Project Description	The City of Detroit aims to establish a program to prevent Detroiters from experiencing homelessness that were previously being served by Covid-19 resources. It is critical that supportive services are brought online to support Detroiters that need safe and affordable housing. As a social determinant of health markedly highlighted throughout the pandemic, secure housing not only stabilizes individual households, it also improves the health, quality of life, and neighborhood stability throughout Detroit. The Housing Services Office is structured to meet a range of housing relocation needs faced by residents and tenants through an internal continuum of services – as a participant's housing needs change, so does the type of services available to them within the program.  The main areas of work are: 1) The Intake and Assessment Team will receive inquiries from residents with a wide array of housing needs from an external call center. 	Detroit is among the nation's most violent big cities, citing a rate of 2,248 violent crimes per 100,000 residents in 2020. Across the country, 2020 was a record year for gun violence, largely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Detroit reported

Project Description	327 homicides and 1,173 non-fatal shootings, a 19% and 53% respective increase from the year prior. In 2021, Detroit saw a 4% and 9% respective decrease in fatal/non-fatal shootings.  The proposal is to establish a Community Violence Intervention (CVI) program. The mission is to prevent/reduce gun violence in Detroit through evidence-informed strategies and community engagement. Several grassroots organizations and community interventions have aimed to reduce Detroit's gun violence crisis, however Detroit is a large city spread over 139 square miles and each neighborhood's characteristics (social and physical environments) vary and require different approaches for reducing crime and violence. Independently, these grassroots organizations and community initiatives can't tackle such an immense problem.  The CVI program will utilize a modern and comprehensive public health framework via three approaches: evidence-informed strategy, capacity building and innovation, and community-centered prevention and intervention. Project Description	The Detroit Police Department (DPD) provides public safety for residents and visitors in Detroit through law enforcement and community policing. DPD is using the ARPA grant to repair their training facility located at 6050 Linwood Street, Detroit, MI 48208. Originally, this building was constructed in the 1980s as a middle school, but it has since been used as a training center for the continuing education of existing sworn members. The City of Detroit's Construction Demolition Department identified the following items to be revitalized inside the Linwood facility: fresh paint, flooring, lighting, fire alarm upgrade, new electric panels, and elevator repairs. For the exterior portion of campus, DPD contracted DLZ Construction for \$102,400 to design a more efficient parking lot and repair the existing trench drains. The interior construction work began in the summer of 2023, and new classroom and office furniture will be installed post-construction. Since the COVID pandemic, there has been an increase in gun related violence throughout the city. In Detroit, compared to 2019, our homicides increased 17% in 2020 and 12% in 2021. For nonfatal shootings, also compared to 2019, there was an increase of 53% in 2020 and 39% in 2021. Improving training will improve officer readiness and address the pandemic-related increase in gun violence and increased demands on the DPD. The state-of-good-repair improvements in this project will improve the technological and service capacity of the facility, increasing building performance and improving the quality of trainings provided.

Also occurring in the pandemic is the loss of interested individuals due to the increased violence and fear of the transmission of COVID. The facilities are the location where cadets receive their training curriculum and ongoing mandatory and elective trainings. The facility repairs included in this project will improve building performance and, in turn, improve training outcomes for members of the DPD force. These expenditures are an investment in existing DPD training center which currently does not meet the threshold of State-of-Good Repair. Without these needed repairs, building systems such as the elevators, electrical, and HVAC will frequently break down, disrupting training programs and hurting program outcomes. Alternatives considered for providing a facility necessary to deliver the DPD programs include: renovate the existing Training Center, renovate another existing building, or build ground-up. The current renovation of the existing DPD Training Center is budgeted at \$10,392,466, which will include interior and exterior improvements Renovating Another Building: \$36M. This will require expanding a buildout, since we do not own a building in a similar scale New 240,000 SF Ground-Up Training Facility: \$58M.
