March 26th Resident Council Meeting Recap!







The March Resident Council meeting featured the Detroit City Council Team for District 6, Oak Street Health, and Matrix Human Services. The United Community Housing Coalition hosted the meeting, provided refreshments + arts and crafts for kids. Resident Champion D'Nisha Brannon facilitated the meeting.

Councilmember Gabriela Santiago-Romero made the first presentation, and highlighted equitable development, transportation, housing, environmental justice, public safety, protecting and expanding rights as policy priorities. As City Council completes review of the City's budget for the upcoming fiscal year, District 6 is advocating for funding to support affordable housing, the emergency shelter system, and a dust ordinance to control pollution. Residents are also welcome to attend weekly City Council meetings held every Tuesday at 10am.

Oak Street Health's Outreach Executive, DeAndre Martin provided the second presentation, highlighting primary, wellness & preventive, specialty, chronic condition, lab & testing service, behavioral health, and podiatry care offered to older adults and seniors. Deena Kennedy, Director of Senior Programs at Matrix Human Services, spoke last about how seniors (55+) can receive free or low cost transportation to medical and other appointments, access home care assistance, healthy food programming, and chore services by dialing 313-526-4000.

NEED TO HAVE A SUPPORT ANIMAL?

ACCOMMODATIONS CAN BE MADE!

- A support animal works, provides assistance, or performs tasks for the benefit of a person with a disability, or provides emotional support that alleviates one or more identified effects of a person's disabling condition.
- The Fair Housing Act requires a housing provider to allow a reasonable accommodation, involving an assistance animal in situations that meet these conditions.
- Whether a particular accommodation is reasonable depends on a variety of factors and must be decided on a case-by-case basis.

*If you have not completed your paperwork for a support animal, visit the management office at Clement Kern Gardens to obtain the section 504 forms.



CKG 8bb Tenant Relocation Meeting Notes

ACD held its official Section 8(bb) tenant relocation meeting on 3/21/24. Residents residing in the first 21 units scheduled for relocation had the opportunity to ask questions related to Left Field, the relocation process, and redevelopment of CKG. Tenants asked many questions related to project timelines, the moving process, what the units at Left Field will look like, what amenities will be offered at Left Field, and what the newly redeveloped CKG site will look like.
