

Community Violence Intervention (CVI)

The City has continued working with five community organizations on Community Violence Intervention programs in neighborhoods hardest hit by violent crime. All CVI groups saw a drop in violent crime between 37% - 83% during the 1st quarter of the second year. Non CVI areas saw a reduction in violent crime by 35%.

- 106 fewer non-fatal shootings
- 48 fewer homicides

ACE Arts Alley

An initiative to design and redevelop several neighborhood alleys into unique community gathering spaces and centers of activity featuring local artwork.

- Old Redford neighborhood Arts Alley at Artist Village is open; it is the first of nine alleys being redeveloped.
- Four art installations highlighting the community and its history are complete.





Neighborhood Opportunity Fund (NOF/ARPA)

NOF supports public service programs that improve the quality of life for low-income residents. NOF/ARPA provides mini grants to small, grass-root nonprofits that focus on education, seniors, recreation, health, public safety, and mobility and accessibility programs and services to low-moderate income residents in Detroit.

- Round 1 39 grants awarded
- Round 2 80 will be awarded (in progress)



Detroit Housing Services

Provides assistance to residents with housing emergencies with locating, applying for, and securing stable, affordable, and permanent housing.

A \$19M program that provides qualifying Detroit residents grants of **up to \$25,000** for a down payment on a home.

Blight to Beauty Corridors Project

This project focuses on helping property owners keep their spaces clean and inviting. It spreads awareness of Detroit's property maintenance code and encourages owners and residents to take pride in their surroundings.

So far, 537 privately-owned properties along 43 corridors were remediated by owners after receiving citations, turning once-blighted areas into vibrant,

turning once-blighted areas into vibrant safer spaces for the whole community.

Chandler Park Dome

State-of-the-art Chandler Park Fieldhouse will open to the public in summer 2025. The 130,000-square-foot dome offers year-round sports, fitness, and recreation with courts for basketball, volleyball and pickleball. It also includes a football field and a track for various sports.





Right to Counsel (RTC)

In Detroit, the Office of Eviction

Defense, under the RTC law, provides
free legal representation to renters
facing eviction.

From March 2023 to December 2024:

- 7,651 tenants assisted
- **3.546** remained in their homes

Neighborhood Beautification Program (NBP)

The NBP grant provides funding to Detroitbased neighborhood associations, block clubs, and partnering faith-based organizations or non-profit organizations to beautify their neighborhoods.

- 157 beautification grants awarded
- 149 applications submitted for Round 5
- 99 grant awards anticipated





Detroit Home Accessibility Program

The program improved living conditions of residents, who are disabled or low-income seniors, struggling with basic access to and inside their own homes.

- 232 homes targeted to receive home repairs
- 20 homes received repairs
