Detroit City Council Recess

The Detroit City Council is scheduled for Summer Recess from July 31 to September 2, 2024. During this time, Council Members engage in various community activities and initiatives. To stay informed about upcoming events, make sure to follow Council Member Angela Whitfield Calloway on social media.

Early Voting vs. Absentee Voting

Early Voting:

- Cast your ballot in person before Election Day at designated sites.
- You have the flexibility to early vote in all statewide and federal elections for a minimum of nine consecutive days.

Absentee Voting:

- Request a ballot from your local clerk and return the completed ballot to them.
- You can fill out your absentee ballot at your convenience, whether it's at home or in your clerk's office.
- Absentee ballots are available in every election starting 40 days prior to Election Day.
- To vote by absentee ballot, you need to request one unless you are on the Permanent Absentee Ballot Mailing List.

Voting Procedures:

- Follow all instructions provided with your absentee ballot carefully to ensure your vote is valid.
- Remember to sign the envelope where required and provide any necessary identification or documentation.

Election Day Voting:

• On Election Day, bring any required identification specified by your state when voting in person.

PROPOSAL SECTION of the August 6, 2024 Ballot

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Proposal L?

On Tuesday, August 6, 2024, Detroit's voters will have an opportunity to consider Proposal L, which is the 10-year renewal of the Library's millage of 3.9943 mills, that expires on June 30, 2025. This critical funding provides approximately 85% of the Library's operating funds.

What is the ballot language?

City of Detroit

PROPOSAL L: LIBRARY OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL

Shall the tax limitation on taxable property for operating and maintaining the Detroit Public Libraries, be renewed for 3.9943 mills (\$3.9943 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for 10 years (July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2035). This renewal combines two millages that voters approved on August 5, 2014, which expires June 30, 2025. 3.9943 mills will raise an estimated revenue of \$42,000,000 the first year, if approved, levied, and 100% collected.

Will Proposal L increase my taxes?

Proposal L will renew the current property tax of 3.9943 mills (\$3.9943 on each \$1,000 of taxable value).

Reduced Fare Card Application

The Detroit Department of Transportation's Reduced Fare program enables eligible riders to ride DDOT's fixed routes at a reduced rate. The program is for riders with disabilities, senior citizens 65 years of age or older, and Medicare recipients to ride at a reduced rate of \$0.50 per-term, which is one-third the regular fare rate. All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.

Who Qualifies:


- -Senior Citizens- Individuals age 65 or older
- -Medicare Cardholders
- -Mobility Disabled- Individuals with any illness, injury or disability that physically or cognitively limits mobility independence.

How to obtain Reduced Fare Pass Card:

Applications are accepted ONLY through mail. All applicants must completed the Reduced Fare Application in its entirety. There is an application processing fee of \$1.00 (Cash or Money Orders ONLY). No personal checks accepted. Eligible applicants shall be mailed instructions for obtaining and using the Reduced Fares pass card. Applicants deemed ineligible shall be mailed notification of the reason for the ineligible decision.

- Individuals age 65 or older must provide a copy of your valid government/state issued I.D. or driver's license.
- Medicare Recipients must provide a copy of their Medicare card plus a copy of their valid government/state issued I.D. or driver's license.
- Those applying as Mobility Disabled must have their Health Care Professional complete the attached **Professional Certification**. Note:

 Legally blind persons with documented proof as "legally blind," as evidenced by a valid state identification card, are automatically approved without Professional Certification. Simply mail a copy of your valid state I.D. evidencing the "legally blind" designated with your application.



REDUCED FARE CARD APPLICATION

The Detroit Department of Transportation's Reduced Fare program enables eligible riders to ride DDOT's fixed routes at a reduced rate.

All applicants must complete a Reduced Fare application and provide a copy of a valid photo ID.



Eligibility:

- Senior: Individuals 65 years of age or older.
- Medicare card holder.
- Individuals with a disability.

Senior Citizen Solid Waste Discount

The application period for the Senior Citizen Solid Waste Discount offered by the City of Detroit is July 1-September 15. Here are the details:

- Homeowners aged 65 and above with a Principle Residence Exemption on file are eligible for a discount.
- The Solid Waste Fee is \$250.00, with qualifying seniors receiving a \$125.00 discount.
- Annual reapplication is **not** required as long as ownership and residency are maintained.

Filing this form is optional, but the discount will not be processed without it. The Treasurer's Office may request additional documentation for verification.









APPLICATION FOR SENIOR CITIZEN SOLID WASTE DISCOUNT

New for Tax Year 2024! The application period is July 1 - September 15. The City of Detroit may provide a discount to homeowners who are at least 65 years old and have a Principle Residence Exemption on file. The Solid Waste Fee is \$250.00. Qualifying Seniors will receive a discount of \$125.00. If you continue to own and occupy the home, you will not need to reapply each year.
