





# Clement Kern Gardens Relocation FAQ

## Q: What is relocation, and how does it apply to me?

A: Relocation is the process that happens when a developer decides to rebuild a property that people currently live in. When the development is funded with federal money, regulations like the Uniform Relocation Act (URA) guarantees rights for people being relocated, including covering their moving costs and finding them new housing. Detroit was awarded a federal Choice Neighborhoods Grant in 2021 with the goal of rebuilding Clement Kern Gardens to make sure current residents and future residents have a clean, safe, and affordable community to call home. This will require the developer to demolish the current Clement Kern Gardens and relocate you and your neighbors temporarily while it is being rebuilt.

See 24 CFR 511.14(g) and Paragraph 1-8 of HUD Handbook 1378.) B. Additional Guidance. Any permanent, involuntary move of an occupant of the project that occurs as a direct result of rehabilitation, demolition or acquisition for the project is a displacement that results in eligibility for relocation assistance.

## Q: Am I being kicked out of Clement Kern Gardens for good?

A: Absolutely not! The goal of the Choice Neighborhoods Grant is to make sure you and your neighbors have access to clean and safe affordable housing right where you are already living. While you may have to relocate temporarily from Clement Kern Gardens, you will have the right to return to the new housing built at Clement Kern when it's completed (or you can choose to live in other new housing built through the Choice grant). In order to maintain that right, you must remain in your unit until you are further notified, stay lease compliant, and avoid eviction (this is what it means to remain a resident in good standing). The goal is to keep you in your home and your neighborhood, just with an upgrade.

# Q: Where will I be able to move to while Clement Kern Gardens is being demolished and rebuilt?

A: There will be several options depending on where you live in Clement Kern Gardens. The Choice Neighborhoods Grant applies to the whole Greater Corktown area. The redevelopment of Clement Kern Gardens is just one of the housing phases being developed in the neighborhood, and you will be connected with affordable and accessible options within those phases that work for your household. The other new developments are being built in phases just like Clement Kern Gardens. Not every phase will have units available in time for every resident in Clement Kern Gardens to move into, however, your access to decent, safe, and sanitary housing that you can afford in the neighborhood is guaranteed no matter what. The Replacement Housing Payment, which could include a Tenant Protection Voucher, will provide options beyond rentals developed in the Choice Housing plan. The amenities you will have to access in your temporary unit will be based on where you choose to move.

# Q: If Clement Kern Gardens is being rebuilt in phases, can I move to another unit in Clement Kern Gardens instead of moving somewhere else?

A: This may be a possibility. If you are living in a unit that is slated for demolition and there are units in another part of Clement Kern Gardens available, you may be given the opportunity to move into that unit instead of moving elsewhere. Again, the focus of this grant is on you and your housing needs. The

primary goal is to make sure you are happy where you are living and that this placement is as convenient for you as possible.

## Q: Will the demolition process have an impact on my household?

A: The short answer is that for the most part, there will be no direct impact on residents on the central and west portions (units 1661- 1791) of the CKG site. Construction fences and barriers will be placed around the active work zones and all of this activity will take place on the east portion of the site that will be vacated, as well as the area that will be vacated when we move the residents from buildings 9 and 10. Residents should expect noise, dust and/or dirt during the traditional working hours. Access and parking will remain available in the central and west portions of the CKG site, until further notice.

# Q: How will you decide who goes where? And when?

A: Each household at Clement Kern Gardens will be interviewed about their preferences for moving. This includes where you would like to be, how many bedrooms your household requires, if you want to remain at Clement Kern Gardens during redevelopment, accessibility needs, transportation needs, and anything else that is important to you during this process. The interview process will begin in early 2023. Interviews will also be done in phases, starting with the East portion of Clement Kern Gardens. Your answers will be used to place you in the best position possible to be happy with your living situation at the end of this grant.

## Q: How much is this going to cost me?

A: You will be connected to housing options that will be affordable to you using the same recertification process you have now at Clement Kern Gardens, so your rent will continue to be based on your income. Your moving expenses will also be paid. The goal is to make this as easy on you as possible, because at the end of the day, this is about your housing needs.

Moving expenses may include costs associated with packing supplies, the provision of team members to assist with packing, security deposit, and transportation of packed belongings to your temporary unit.

# Q: Should I be planning to move now?

A: No. In May of 2022 you received the General Information Notice that tells you specifically not to move yet. If you move now, you may not be eligible for assistance with helping you find a new place or paying your moving expenses. Residents in Buildings 11 and 12 (Unit 1511-1567) started receiving notices in the spring of 2024. In December 2024, these residents transitioned out of CKG into Left Field. In January 2025, residents in Buildings 9 and 10 (Units 1571-1619) started receiving notices related to relocation. In March 2025, residents in Building 8 (Units 1645- 1659) received notices related to relocation. Residents in Buildings 8,9, and 10 are expected to move out of Clement Kern Gardens in late Spring, early Summer 2025. Residents in Buildings 5, 6 and 7 (Units 1661-1695) should anticipate receiving notices in the Summer 2025 and should be relocated at the end of 2025. Residents in Buildings 1, 2, 3, and 4 (Units 1703- 1791) are not anticipated to need to relocate any sooner than mid-2027. Until then, sit tight.
