracting resources. They also have 25 years working with the Historical District Commission and have worked on an historic apartment building on Woodward Ave.

DMC Consultants had a detailed approach, but there was concern with the amount of gutter and siding work mentioned but they did not reference roof work in historical experience. DMC only listed 2 homes in Detroit as references, and their pricing was not all-inclusive.

Ingram Roofing provided very few details in their approach with basic roof repairs referenced. The evaluators were concerned about their ability to propose an accurate price. Select Property Solution's pricing was considered solid due to their experience with contract work and with homes in the CoD, but their work plan wasn't detailed at all, and no carpentry resources were mentioned.

Background:

The DPW Streetscape Program is an initiative to target commercial corridors and high-priority neighborhood streetscapes for safety, economic development, and quality of life improvements. Improvements to streetscapes serve dually as traffic calming measures and beautification enhancements that contribute to the character and economic basis of respective communities. For Detroit, improvements generally reduce vehicle miles traveled and enhance pedestrian and bikeway infrastructure supporting its greenhouse gas emission goals and public health response.

To capture the cross-cutting benefits of streetscape improvements, the City of Detroit has invested \$80 million in bond funding to improve corridors across the City largely aligned with the Strategic Neighborhood Fund (SNF) effort.
