
2024 City of Detroit Year End Stats





2024 Homicides dropped by 19% from 2023 and 34% from 2022.


203 are the fewest in Detroit since 1965.

Gun Violence Reduction Overview

Innovative strategies, technology, and partnerships have resulted in the following outcomes:

- 2,599 investigative leads generated with NIBIN*
- 4,753 casings entered into NIBIN*
- **39** square miles of ShotSpotter coverage
- 373 arrests from ShotSpotter notifications
- 6,211 guns recovered
- 1,030 Project Green Light Detroit locations






Homicides and Non-Fatal Shootings Since 2022



Wayne County Sheriff Partnership

The FAST unit is a joint fugitive apprehension unit of DPD and the Wayne County Sheriff

In 2024, FAST has apprehended 1,060+ individuals with outstanding felony warrants, prioritizing those wanted for gun crime.

Community Violence Intervention

Goal

Community groups are using Federal ARPA funds to reduce crime in gunviolence hotspots.

Implementation

Each group implemented their own unique strategy in Summer 2023.


Outcome

Based on early performance measurements, some groups are showing promising results in crime reduction efforts.



In the City of Detroit, 6 CVI groups are actively engaged in violence prevention covering 25 square miles

The remaining 114 miles rely on traditional DPD law enforcement





Results from the last quarter 8/1/24 - 10/31/24 compared to 2022 and 2023

Murders and shootings in non-CVI zones:	-35%
New Era Zone (6 and Schaefer)	-37%
Detroit 300 Zone (5 and Southfield)	-47 %
Force Detroit Zone (Warrendale)	-52%
Wayne Metro Zone (Denby)	-61%
People's Community Zone (HFHS)	-73%
Friends and Family (Outer Drive and Hayes)	-83%

All 6 CVI Zones exceeded the city average in violence reduction




Homicides dropped 45% in 6 CVI Zones in one year (11/1/2023-10/31/2024)

Mental Health Co-Response Initiative

Goal

The initiative aims to bridge the gap between the community and DPD to improve mental health outcomes

Implementation

Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN) partnership has expanded to all precincts.

Outcome

The Crisis Intervention Team (MHCRT) has responded to 3,055 mental health related calls this year.
