ADMINISTRATIVE SUMMARY


The proposed project includes streetscape improvements along W. Warren Avenue between Central Street and Livernois Avenue. The project aims to address traffic safety issues, create a safe multimodal connection to the Joe Louis Greenway Warren Trailhead, and provide an inviting environment for neighbors and other roadway users. Proposed improvements may include cost-effective traffic calming treatments (e.g., lane reconfiguration, protected bike lanes, curb extensions, etc.), traffic signal improvements, spot sidewalk repair, public art (e.g., street/sidewalk murals), and other low-cost streetscape amenities with a budgeted amount of \$1.25-million dollars. Construction is anticipated to begin April 2025 to be completed September 2025.






W Warren | Existing



Concept 1 Results In:

Pros

- Cost effective traffic calming by reducing the number of travel lanes
- Protected bike lanes with delineators, safer and more cost effective than cycle tracks
- Reduced speeds from existing conditions
- Shorter crossing distances for pedestrian movements and roadway safety
- Promotes local business by traffic calming
- Promotes improved pedestrian mobility with increase protection from vehicle traffic
- Provides sidewalk and minor pavement repairs
- Based on the measured traffic volume of 11,000 vehicles recorder on 12/3/2024 the reduced number of lanes will accommodate current traffic volumes
- Consistent with the streetscape recommendations in the Midwest-Tireman Framework
- Meets budget of \$1,250,000

Cons

• Reduced the number of travel lanes



Concept 2A

Lighting Improvements between Central and Livernois

- Half new light poles (24 total) between Central to Martin
- Half upgraded existing wooden light poles (24 total) with new fixtures from Martin to Livernois to increase light volumes
- No banner arms
- Meets budget of \$1,250,000

Concept 2A Results In:

Pros

Pedestrian safety improved with lighting upgrades

Cons

- Does not include traffic calming
- No protected bike lanes
- Does not provide pedestrian safety for shorter crossing distances
- No banners on light poles
- No sidewalk and road (minor) repairs



Concept 2B

Lighting improvements between Central and Livernois

- Replacing light fixtures on existing lighting poles
 - o (48 total)
- New banner arms and banners on existing poles
- Associated selected road and sidewalk repairs
- Meets budget of \$1,250,000





Concept 2B Results In:

Pros

- Pedestrian safety improved with lighting upgrades
- Banner arms on poles included
- Minor sidewalk and road repairs

Cons

- Does not include traffic calming
- No protected bike lanes
- Does not provide pedestrian safety for shorter crossing distances



Concept 2C (NEW)

Lighting improvements between Central moving east as far as budget will fund

- New Metal Light Poles to replace Wooden Poles
 - Includes Banner Arms and Pedestrian Light
- Suggested at the 12/12 Meeting by community member
- Meets budget of \$1,250,000





Concept 2C Results In:

Pros

New consistent light fixtures

Cons

- Does not include traffic calming
- No protected bike lanes
- Not able to replace all poles at this cost
- Does not provide pedestrian safety for shorter crossing distances



Concept 3:

- Bump out painting at intersections between Central and Livernois
- Delineators added at intersection bump outs
- Pavement repairs in select areas
- Lighting fixture upgrades to existing poles
- No banners on light poles
- Meets budget of \$1,250,000




Concept #3 Examples





Concept 3





Results In:

Pros

- Pedestrian safety improved with lighting upgrades
- Painted bump outs with delineators will provide pedestrian safety
- Slightly safer crossing distances for pedestrian movements

Cons

- Minimal traffic calming due to maintaining two lanes in each direction
- No protected bike lanes and no banners for the light poles
