


MLK MEMORIAL PARK

- Shelter with picnic tables




ONLINE SURVEY – MLK MEMORIAL PARK

- Open for more than a month end of March through April, 2024
- 28 responses
- 65% of respondents live less than a mile from MLK Memorial Park
- 53.8% of people who completed the survey said they do not visit the park more often because of the condition of the park amenities (could fill out all that applied)
- 57.7% of people also said they do not visit the park more often because of cleanliness
- Respondents were both familiar with MLK Park and with Dr. King's
 Detroit legacy and wanted to see it incorporated into the park design to
 educate others




WHAT ACTIVITIES ARE THOSE CURRENTLY USING THE PARK FOR?














PLAZA AREA










MLK MASTER PLAN CONCEPT






