


HOUSE BILL 4325

to prescribe misdemeanor penalties for the unlawful dumping of litter, punishable by the following penal fines:

- For a first violation, if the amount of litter were three cubic feet or more but less than five cubic yards, up to \$2,500 and, for each subsequent violation following a conviction, an additional \$2,500 per violation.

-For a first violation, if the amount of litter were five cubic yards or more, up to \$5,000 and, for each subsequent violation following a conviction, an additional \$5,000 per violation.





HOUSE BILL 4325

to prescribe misdemeanor penalties for the unlawful dumping of litter

Illegal dumping has had a significant negative impact on urban and rural communities throughout the State. Dumping trash and refuse in residential neighborhoods is costly, dangerous to residents, and can attract pests like rats, raccoons, and mosquitoes. In 2022, the Department of Transportation spent \$7.7 million to pick up discarded refuse along roads in the State, not counting municipalities. It has been suggested that higher penalties for these crimes could deter more dumping.

HOW NEW MICHIGAN VOTING LAWS ARE IMPACTING VOTERS IN DETROIT + MORE



DID YOU KNOW THAT MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW HAS CHANGED?

WHAT HAPPENED?

In November 2022, Michigan Voters passed Constitutional Amendment 2022-2, ("Prop 2"); which amends sections 4 and 7 of Article II of the State Constitution. Prop 2 enshrined in the Michigan Constitution the right to vote early in every statewide and federal election, a permanent absent voter ballot list, expansion of acceptable voter identification, absentee voter improvements, and extended deadlines for military and overseas ballots.

"PROP 2" INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS


- Require a minimum of nine (9) consecutive days of in-person early voting for all statewide and federal elections, beginning on the second Saturday before Election Day and ending on the Sunday before Election Day.
- Counting of absentee ballots distributed to military personnel or those living overseas if properly completed and postmarked on or before Election Day and received within six days after Election Day.
- Use of a photo ID (federal, state, local, or tribal government or an educational institution) or a signed affidavit to verify voter identity.
- Voters can request placement on the permanent absent voter ballot list managed by your local clerk.
- Provides for pre-paid ballot postage and a state-funded ballot tracking notification system.
- Access to ballot drop boxes within your community; one drop box for every 15,000 registered voters.
