Rental Complaint - Use this form to notify BSEED of your rental housing issues at bit.ly/rental-complaint

Homeowners Property Exemption (HOPE) - If you need help with your property taxes, you may be able to reduce or eliminate your current year's property tax obligation with HOPE. Learn more at detroitmi.gov/hope

Downpayment Assistance Program - Eligible Detroit residents can receive up to \$25,000 in downpayment assistance to purchase a home. Learn more at <u>detroitdpa.org</u>
