- DWSD focused on providing **safe, affordable drinking water**



Since 2016, rate increases average 2.9%

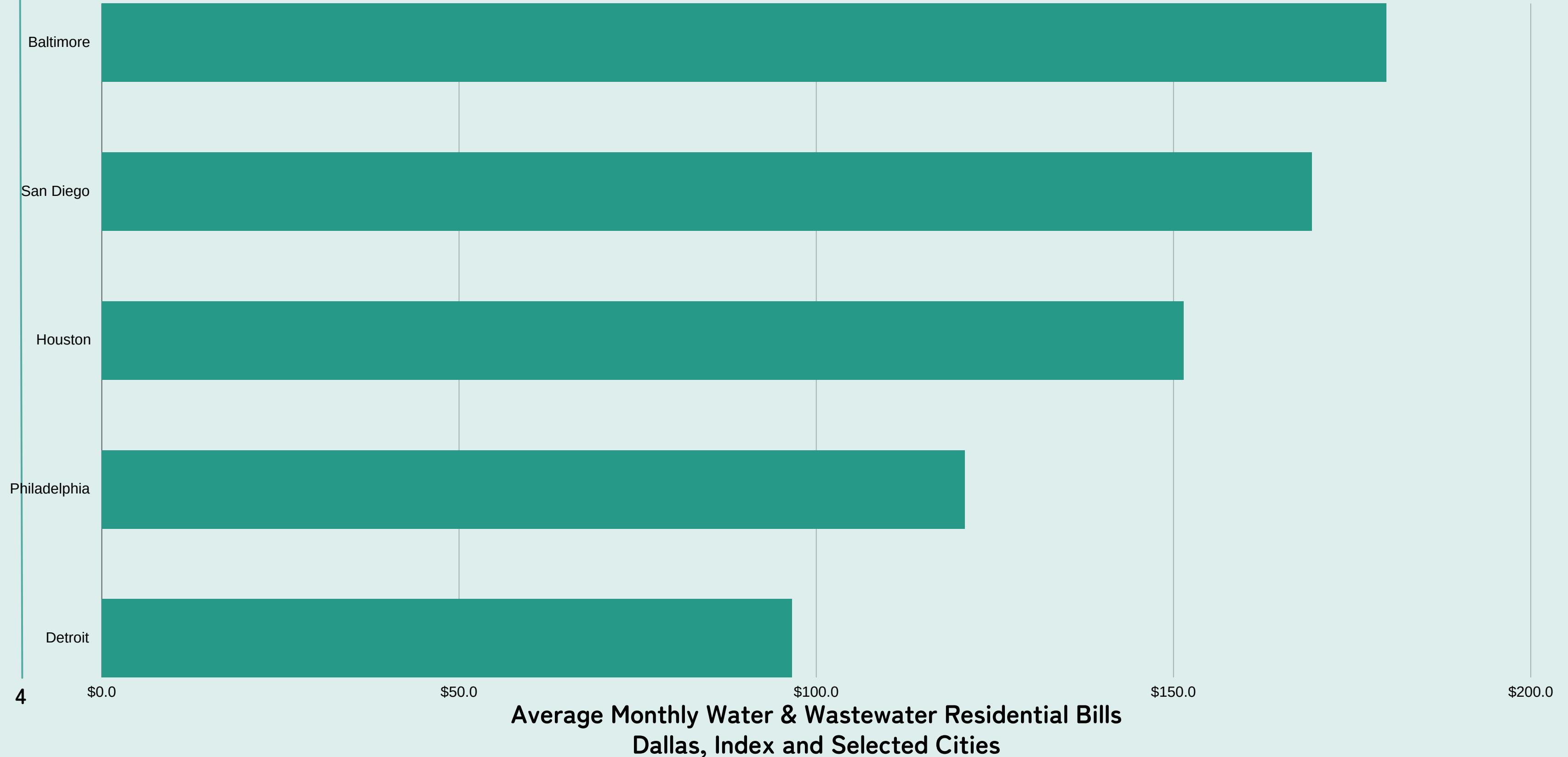

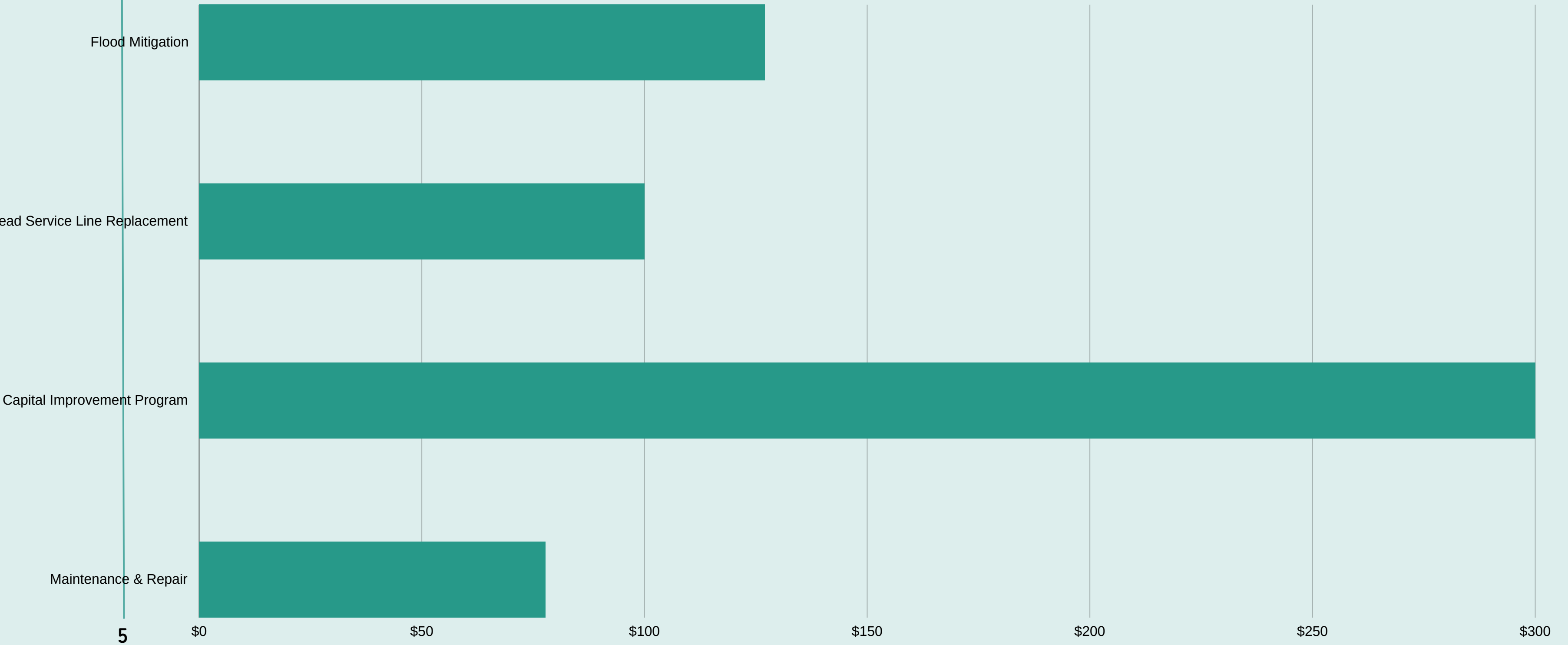


Detroit's residential water bill in comparison with other large cities

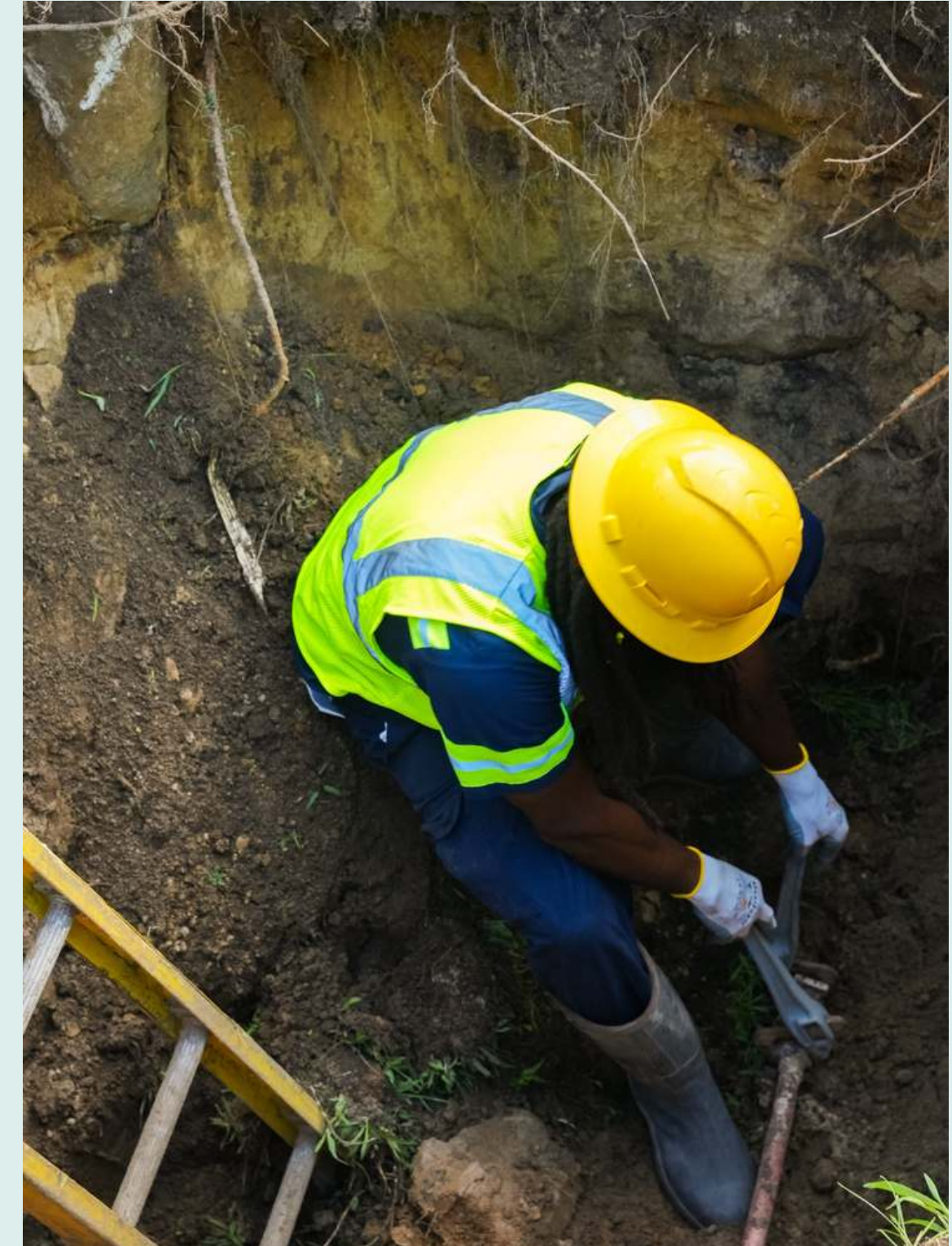

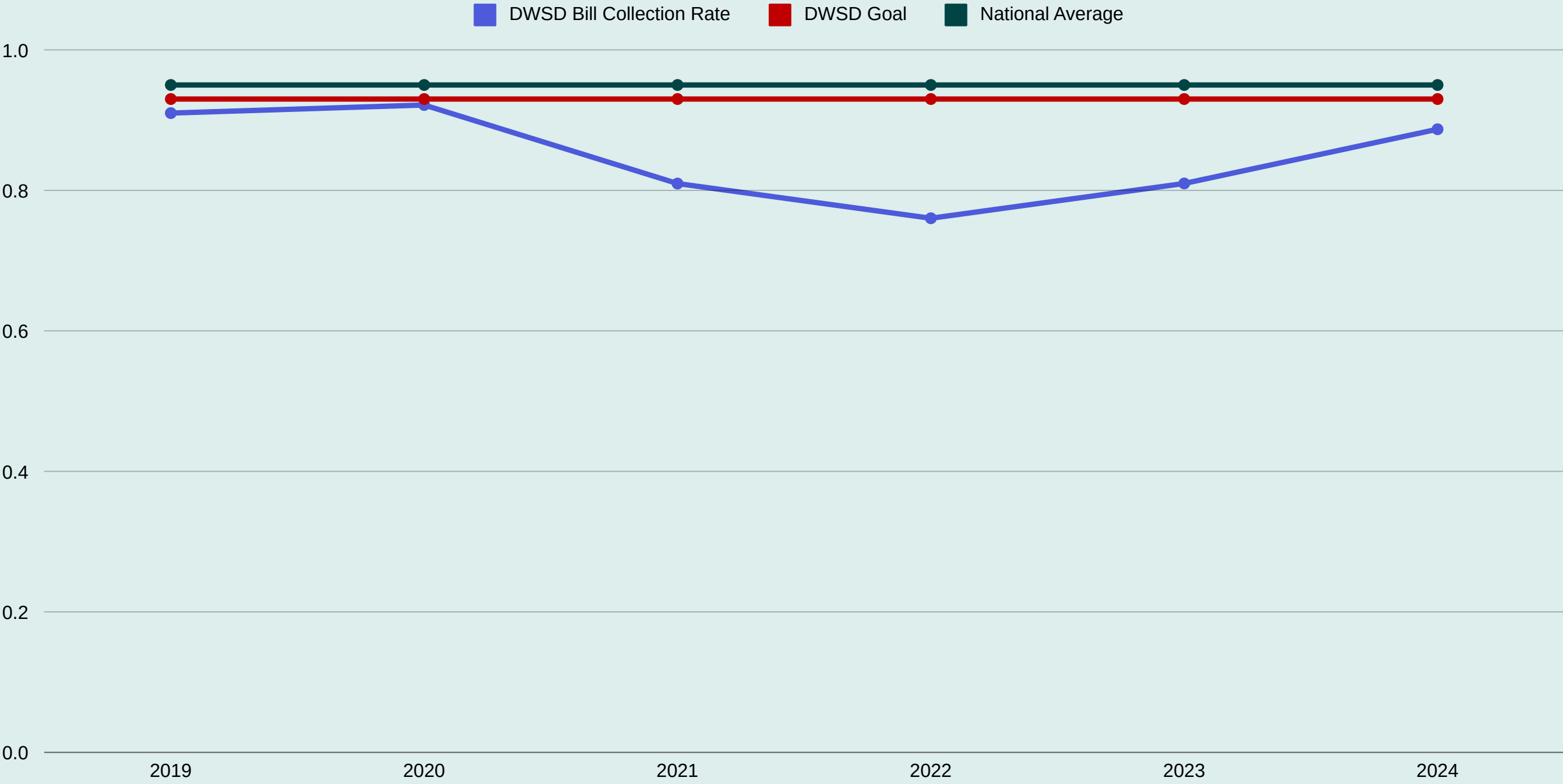

- **Detroit's income-based water affordability program**
- **Past due balance erased upon enrollment**
- **Water shutoff protection**
- **Affordable fixed bill** based on household income and size, and up to **1,125 gallons of indoor water usage per household member per month**
- **Minor plumbing repairs** for high water usage

Developed for Detroit residents, non-profits, faith-based organizations and businesses that experience difficulty in paying past due balances for water, sewerage and drainage charges.

- **Low down payment – \$10 deposit**, no matter balance
- **No income restrictions** to qualify
- **No barriers** to enter
- All types of customers qualify

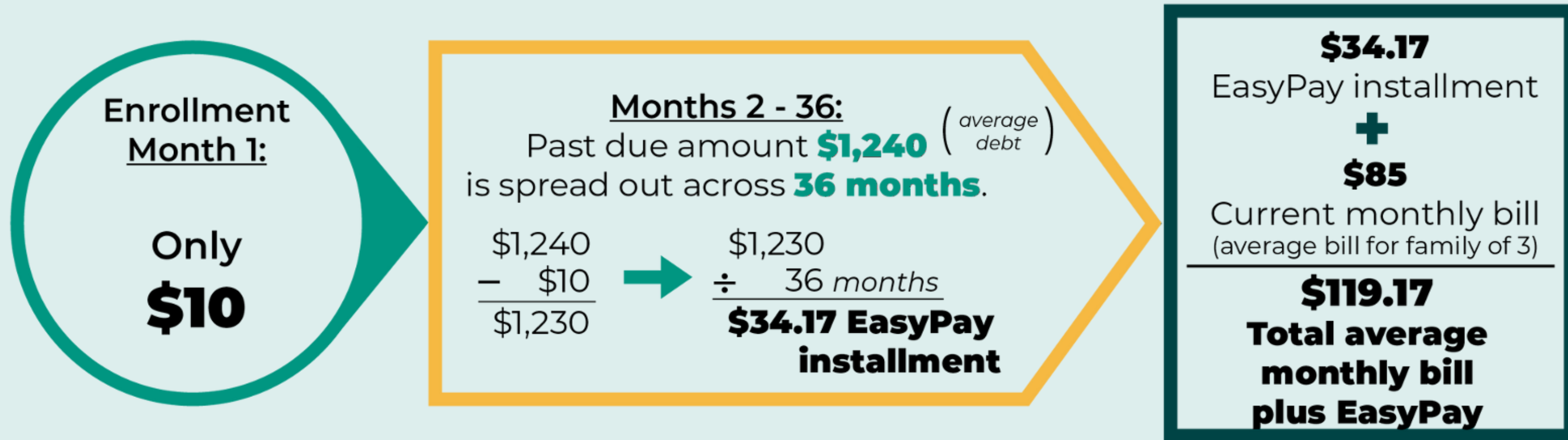

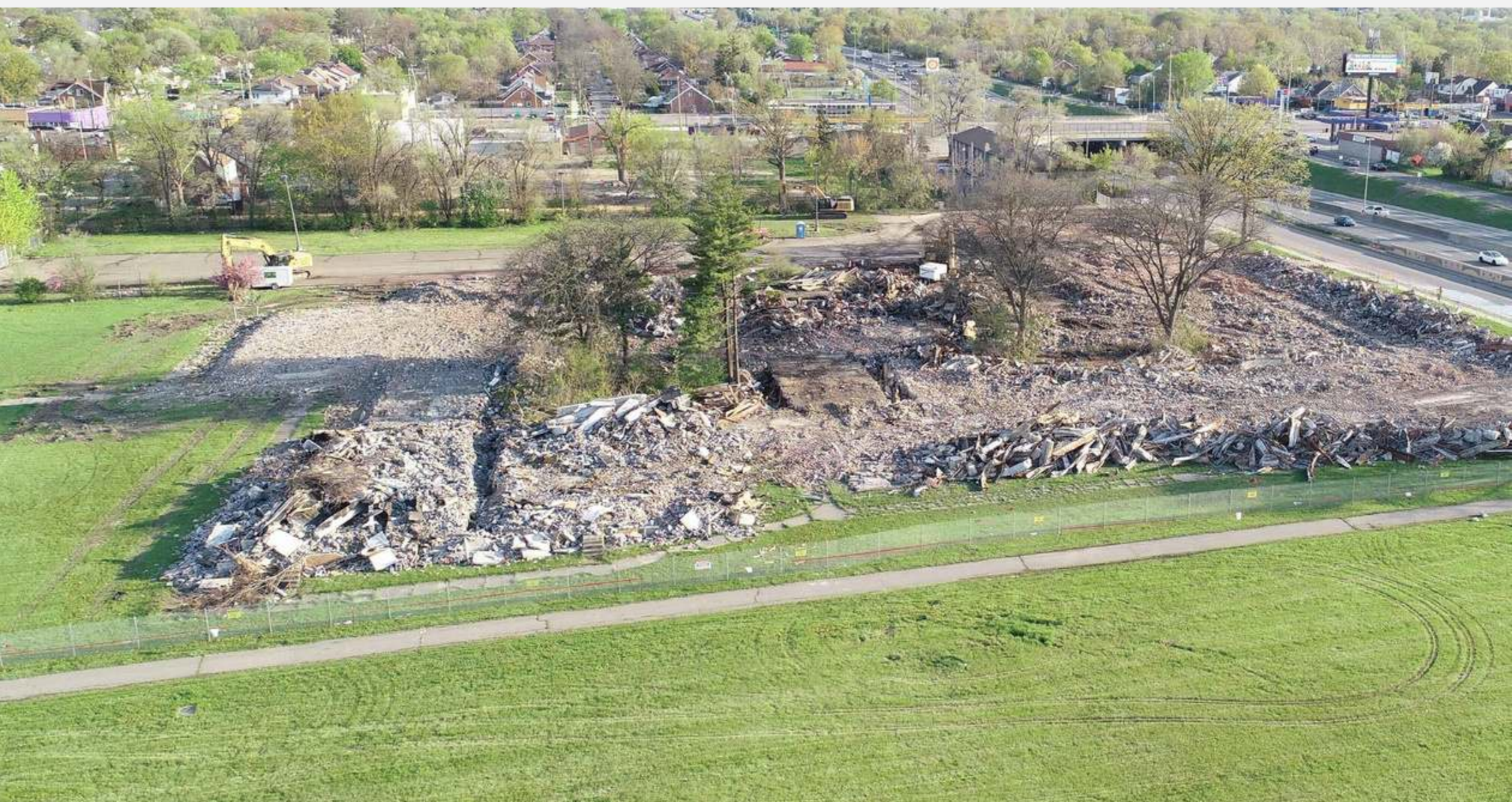

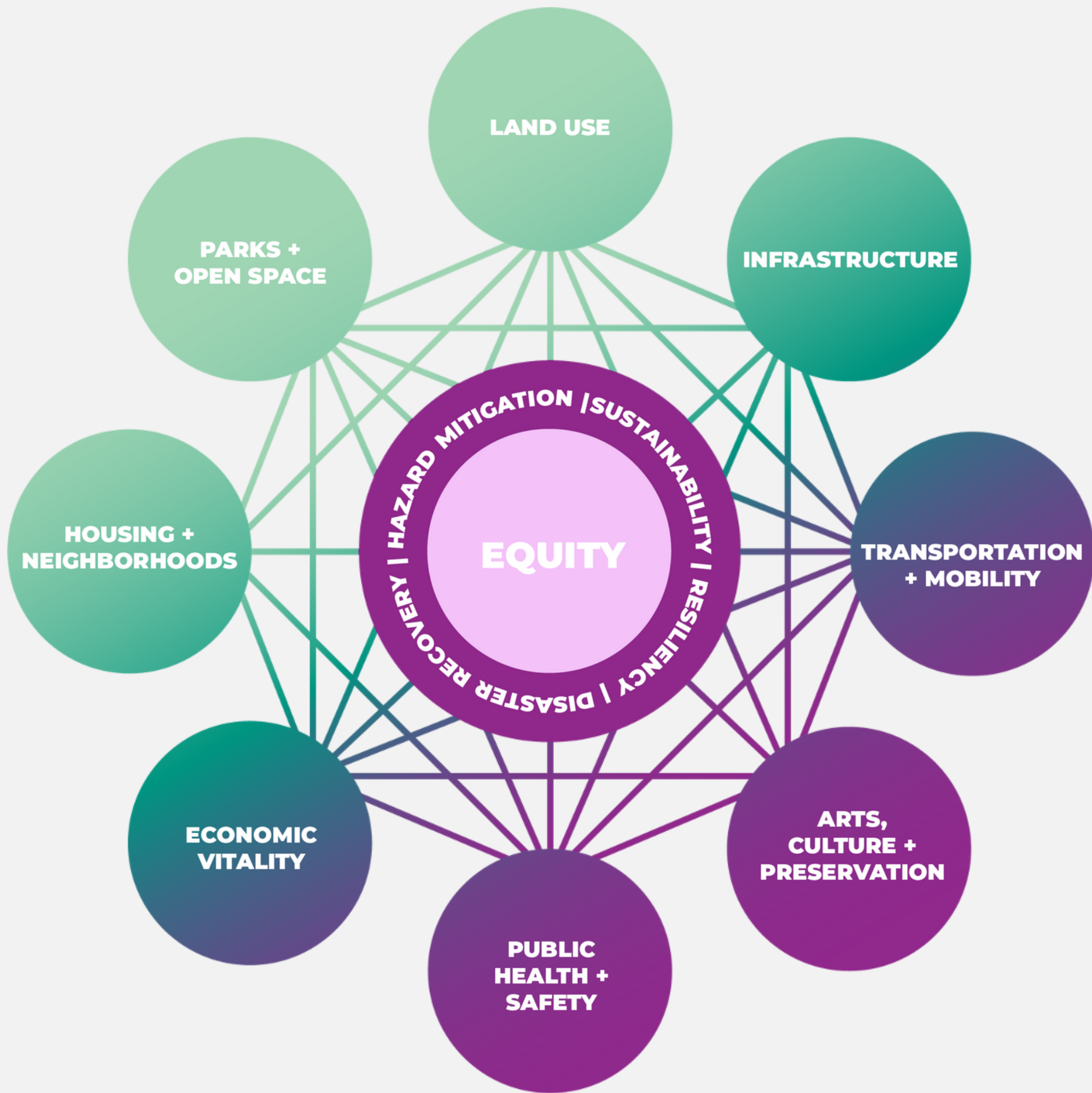

Cardiac

Heart attack is a circulation problem.
Blood flow to the heart is blocked.

Arrest vs

Cardiac arrest is an electrical problem.
The heart malfunctions and suddenly stops
beating.

What is Hands- only CPR

Hands-Only CPR is CPR *without* mouth-to-mouth breaths.

By pushing hard and fast on someone's chest, you are:

- Performing chest compressions which act like an external heart
- Helping to pump blood to the vital organs such as the brain





First Steps

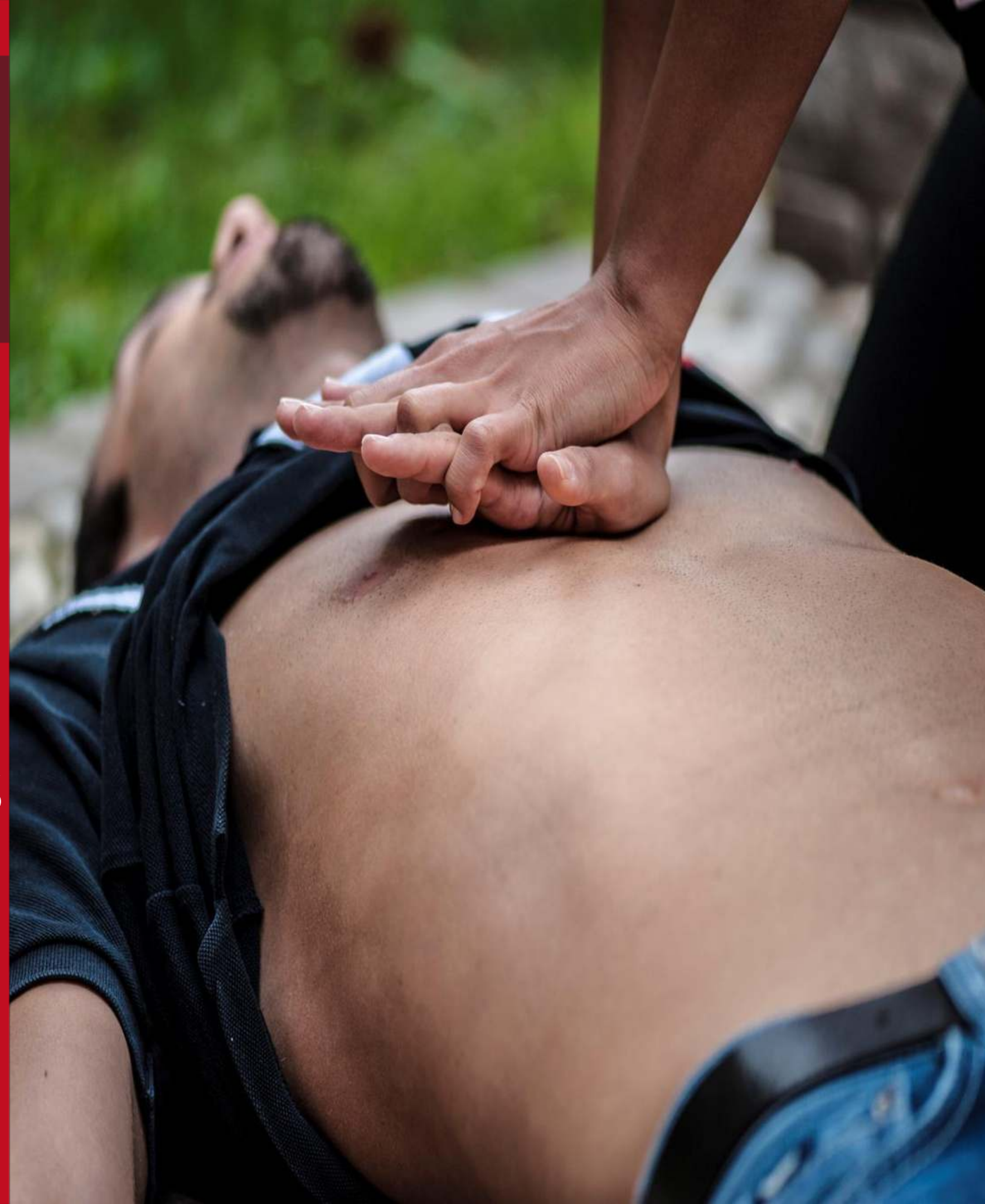
- Check the scene
- Tap & shout
- Phone 9-1-1 and get an AED
- Check for breathing





Compressions

- Push hard & fast
- Depth of at least 2 inches
- Rate of 100-120 compressions per minute





AED – Automated External Defibrillator

- Use AED as soon as it arrives
- Turn on the AED and follow directions
- Immediately resume CPR after shock





Putting it all together

- Scene Assessment
- Begin Compressions
- AED arrives
- Turn on the AED and follow directions
- Resume compressions





REVIEW



Call 911

- After calling 9-1-1, stay on the phone until the dispatcher provides further instructions
- As a bystander, don't be afraid
- Your actions can only help



Push hard and fast

- Push hard and fast in the center of the chest
- At least 2 inches deep
- Rate of 100 -120 bpm
- Use an AED as soon as it arrives. Turn it on and follow the directions.



Adults and teens only

- Hands-Only CPR is only for Adults and Teens.
- Infants and children need breaths.
- Minutes count – perform Hands Only CPR immediately.

Be Ready

We need you to:

We need you to:

- 1** If you see a teen or adult suddenly collapse, start the chain of survival! Call 911
- 2** Start Hands-Only CPR (chest compressions)
- 3** Use an AED as soon as one is available

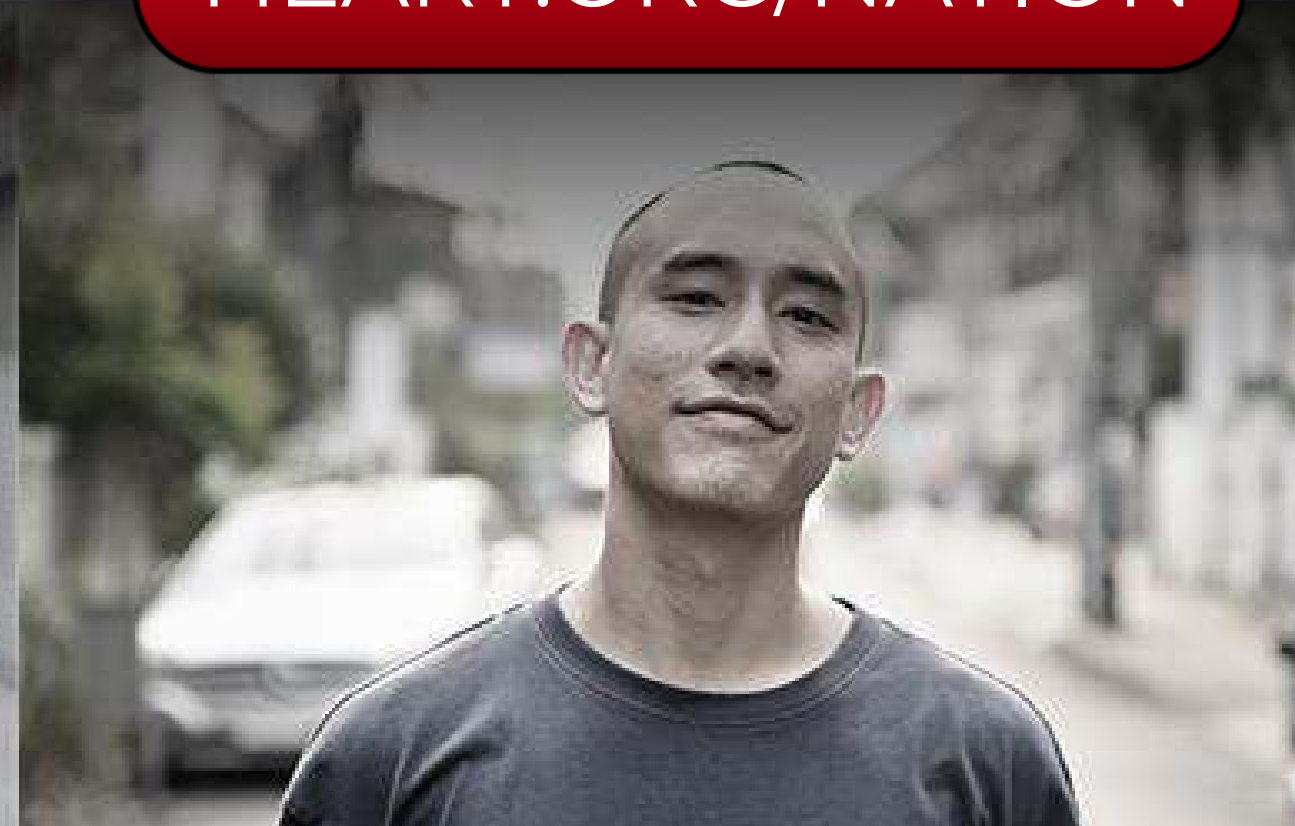

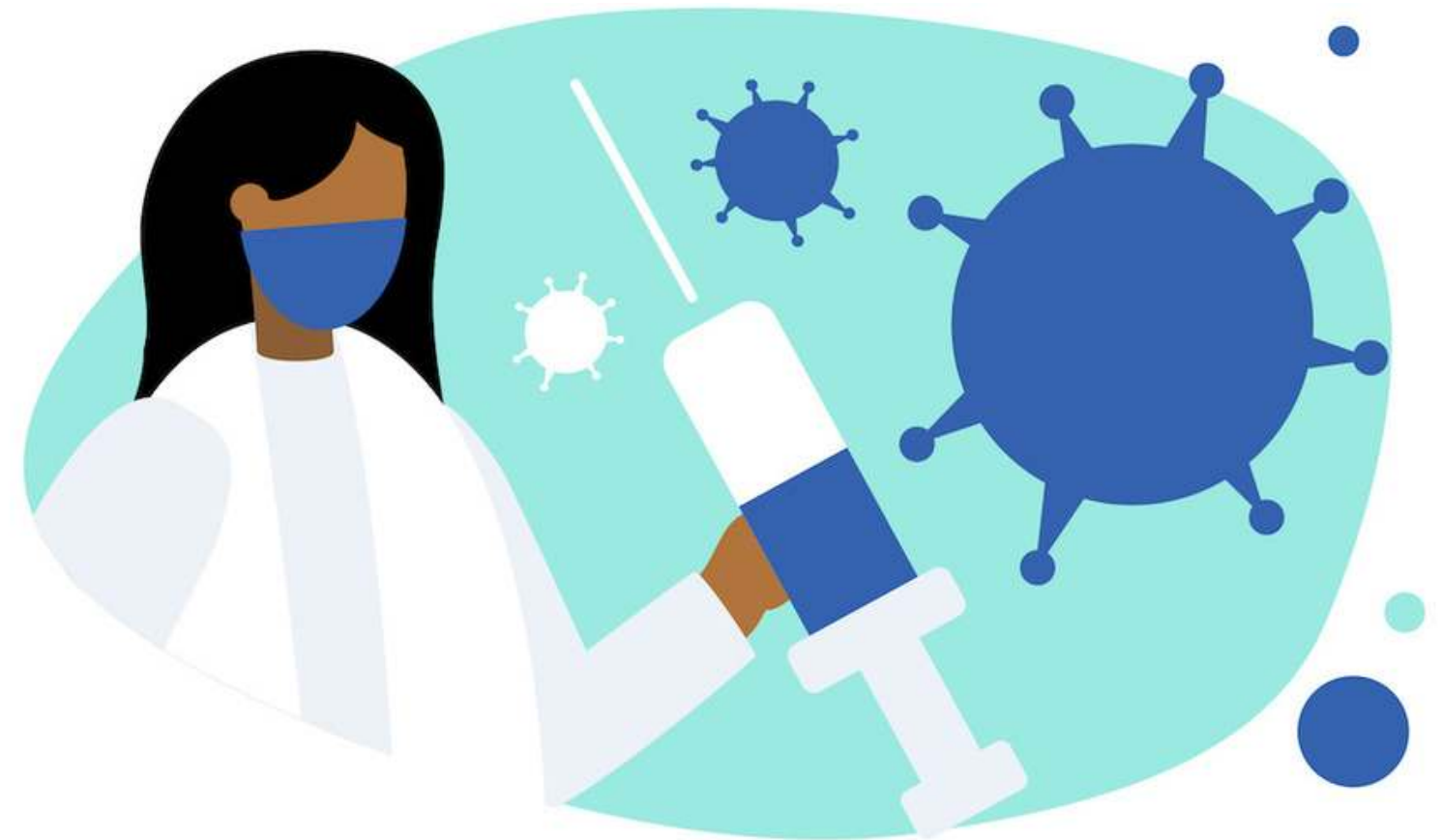

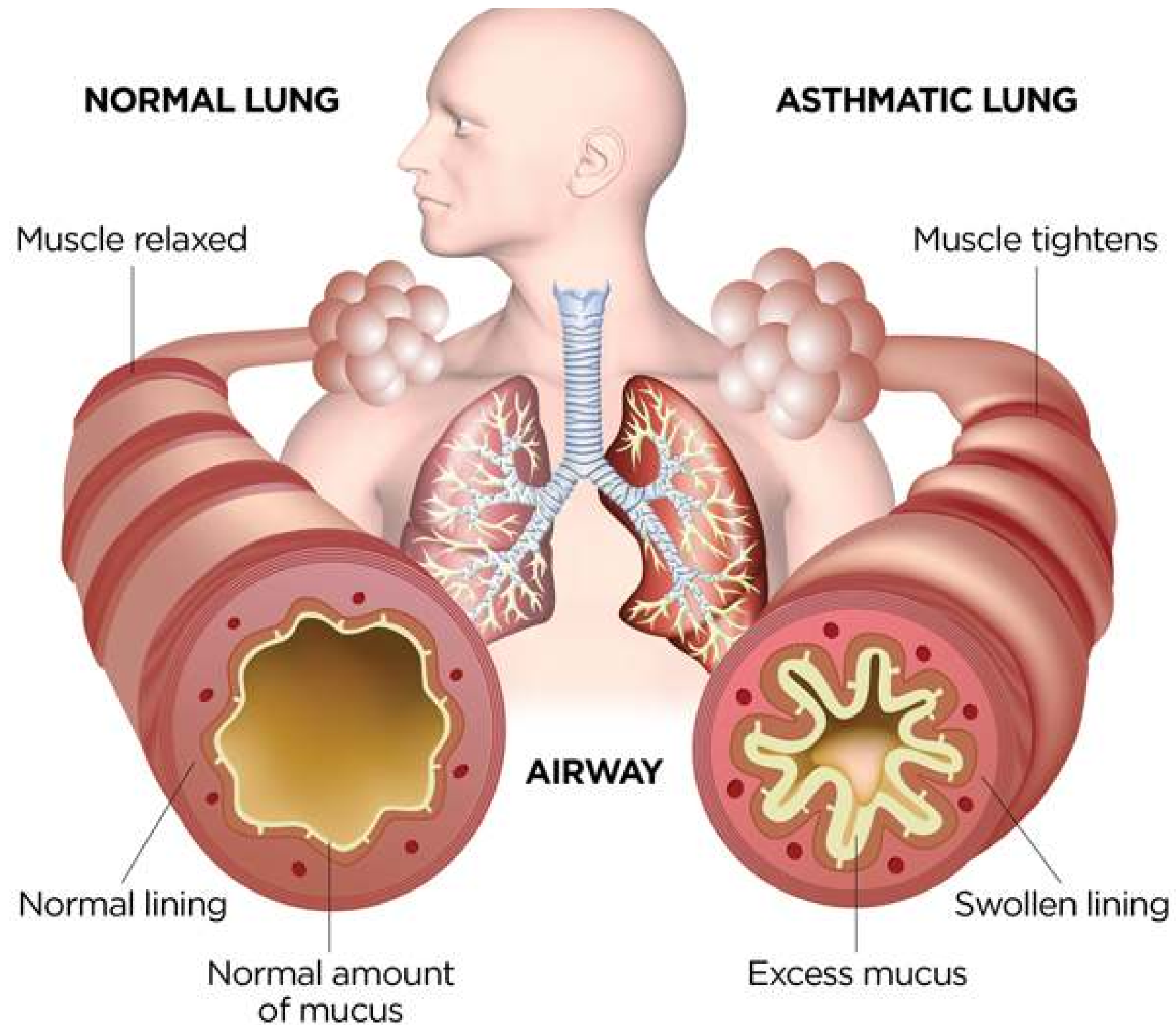


What is an Allergist-Immunologist?

 - Birth-Adulthood

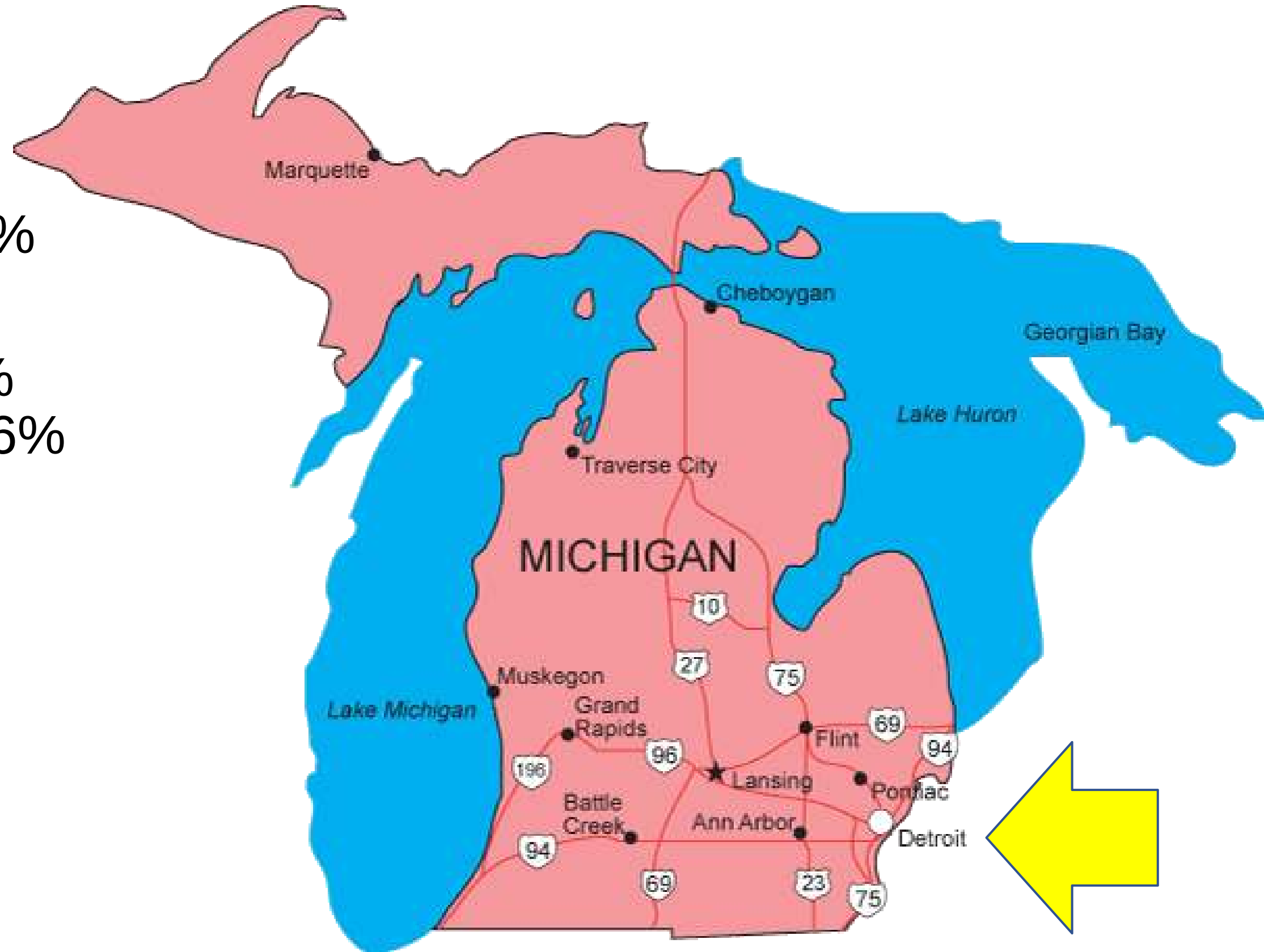

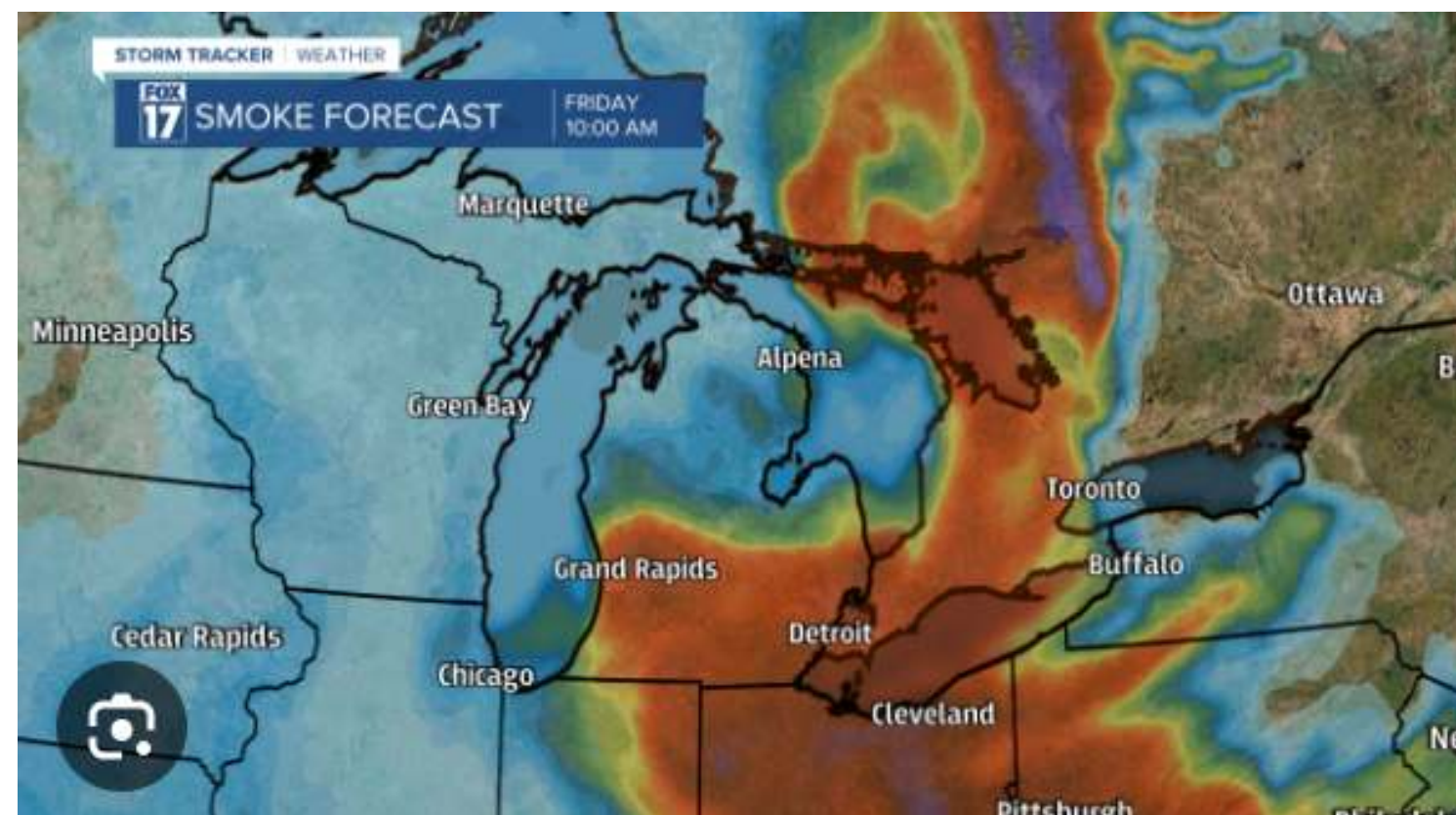

- Carbon Dioxide
 - Greenhouse gas
- Canadian Wildfires
 - Quebec & Western Canada
 - Air quality alerts in Metro-Detroit
- Pollen levels



Asthma in Detroit: Air Pollution

- Industrial Sources
 - Marathon Petroleum Refinery
 - US Steel Plant
 - Incinerators
- Mobile Sources
 - 62.5% of public schools are located in places with high air pollution.



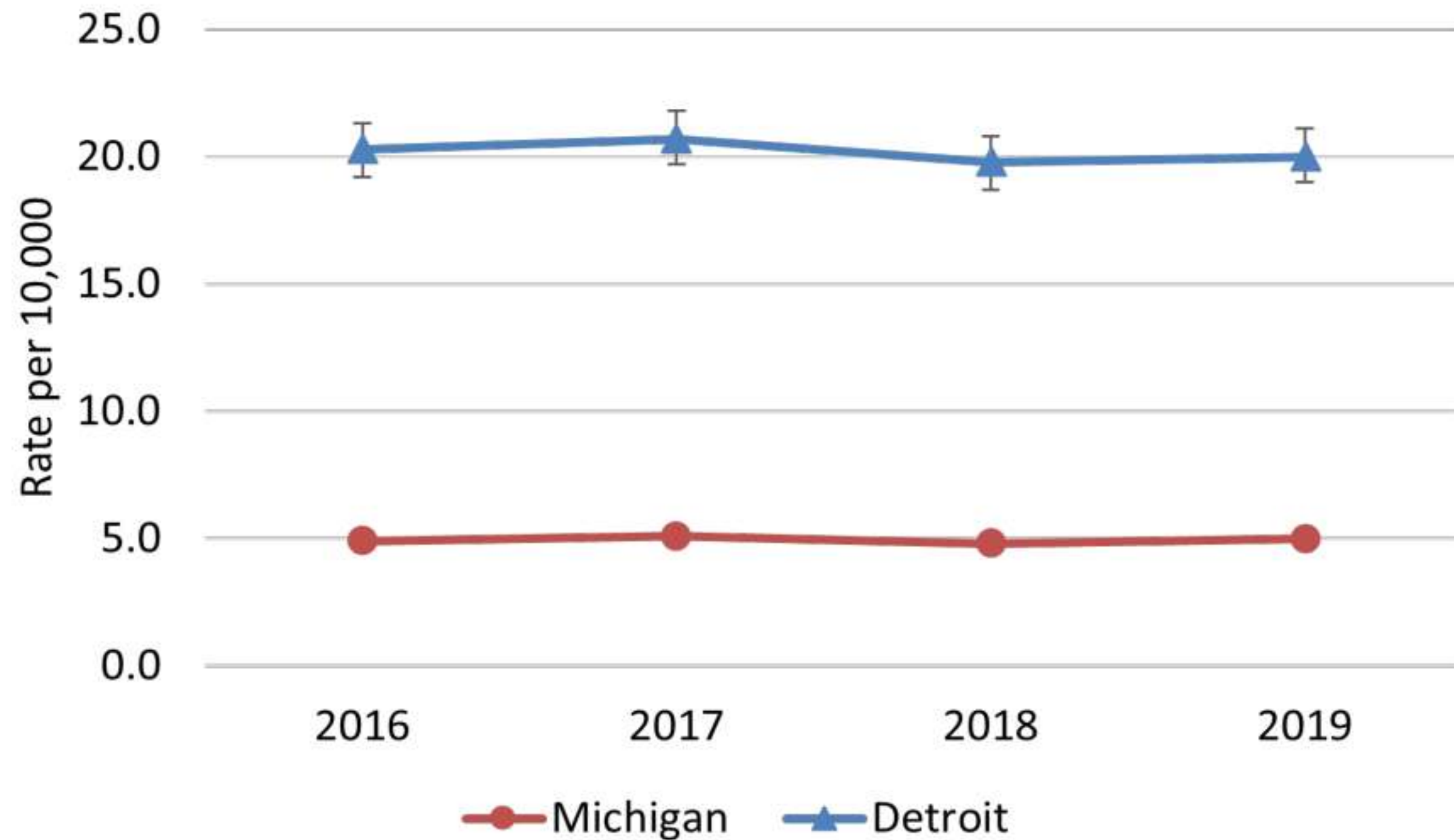
Asthma in Detroit: Socioeconomic Factors

- Socioeconomic Factors
 - Poverty
 - Low employment rates
 - Lack of health insurance coverage
- Barriers to Care
 - Inconsistent management
 - Increased ER visits and/or hospitalizations
 - Advanced disease results in harder to treat asthma

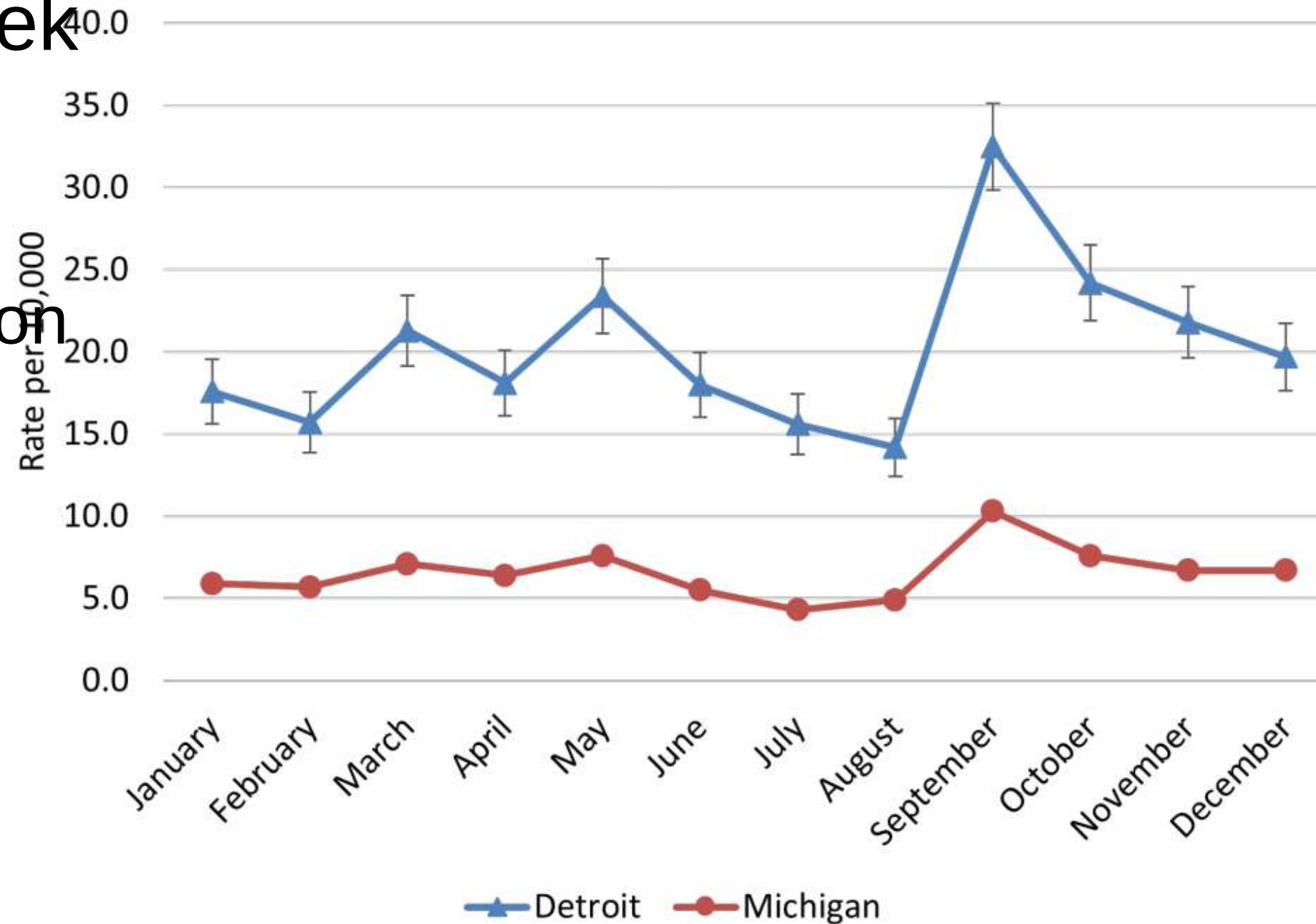

Asthma: Nature or Nurture?

- **Genetics**
 - No single mutation in a gene
- **Atopic March**
 - Atopic Dermatitis (Eczema)
 - Food Allergies
 - Seasonal & Environmental Allergies
 - Asthma



Asthma: Symptoms of Adults and Adolescents

- Cough (at night or early morning)
- Wheeze
- Shortness of Breath
- Chest Tightness



Asthma: Symptoms of Children (< 5 years old)

- Cough, wheeze, heavy breathing for > 10 days during virus
- > 3 episodes/year or severe episodes
- Between episodes, cough, wheeze or heavy breathing during play or when laughing



Asthma: Diagnosis

- Clinical History
- Pulmonary Function Test
 - Hospital based
- Spirometry
 - Office based

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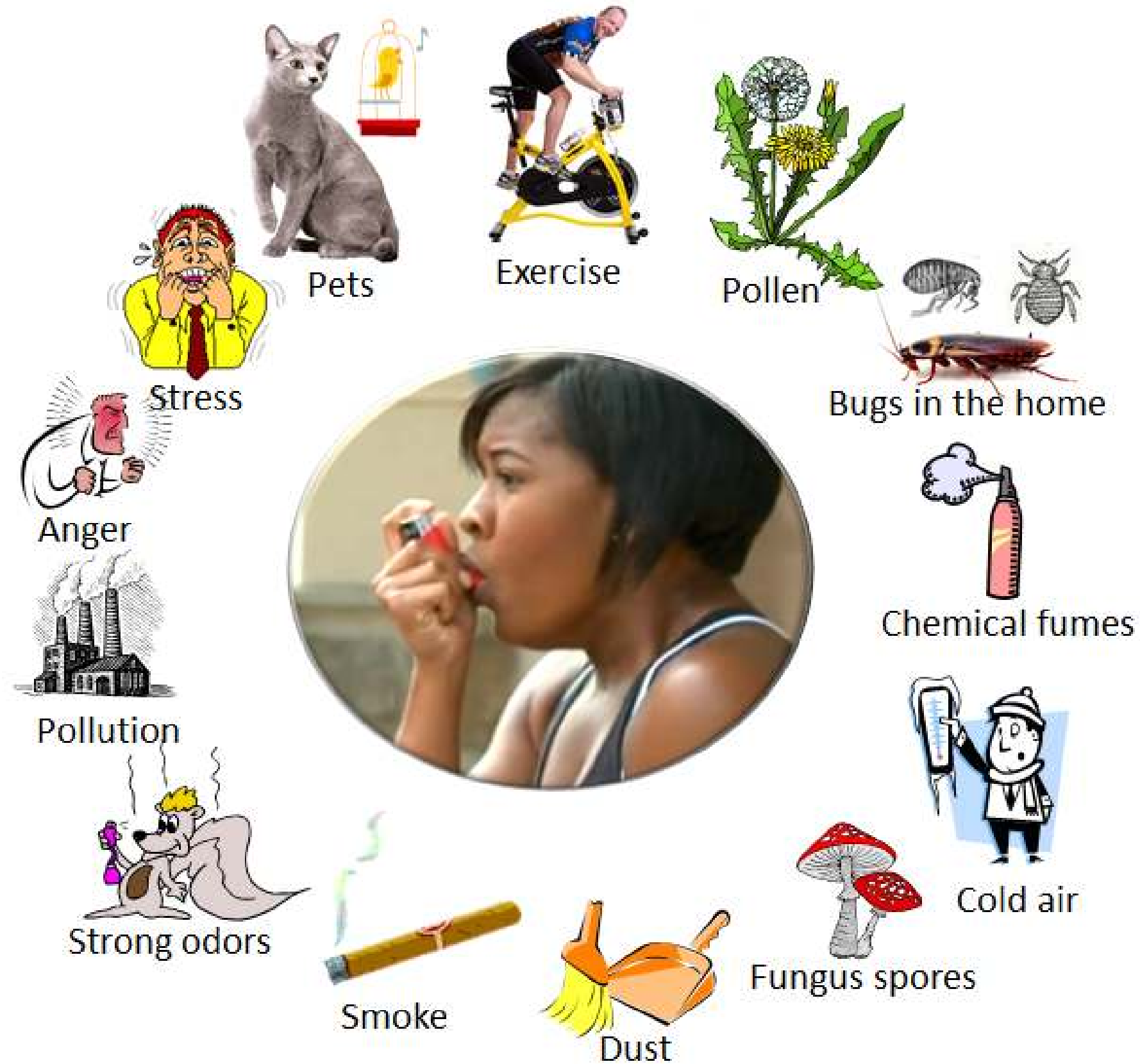

FDA approves first nasal spray for severe allergic reactions

The FDA has approved the first nasal spray for severe allergic reactions. Called Neffy, the move expands options beyond needle-based treatments like the EpiPen.
