










#### Seasonally Adjusted Monthly Employment Count, City of Detroit




#### **Key Policy Assumptions**


- ➤ About \$200 billion/year of personal and corporate tax cuts starting in 2026
- ➤ Tariffs on imports from China will jump in 2026, eventually ~triple from 2024 level
  - Larger increase than enacted February 4<sup>th</sup>, but starting later
  - No significant/lasting new tariffs on the rest of the world
- Slower pace of interest rate cuts going forward
  - Terminal rate range of 3.25–3.5%, the Fed gets there by mid-2026
- Historic deficits outside of the recent pandemic, World War II, the Great Recession
  - Federal NIPA deficit widens to 6.8 percent of GDP in fiscal 2026 and 2027



#### Quarterly Average Payroll and Resident Employment, City of Detroit




#### **City of Detroit Employment by Industry Group**






#### Annual Wage and Salary Income per Worker, City of Detroit and Michigan



#### Real and Nominal Income per Capita, City of Detroit




#### Annual Inflation Rate, Detroit CPI
