Re: Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Supplemental Appropriations and Transfers Request (Revised)

Honorable Detroit City Council Members:

The Administration is requesting Fiscal Year 2023-2024 supplemental appropriations and transfers for the expenditures outlined below and in the attached resolution.

Resource Increases:

- \$72.7 million of the revenue increase approved at the February 2024 Revenue Conference
- \$57.1 million from available FY23 unassigned fund balance (prior year surplus)
- \$21.9 million from the Retiree Protection Fund (RPF)

Appropriation Decrease

• \$8.25 million of Vehicle Installment Purchase Agreement debt service due to a one-year delay

Appropriation Increases:

- \$50 million for Risk Management Fund reserves for legal liabilities
- \$31.2 million for Capital Projects separate from those funded with bonds, grants, and the FY25 budget (e.g., ADA accessibility, service yards, climate resiliency, and solid waste)
- \$21.9 million for legacy pensions switch to a 30-year level principal amortization method
 - o Includes \$6.5 million transferred to DDOT for its additional share of legacy pension
- \$17 million for Police overtime and current services hiring trend
- \$13 million for demolition pipeline not covered by Proposal N Bonds or ARPA funds
- \$11 million for Fire/EMS overtime and ambulance unit expansion
- \$7.8 million transfer to Solid Waste Management Fund for phase-in of the budget and fee impact from the new trash hauling contracts and service expansion
- \$3 million for Detroit Detention Center contract with State of Michigan
- \$3 million for Construction and Demolition Department facilities repair and maintenance
- \$1.8 million for Law Department outside counsel legal services contracts
- \$350,000 for Affordable Housing Fund (from District Detroit annual contribution)

In addition, the resolution authorizes the CFO to prepay long-term advances made from the General Fund to the DDOT and Airport enterprise funds, which are otherwise repaid annually from General Fund contributions to those same funds (see pg. 61, FY23 ACFR). The proposed FY25 Budget assumes this prepayment will occur. It has no net budget impact and eliminates unnecessary annual inter-fund transactions.

We respectfully request your approval of the attached resolution, with a waiver of reconsideration, to authorize these supplemental appropriations and transfers.

RESOLUTION

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WHEREAS, Section 17(1) of State of Michigan Public Act 2 of 1968 (the "Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act") states that a deviation from the original general appropriations act shall not be made without amending the general appropriations act; and

WHEREAS, Section 18(3) of the Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act states that an administrative officer of the local unit shall not incur expenditures against an appropriation account in excess of the amount appropriated by the legislative body; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-210 of the 2012 Detroit City Charter authorizes that if during the fiscal year the Mayor advises the City Council that there are available for appropriation revenues in excess of those estimated in the budget, the City Council may make supplemental appropriations for the year up to the amount of the excess; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-211 of the 2012 Detroit City Charter authorizes that any time during the fiscal year upon written request by the Mayor, the City Council may, by resolution, transfer all or part of any unencumbered appropriation balance among the programs, services or activities within an agency or from one agency to another; and

WHEREAS, the OCFO-Office of Budget, on behalf of the Mayor, has submitted recommended supplemental appropriations and transfers to the Detroit City Council, as provided in this resolution and the attached Schedule A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Detroit City Council hereby approves amending the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget by increasing and decreasing Revenue and Expenditure Appropriations as outlined in the attached Schedule A; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, may amend Fiscal Year 2023-2024 appropriations by such amounts as are necessary to prepay long-term advances from the General Fund to the Transportation and Airport enterprise funds; provided further, that the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, shall provide a final report on such actions to the Detroit City Council; **AND BE IT FINALLY**

RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or their designee, is hereby authorized and shall take all appropriate actions necessary to implement the foregoing provisions and actions authorized by this resolution.
