Historical

FY 2024-2025 Budget Analysis by the Legislative Policy Division

The Detroit Historical Society (the "Society") is an independent, Michigan non-profit Corporation whose purpose is to educate and inspire its community and visitors by preserving and portraying the region's shared history through dynamic exhibits and experiences. Under an agreement with the City of Detroit (the "City"), the Society manages the daily operations of the Detroit Historical Museum, its gift shop, the Dossin Great Lakes Museum, and the Collections Resource Center. The Detroit Historical Society raises funds, recruits volunteers, and ensures that the Detroit Historical Museum, the Dossin Great Lakes Museum and Historic Fort Wayne (which opened as a City-owned and operated historical attraction in the 1970s) maintains a vibrant presence in Detroit's cultural landscape.

The Mayor is recommending a \$1,000,000 subsidy for the Detroit Historical Museum for FY 2025, in appropriation **26350 - Cultural Institutions Support**, in cost center **350093 - Detroit Historical Museum**, located in the Non-Departmental budget (**Pg. B35 - 16**). The current FY 2024 subsidy of \$1,000,000 is unchanged for FY 2025 for the museum.

The Non-Departmental budget provides funds for activities which are not the responsibility of any other single agency. Non-Departmental is also the depository agency for General Fund subsidy appropriations, enterprise activities and for a wide variety of General Fund revenues that cannot be credited to any specific department.

- 1. In the 2022-2023 annual report for the Detroit Historical Society¹ on its website, its total operating expenses were \$5.2 million, total revenue \$8.6 million, and net assets \$8.7 million. Although noteworthy, please explain why total revenue exceeded operation expenses by \$3.4 million in FY 2023.
- 2. Please provide the Detroit Historical Society's FY 2024 annual report, if available.
- 3. Please provide the Detroit Historical Society's annual financial statement as of June 30, 2023, if available.
- 4. Please provide the Detroit Historical Society's FY 2024 operating and capital budget. Is total revenue expected to reach \$8.6 million in FY 2024 as was done in FY 2023? During the FY 2024 budget process, the City Council added \$1,000,000 for capital improvements for the Society. Please provide the planned capital projects this funding will accommodate.
- 5. The State of Michigan in its FY 2024 budget was awarded \$4 million. Please explain how the Society plans to use these funds in FY 2024.
- 6. In 2015, the Detroit Historical Society launched its transformational <u>Detroit 67: Looking Back to</u> <u>Move Forward²</u> project as a long-term effort to engage the Detroit community in its efforts to plan a meaningful commemoration of the tumultuous summer of 1967. What efforts is the museum making to advertise this exhibit and the rest that the museum has to offer to increase visitation?
