Where did funds come from?



The City of Detroit has received **\$826M** from the American Rescue Plan Act to combat the negative effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.



Funds can be used for...

Public health emergency related to COVID-19

Investing in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure

Providing premium pay for eligible workers

Supporting government services that saw a reduction in revenue because of COVID-19

Funds <u>cannot</u> be used for...

Pensions, debts, settlements, judgments, or rainy-day funds

Expenses incurred prior to March 3, 2021

Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and spent by December 31, 2026

APPROPRIATED

Total funds issued to the City of Detroit from the \$1.2 trillion American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). City Council appropriated 15 uses for these funds in June 2021.

PROGRAMMED

Total funds allocated to initiatives that have project plans and budgets, identified City-stakeholders, and clear outputs and outcomes

OBLIGATED

Combined total of Council-approved contracts, subrecipient agreements and funds budgeted for personnel

SPENT

Total funds expended - ex, vendor invoices, personnel costs, subrecipient payments, issued grants, etc.

- Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024; and spent by December 31, 2026.
- Funds cannot be used directly for pensions, debts, settlements, judgments, or rainy-day funds.
- Funds cannot be used for expenses incurred prior to March 3, 2021



Register


